The walks have become an established part of Modbury's Fair

celebrations. This year we have decided to go back to the original idea which was the challenge to walk all Modbury's Rights of Way in one day. A lot of people achieved this, one of whom was Norman Furzeland and our Walks Cup is presented each year in his memory.

Who can keep up the tradition? The longest walk covering a mere 15 miles takes in most of our Footpaths. There will be a selection of other walks available for the less active!

MODBURY NEEDS YOU



Are you 18 or over?

Do you live in Modbury or within 3 miles of the parish boundary?

Are you on the electoral register?

If so, Modbury needs you to stand for election to the Parish Council on May 7th.

There are twelve places up for grabs and we believe only four of the current councillors are standing for re-election.

Your duties, should you be elected, are not onerous. The full Council meets once a month, currently the second Monday. There are various sub-committees and working groups which meet from time to time. Finance and human resources meets four times a year and sets the budget and monitors spending. Planning meets when needed and makes recommendations to South Hams District Council on planning applications, from minor extensions to major developments. The QE II recreation field and pavilion are owned by the Parish Council and are looked after by MARS which is a subcommitte on which at least two parish There is a maintenance subcouncillors sit. committee which organises the grass cutting around the town and looks after the parish play area at the Memorial Hall and the car park on Individual councillors represent the Green. Modbuy PC on various local groups and organisations, eg Memorial Hall, Modbury Caring, Millennium Meadow.

Your involvement can be as little or as great as you choose. It is a very satisfying role to be part of the management of our beautiful town.

Our clerk, Sally Walsh, deals with most of the day -to-day work and administration.

Training will be organised for new councillors.

Nomination forms are available from the Parish Office and have to be returned to SHDC by 4.00pm on the 9th April at the latest.

If you want to know more please ask one of the current councillors.

West of Palm Cross Green Development

You probably have heard by now that the Parish Council recommended refusal for the major planning application for 93 houses. We support the principle of building on this site but do not like aspects of Bloor's proposal, particularly the highways issues and the location and design of the employment use building. In our opinion Bloor has not listened to what their consultations told them and has misrepresented the findings to SHDC planning officers during pre-application discussions.

A second application for "change of use" to replace the existing car park on the Green with an open space and play area and put a new 30 place car park adjacent to the Green has been received. Closing date for comments is 27th March (as at time of writing). Unfortunately it looks as though the play area is just a green space with no equipment! The Parish Council will be making strong representations to SHDC that as we own the Green no changes can be made without our approval and without our conditions being met. We do want to see the area tidied up and integrated with the development as it is in the Conservation Area but it must be done as we want.

Yellow Lines: The new lines have been painted (and some removed). Please respect them and don't chance your luck with the traffic wardens! The amended proposals for The Orchard and Scalders Lane (a very small section) have been approved.

Annual Meeting: This will be held on the 13th April at 6.30 in the Memorial Hall. Clubs and societies can give a brief report of their activities and people can ask questions of the Parish Council.

RAISING THE ROOF UPDATE					



Since the original article last summer, many people have been asking about the church roof, saying that they were unaware of the problems with the building, and asking how they could help. So firstly, thank you to those who have offered support in any way. The church building is an important community asset that has been cared for by the Modbury community for over 600 years. As a Grade 1 listed building it is among the top 2% of buildings in the country, and it is good to see the

concern for the preservation of its heritage by the folk of Modbury. We felt it would therefore be good to run a regular update on the progress of the "Raising the Roof" project.

THE COSTS: There are three areas of essential and urgent work that have been identified - the Roof and Tower, to secure the building and make it watertight; and internal repairs and redecoration. Estimates from the Quantity Surveyor indicate that the total cost for all of the above work is about £625,000 including VAT. Clearly this is an unachievable sum for a single project, so the PCC, as custodians of the building, have elected to concentrate on the main task first, the roof – which in itself will cost £486,000 including VAT.

