YOU SHOULD BE COMMITTED!

How did you read the words above? They could be taken in one of two ways: either it's a suggestion that you should be put in a secure place where you cannot do any harm to yourself or other people, or it is an encouragement to get your priorities right and put time and effort in.

It is sad that we live in an age where 'commitment' can be confused with insanity! Of course all of us have our own commitments – just take a look at the way your own time, effort and money are spent and they will reveal your priorities. There may be some surprises if you actually do an audit of these three.

This month there are three opportunities to be committed (in the best way)!

Confirmation

.....involves making a personal commitment to God. Many people are baptised as babies and have no choice in the matter. They are welcomed into the church and the ways of worship, prayer and faith. Some continue to grow in faith and come to the point where they decide for themselves and say "yes" to God's promises and "yes" to the invitation to be a follower of Jesus. This is a lifelong commitment. If your journey of faith has led you to this point then come along to the Vicarage at 8 pm on Wednesday 7 February to see if you would like to go forward for confirmation on 15 April.

Marriage

.....is a big commitment, and a brave step for people to take. Of course it is not something that just happens on one day! We echo the vows "all that I have, I give to you and all that I have I share with you" in the everyday decisions, thoughts and acts of married life. Some of you will be making special plans for Valentines Day this month (14 February); why not include our Prayer and Praise Celebration of Marriage service on the Sunday before, 11 February at 6.30 pm as part of your plans. Let me know if you are coming and were married in St George's. Bring a photograph of your wedding day with you.

Lent

.....is the season when Christians take an honest look at their own commitment to God as we prepare for Holy week and Easter, when we recall God's commitment to us which went all the way to the cross. Lent begins on February 21st, Ash Wednesday. During Lent there will be a number of Lent groups:

An environmentally committed course: "What on earth are we doing?" An Alpha course in the Journey's End, Ringmore; and a "Season of Renewal" course. More details are available in church.

Every great journey begins with a single step. May you find God's blessing in the steps you take.

ngela's Garden Corner

Your Garden in February

Traditionally February Fillydye was when vast amounts of rain fell. These days, this month is often dry but it is unlikely that your soil will be capable of being walked on or worked on.

LAWNS

Check your mower is up and running but keep off the lawn until next month.

BEDS AND BORDERS

Start off your seed growing in the heated propagator or on the kitchen window sill. Prune any cane-like shrubs such as leycesteria and fuchsia. There is still time to prune your roses at the beginning of the month. Use twiggy sticks around the emerging shoots of early herbaceous plants. This is much neater than tying them up later in the season. Cut back late-flowering clematis. All this work should be done from a path or, if it is unavoidable to tread on the border, from a plank or board. Many bulbs will be emerging or even flowering now. Make a note of any clumps that need moving after they have died down.

Split and move snowdrops while they are still green. Mulches should be applied to any bare soil after heavy rain. This will help to keep moisture in the soil. Bring short sprays of spring-flowering camellias or magnolias into the house. They do not last as long indoors but you can enjoy the beautiful blooms unspoilt by rain or frost.

PATHS AND PATIOS

This is a good time to plant up your pots and planters for the spring season. If you want to take advantage of bulk buy offers why not plant a few

extra pots as presents for Easter or Mothers Day, or perhaps for an elderly relative or someone who has been ill.

Every year sees the introduction of new varieties of plants or new colour choices, so try something new this year. The old favourites like polyanthus and wallflowers are always reliable for colour and you can try mixing them with grasses or low-growing evergreens to ring the changes. One feature shrub in a beautiful pot takes a lot of beating. (See the six great plants feature below), especially near the house.

GREENHOUSE

Clean the glass in the greenhouse and replace the border soil from a spare bit of ground in the garden. Next month will be busy so it is a good idea to get everything ready for planting and sowing now.

VEGETABLES AND FRUIT

Cover the emerging shoots of rhubarb with large upturned pots for an early crop. Prune gooseberry and currant bushes now.

In the vegetable garden cover a few areas with clear plastic sheets to warm the soil, weighting the edges down to stop them blowing away. This will help your direct sown seeds to get off to a good start next month. Sow seeds of indoor tomatoes, peppers and aubergines this month.

Use your notebook to check where you grew vegetables last year and work out your plan for 2007.

SIX GREAT PLANTS FOR WINTER SCENT

Hamamelis mollis, the Wych Hazel, is expensive to buy but worth every penny. Heavily scented yellow ribbon flowers cover the bare branches in February.

Lonicera fragrantissima, the Winter Honeysuckle, is not a climber but a medium-sized evergreen shrub with creamy, scented flowers.

Abeliophyllum distichum has no common name, but don't let that put you off. Very pretty white flowers in February on a slow-growing evergreen shrub. Lovely scent.

