Holy Days and Holy Places

For our holiday as grandparents this year we stayed in the centre of Brittany, six adults and four children under five. We were based in a remote Breton farmhouse (with a pool). The countryside was full of trees, new plantations and remnants of old forest. The silence which surrounded us was almost complete. The weather was wet and cold and at times we had to light fires to warm and cheer up the family. After a visit to a small village nearby which was run as a Breton village of 150-200 years ago with washing in the river and bread from communal ovens, we began too imagine ourselves as peasants of years ago. Life slowed down. How easy it was to imagine all sorts of dangers in the woods and in a rambling house where the lights went out when it rained. The children woke up with dreams of monsters and by day scared each other by pretending to be monsters. Small children know all about monsters these days from videos, story books and TV. This was reinforced by finding a very large toad in the woodshed and facing a large, hairy wild boar roaring as he came out of the woods (we were glad of the fences at the park for domestic and wild animals we visited which had notices to tell us that these animals could 'merde'). Further owls hooted all through the night.

The people of Brittany in the past must have been full of such fears in addition to the fears of poverty for most years. Fears of thieves, armies both local and national and general oppression by the French government who insisted they did not speak Breton. These were their monsters. It was important for them to have shrines and churches which showed visibly the love of God who had triumphed over evil in Christ and in the person of local saints. They were and are places of light amongst the darkness. One such local was St Barbie (instantly recognisable by name by our two young granddaughters). Inside the churches were beautifully carved and painted rood screens. Outside wonderfully ornate scenes of the crucifixion and local saints and their miracles on which the children played. So these places in the landscape were points where a new perspective on life could be found. There were the great 'pardons' when whole communities journeyed to a local shrine, where people found forgiveness,

healing and fellowship and experienced the risen life of Christ who offered himself to them in the mass.

Today many of us believe in an age of science we have no more monsters and in an age of technology and enlightenment, all is light and darkness will be overcome. I wonder? Turn the pages of your newspapers the news is full of monsters and fears are just as deep as in the past. It is clear people need a source of 'good news' or gospel. Each community needs holy ground and holy days on which our take on the world can be renewed. We can experience the mystery of God and yet know clearly his love for us in Christ Jesus. Sinner and saint alike we need the fellowship and company of the saints and our fellow Christians. We need pardon and encouragement.

So from these foreign parts I brought back these thoughts. Let each church fellowship, each church building be a place of light in the darkness, holy ground on which we can meet our maker and redeemer and a hearth for the fire of the Holy Spirit around which we can warm ourselves despite the monstrous state of the world. The setting for our worship needs to be capable of reminding us of heaven itself. Holy places and holy days are necessary to us as human beings now as in the past to dispel the fear of monsters which seem to live on. They are not just for individuals but the whole community.

Angela's Garden Corner

Your Garden in October

October is often very windy and rain may be heavy, but frosts usually arrive towards the end of the month.

Lawns

Always rake off the clippings or use the grassbox at this time of year, or you will have problems with fungus diseases. Lawns will still be able to be mown when the weather allows. This is a good time to spike the lawn to improve drainage. Rake off thatch with a lawn rake.

Ponds and Water Features

Remove pumps from pools for the winter. If fish are still active, feed them, but take great care not to overfeed. Remove dead leaves from the water and clean out any sludge from the pond. A pond heater will prevent ice forming or you can float a rubber ball on the surface to keep a hole free of ice. The winter is a difficult time for pond fish so be vigilant and keep a close eye on them.

Beds and Borders

Clip hedges. This is one of the best months to plant shrubs and trees. When choosing a new tree, take advice from the nursery about the ultimate size. There are many choice small trees suitable for even a tiny garden, and the right tree will not lead to problems later on with drains or foundations. Tender plants should now be lifted and kept in a frost-proof place for the winter. Consider growing one or two winter flowering shrubs, perhaps near a path or the back door, where you will see them even in the coldest weather.

Tidy the borders, digging over the soil and removing weeds. Leave stems that look attractive in the winter, like those of eryngiums and teasels. These will feed the birds and provide a home for lacewings and ladybirds. Start hanging up bird feeders now as birds fed in your garden in the winter will become regular visitors and will eat your caterpillars and aphids later. If you hang feeders in your apple trees, the birds will eat a lot of overwintering pests while they wait.

Leaves can be a problem this month, so rake them into heaps in an odd corner of the garden or add them to the compost heap.

Patios

Tidy away garden furniture unless it is resistant to rot. Teak and other hardwood furniture can be cleaned and left out or covered with waterproof covers. Pots can improve your outside spaces even in the winter; in fact beautiful glazed pots can look good on their own. If you want plants in your pots, consider evergreens like hollies, box, or eleagnus, or a mixture of winter bedding like pansies, polyanthus and cyclamen.

Vegetables and Fruit

Plan a new fruit or vegetable area, remembering that sunlight is the most important factor. Ideally beds should run from east to west, so that the rows run north to south.