PAYING FOR IT: With the current funds we have set aside, and the contribution from Eton College, we have a total of about £112,000 towards the project. In addition we will be able to reclaim the VAT of £79,000 and volunteer time adds a further \pounds 6,400 to the pot.

The PCC have made an application to the Heritage Lottery Fund for a maximum grant of £250,000, and we will know the outcome of this in June. The PCC have also committed £10,000 from their general unrestricted funds; the Betty Coyte Trust has committed £20,000 and we have received an offer of £5,000 from Devon Historic Churches Trust. We therefore need to raise a further £5,000 or so from within the community, to allow the work to proceed.

WHAT'S NEXT: Fun ideas for raising the shortfall needed would be welcome, so if you have any ideas, please let us know. We are also preparing grant application to other agencies for funds to allow us to undertake the work on the Tower (£55,000). These will be submitted as soon as our HLF grant application is determined. As we hear the results we will keep you posted. In the meantime, there is still a lot to do.

We will be applying for the necessary permissions to undertake the work, so that these are in place, allowing work to start as soon as possible. If all goes well, we could have a watertight building by the end of 2016 or early 2017.

So that the community may be fully involved in this exciting project, we will be holding an open meeting to explain in detail the problems and what is being done to restore the building to what it should be - a Grade 1 listed building of which the town can proud. My Passion.....This month Charlotte Rathbone tells us about her passion for soil.

As Franklin D Roosevelt said in 1936 "A Nation that destroys its soil, destroys itself "

This year is International Year of Soils 2015. Hooray! As soil is a passion for me! Welcome to the warm, dark, living world of the soil. Whether we garden, farm or eat food - we all depend on soil to live.

Without a healthy layer of soil, society as we know it would not be able to function. Healthy soils are not only essential for the production of food but are a vital part of our global ecosystem, acting as a carbon sink to reduce the impact of climate change. We need to look after and value our soils, as around the world they are increasingly being threatened by contamination, compaction, erosion, flooding and salinisation. So how can we inspire a deeper public understanding of the importance of soil as a resource on which the whole of civilisation depends but many take for granted?

As a geographer and landscape architect I have been interested in soils for many years. I am also interested in whether art can help improve and change society; perhaps inspiring people through the arts to kindle the imagination, open minds and engage communities. I have been a trustee and advisor to The Centre for Contemporary Art and the Natural World (CCANW) in Exeter for several years; and our present project is to use the arts to inspire change in the way we think about soil. The project will last for 3 years and

Soil Culture is about new art by artists from all over the world, hosted in various locations from Kew Gardens in London, Hannah's at Seale Hayne and the Eden project in Cornwall. The art will be exhibited in galleries in the South West, starting with Dartington this May - do go along - they will be free! I will also be contributing my own arts practice - Tasting the Place, inspired by the work of Californian artist Laura Parker. This is a fun way to enlighten the public on the connection and importance of



soil and the provenance of food. Using all their senses, I encourage people to 'taste' the soil and turf, followed by produce from a local farm.

Jackie Gale- Textile Artist

Jackie was brought up in Leicestershire and moved to Devon twenty five years ago. She lives in Yealmpton with her husband, three children and a rather energetic cockapoo! For a living she gets to do what she loves most – art! On most weekdays you can find her in her art studio based in Artisan Homes on Modbury's friendly Industrial Estate.

When did you start your business?

Having spent twenty years in a nursing career I decided three years ago to take a different direction with my life and pursue the creative ambition I had been harbouring for some time. With my passion for textiles my first port of call was to learn the skills required of a textile artist such as free motion machine embroidery and appliqué. It was great fun as I did it with a friend and I soon became addicted to turning places into textile creations. A huge turning point was the Yealmpton Show was as I sold a lot of work and decided that becoming a professional artist was now a serious option.

Have you always been artistic?

I grew up in a creative household as my mother painted in oils and my grandmother was always making something on hermanual singer sewing machine. I was usually busy making something out of bits of elastic, buttons and left over fabrics.

What inspires you as an artist?