Record what you do so that in future you can see which crops do best for you, and where you grew which vegetables.

If all this seems impossible because your garden is tiny or very shady, you can still grow herbs and salad vegetables in pots, windowboxes or even hanging baskets. Lettuce, tomatoes, radishes, French beans and chicory will all grow in this way.

Greaseband your apple trees now and check the ties on cane fruits before the gales damage them.

Plant of the Month

A tiny tree, suitable for the smallest gardens, is the Pagoda Tree, *cornus alternifolia* "Argentea". Very slow growing, it may eventually reach 10-15 feet and casts only light shade.

National Service Reunion

On Wednesday, 27th of October the group will meet once more, by kind permission of the management, at the Modbury Club, at 7.30pm, to celebrate their unique status as former conscripted National Servicemen.

A reminder: After the Second World War in 1945 the government of the day passed an act of parliament that required all young men between the ages of 18 and 25 to join the armed forces for a period of 18 months. Those who chose to become coal miners were exempt. However as a result of the commencement of the Korean War the term was extended to two years. Most young men joined the army, with a smaller percentage recruited into the RAF. Very few found their way into the Navy and a very select few specialists were recruited into the Royal Marines, of which John Robinson of Brownston Street was one. Conscription for National Service ceased in 1960. We currently have 18 members who served their country as national servicemen, which for such a small community is a very high number.

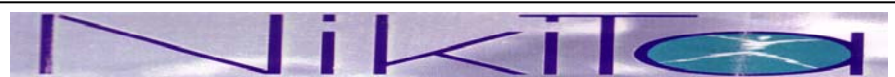

Public Forum – Have Your Say

The Modbury Parish Council Meets on the Second Monday of every month and always begins with a Public Forum at 7.30pm. This lasts up to 30 minutes and is the chance for anyone in the Parish to air their views. You can alert the council to any concern you may have regarding events in the Parish, report any damage to street signs, lights etc and have your say about anything that affects the residents of Modbury; planning, parking, vandalism, speeding, cleanliness, in fact anything the Council can take up on your behalf.

Not all Parish Councils provide this opportunity and not many people in Modbury actually make use of it. So if something worries you, annoys you or just irritates you why not come along and let the councillors know how you feel?!

The next Parish Council Meeting is on Monday October 11th at the Memorial Hall.

Register of Electors 2005

**Qualifying Date 15th October
2004**

DID YOU KNOW?

1. The Register of Electors is compiled each year with a qualifying date of the 15th October.
2. Information is required by law from each household annually – forms were sent out at the beginning of September. If you haven't received one, contact South Hams District Council Electoral Registration Office (01803) 861224.
3. For the first time electors whose details are printed correctly on the form may register using the automated freephone number – using the security numbers printed on the form.

4. Persons who do not complete a form may be liable for a fine of up to £1,000.
5. Only those persons whose names appear on the Register will be entitled to vote.
6. You have some choice about who can buy your details. The Electoral Registration Officer must publish two registers: the full version and an edited version. IF YOU TICK the box on the registration form for exclusion from the edited register, your name and address will only appear on the full register which will only be used for certain lawful purposes, such as elections, law enforcement and checking applications for credit. IF YOU DO NOT TICK the box on the registration form your name will also appear on the edited version of the register which anyone can buy – this means anyone can use your details for any purpose.
7. If you are unable to vote in person at elections, you may apply to vote by post or proxy. Ring the Electoral Office on (01803) 861244 for an application form.
8. The qualifying date is 15 October but any forms received before the middle of November will be processed before publication of the Register of Electors on 1 December.

Recycling

Say 'goodbye' to the orange sack.

There has been a change to the recycling scheme. Instead of having three different sacks to sort into, you will now receive only two different coloured sacks. Don't worry though; you will still receive enough sacks for your collections.

You will be provided with blue sacks for paper and cardboard and the clear sack will stay the same for plastic bottles and mixed cans.

Feedback from our residents showed that many people felt sorting into three sacks was difficult and that it would help if you only had to sort into two.

Fed up with Junk e-mails?

To anyone who uses e-mail, receiving "spam" will have probably become a regular occurrence. No, I'm not talking about luncheon meat, but rather "unsolicited e-mail" or "junk e-mail", offering you such things as prescription drugs, financial loans, get rich quick schemes or even access to pornographic websites, which is a particular worry if your children use the computer. In 2003, spam accounted for nearly 50% of all e-mail sent around the world and that figure is set to rise in 2004.

The reason there is so much spam sent is that it is easy to reach thousands of people, at hardly any cost to the sender. Even with a low-response rate, it is quite easy for spammers to make a profit.

Where do they get your e-mail address from?

- Newsgroups and chat rooms. When someone starts using newsgroups and chat rooms, they often sign up using their real e-mail address. Spammers use software that can monitor the newsgroups and chat rooms and collect all the email addresses.
- Websites. If you are the owner of a website, then the chances are that you've put your e-mail address somewhere on your website for visitors to contact you. Spammers use programs called spambots, similar to search engines, which trawl the Internet looking on web pages for the tell-tale @ symbol which signifies an e-mail address.
- Businesses often use standard e-mail addresses such as sales@something.com, info@something.com or admin@something.com. Spammers will certainly try these common e-mail addresses, as the majority of them will get through.
- Website owners may also have a "catch-all address" so that even if someone mistypes your e-mail address, the message will still reach you. This means that spammers can just try anything@something.com and their message will arrive at your computer.
- If you have a web-based e-mail account such as Hotmail or Yahoo, you might be listed in the directory of members.
- Signing up for an on-line service where you have to supply your e-mail address.

Sadly, once your e-mail address gets out into the public domain, it will be picked up and added to a mailing list. People then sell their mailing lists to others and you'll start receiving more and more spam.

E-mail spamming is illegal in Europe, but this doesn't deter spammers, as they are hard to catch and most junk e-mail comes from outside Europe anyway.

How to stop receiving spam

Stopping spam is a very difficult task and there is no method that is 100% effective. But here are some suggestions for reducing it:

1. Never reply to spam messages. Just delete them. Some messages will have a link at the bottom saying that if you no longer wish to receive messages from them, then click the link to remove yourself from their list. If this appears on a newsletter from a legitimate source and is something that you expected to receive, then this is an acceptable way to stop communication from them. However, if you never asked to hear from the sender and the e-mail is unsolicited, then by clicking this link, all you will be doing is telling the spammer that your e-mail address is active and they'll just contact you even more!
2. If you use a newsgroup or chat room, then don't sign up with your real address. Use either a fake, non-existent address or use a separate e-mail address, to which you don't mind receiving spam.
3. If you own a website, don't openly publish your e-mail address with the [mailto:](#) tag. Disguise your address in JavaScript code, html encoding or better still add a contact form to your page instead.
4. Always read the small print. Whenever you fill in a form where you have provided your e-mail address, look for the opt-in/opt-out box where you specifically request that your details are not sold to third parties.
5. If you have a Hotmail, AOL or Yahoo e-mail address, make sure that you aren't listed in the public directories and use the built-in filtering facilities that they offer as part of their service.
6. The most recent versions of Microsoft Outlook and Outlook Express have filtering options to divert junk e-mail into a separate folder rather than your inbox. Eudora even allows you to delete spam before you download it. You may need to turn these features on. Have a look for the pages on 'spam' or 'junk mail' in the help section of your mail program.
7. Use a spam filter. A filtering program looks at the origin of the e-mail as well as scanning the subject line and text of emails for keywords such as "Viagra" or "XXX" etc. or for word patterns or word frequency and either directs the messages to a particular location, or deletes them before they reach your inbox. The programs available have different features. Some scan the emails before you download them, some scan afterwards. Some integrate with your usual mail program, and others are stand-alone. Some of the more popular programs include:

 - McAfee Spamkiller – <http://uk.mcafee.com>Prices vary and free trials are available to download.
8. Contact your ISP or visit their website to see if they offer a spam filtering service – if they are a good company then it is more than likely that they do. There may be an additional charge for this, which varies from between £5 to £30 a year, but you can expect these filters to stop over 95% of the junk e-mails and is well worth the expense if you are particularly troubled by it. If your ISP doesn't offer a spam filtering service, consider switching!

Recent issues of the Messenger have highlighted the traffic problems in Modbury, especially on the main road through the town, A379. But I would like to remind residents of the dangerous situation which exists at the top of Brownston Street – vehicles are coming down Brownston Street at terrific speeds and it is obvious that a head-on collision will occur unless some form of traffic calming is introduced. We have already witnessed one horrific crash in Church Street recently. The speed limit until vehicles reach Modbury is 60mph – many seem to be doing 40 or 50 when they come down this street in the middle of the road – due to cars parked on both sides.

I am not advocating any parking restrictions there, but a sensible solution would be the introduction of a 10 or 15mph limit, with 'rumble' strips. Drivers who are not familiar with the area are suddenly faced with oncoming traffic.

Otherwise the time will come when a one-way system will be the only answer.

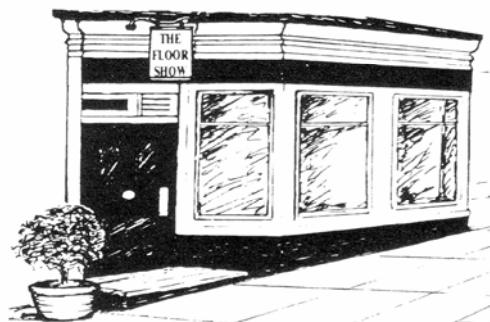

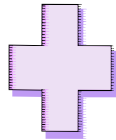

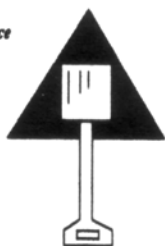