My work is full of colour and texture and many of the places I portray are brimming with these and living in Devon Hugh comes from Winchester in Hampshire, but he has lived and worked all over the UK. He has always been in sales but latterly in the motor trade. I met up for a chat with him in Luscombe Maye Estate Agents.

What brought you to Devon?

In 2000 I came with a friend on holiday to Kingston - I loved the place immediately! I met a lot of people in the Dolphin Inn, they were so friendly and one evening I ended up going to someone's house and cooking a curry for all the locals. After that I was invited here for Christmas, birthdays, parties etc. and it was at a wedding that I met my partner Emma Cane - three months later I moved here! So what made you move into the Estate Agent Business?

I was living here but working away during the week. I saw this job advertised and

decided that my new life should go with a new challenge - a complete change! What is the best part of your job?

I moved here because I just love this area! Being an Estate Agent means I have the benefit of being at work by the sea, by the moors, in a beautiful village, almost always with a gorgeous view!

How do you spend your spare time?

I love to walk my dog Otterman, exploring the coastal paths and countryside, I do a little shooting also, and I love to mess about on the water making the most of our local beaches. And.... as the people who know me will tell you..... I'm very partial to frequenting our local hostelries!

I am surrounded by beautiful, interesting places. I love to capture the essence of a place and tell its story and I believe that just about any place can be interpreted in textiles! My colourful, quirky style comes from a desire to create work that makes people feel happy. There is a lot of sadness in the world and it is such a wonderful feeling when I create something that lifts spirits and brings a smile.

What are you especially proud of?

I was a finalist for the Fine Art Trade Guild's 'Best Up & Coming Artist 2014' which was a fabulous feeling as I was only one year into this journey. To meet established successful artists and professionals in London felt like a huge achievement. Also, I support a charity called Jeremiah's Journey which supports bereaved children and those with terminally ill parents. The last time we met, the families worked together to make textile pictures of their favourite places - it's a wonderful example of how art, at any level, can bring people together especially at such a difficult time.

What helps you get through your working day?

I work alongside Andre Daniel who as a fellow creative understands the up and down nature of running an art business. We encourage each other and share ideas as well as the day to day running of the showroom and exhibitions. It is a fabulous environment to work in as I am surrounded by beautiful creations and as I love creating art, getting through a day is never that hard. What are you currently working on?

I have decided to do a study of textiles in nature – particularly on the moors but I think a beach may not be far behind. I was walking on Dartmoor recently and photographed lots of amazing natural architecture there like the abundant crispy bracken to the uncurling ferns.... It's a project I am going to immerse myself in and thoroughly enjoy.

DRAB - never, Save a Life - probably!

My wife and I recently (February) took up the offer 'advertised' in the Messenger some months ago by our local Co-responder, Nigel Toms, for Community Public Access Defibrillator Training.

For those of you who are not aware, Nigel could probably be the first qualified person to arrive on your doorstep if you are involved in a medical emergency locally and the defibrillator is the invaluable public access defibrillator equipment located in its cabinet on the wall outside 1 Modbury Court, Church St. (Go and spot it in case you are asked to get it in an emergency). The defibrillator, purchased by our Parish Council, is there for anyone to use on someone in cardiac arrest.

Eleven of us attended The Modbury Club that dull evening in February only to find it brightened up by the enthusiasm of our trainer Nigel. We spent two hours rolling about on the floor, rubbing chests and carrying out 'mouth to mouth' - yes it was First Aid training - nothing more salubrious!!

Everybody agreed it was most interesting, thought provoking; invaluable and that more local people should consider taking the opportunity if it is proposed to run further training. Grateful thanks to Nigel Toms and The Modbury Club.

Did I forget to mention - it was free, so there is an inducement straight away! But more importantly having spent that two hours receiving life saving information it gave everybody the confidence that they could save a life. Would you know what to do? Could you save that life?

So next time an opportunity arises to be involved in local Community Public Access Defibrillator Training my advice would be - do it!