Viburnum bodnantens 'Dawn' has candy pink flower clusters with a knockout perfume. It is however quite a large shrub.

Mahonia "Charity" is an upright shrub which can grow against a wall. Very large golden sprays of scented flowers.

Acacia dealbata, the Silver Wattle or Mimosa, is hardier than you might think and, if you have room for it, will welcome in the spring with its tiny yellow perfumed flowers.

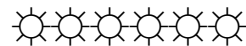

SCHOOL REPORT

MODBURY SCHOOL TELLS 'PORKY PIES' !

February sees the Expressive Arts Week take place with a school production entitled *Porky Pies*. This is a derivation of the three little pigs where we see the Wolf put on trial! Will we find the truth? Will Judge John Deed ensure justice is done?

MODBURY SWAPS CONTINENTS

This term the school is studying India and its cultural and geographic differences. In particular they are looking at the village community of Chembakolli which is situated in the south of India in the forested area of Tamil Nadu State. This is very much a farming area where they grow rice, onions, tomatoes, peppers and oranges, with an emphasis on producing these crops for their local needs. I am sure 'buy local' and 'healthy eating' are not slogans that need to be promoted, as that comes naturally to these people!

The children of Key Stage 2 will be comparing their existence with that of those living in Chembakolli. I am sure this will be a fascinating journey as they learn about family values and schooling and how the mums of the village fetch and carry water from wells and grind the rice, cook and clean for the family, as well as working in the fields!

This is a great project for the children of our school as they discover that our world has differences that we can enjoy and embrace.

If anyone in the community has experience or knowledge of life in India or has artefacts

from this country that they are willing to share with the school then please contact Bridie, the Head Teacher at the school.

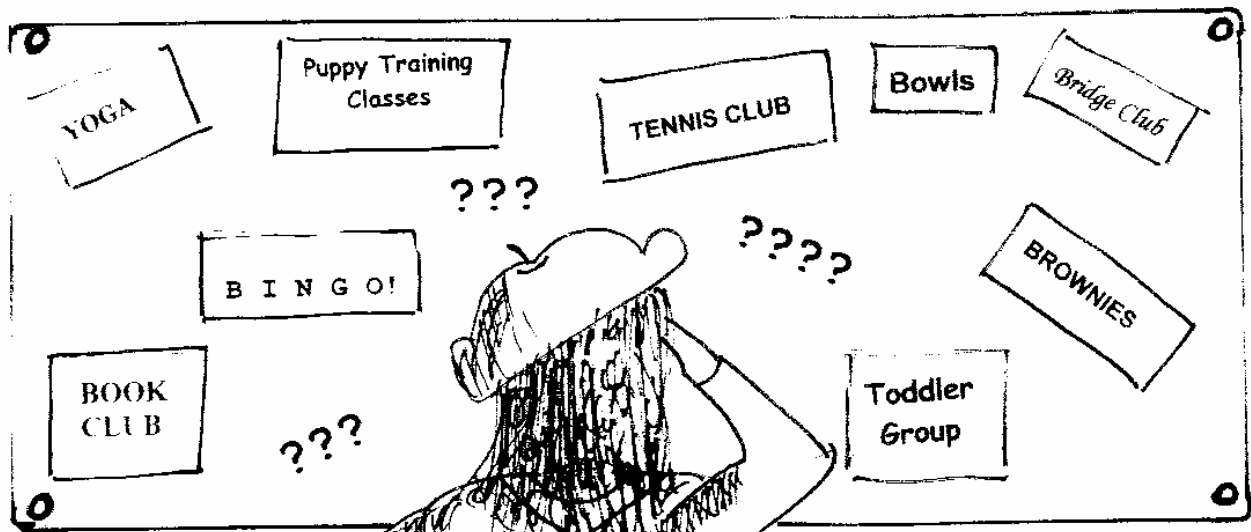

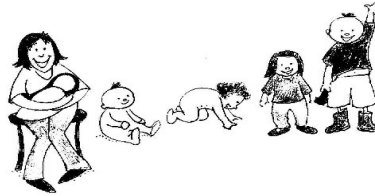

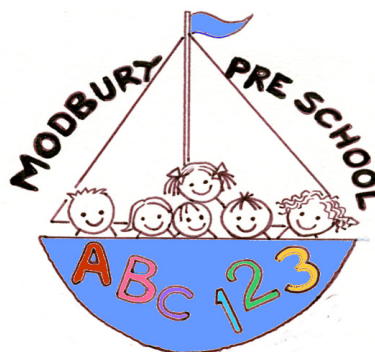

GREEN CONSCIENCE BEGINS AT HOME

The Environment Agency tells us that as householders there is much we can do to protect the environment. In fact we can be held legally responsible for most types of pollution that originates from our homes and that can be costly.

The Agency offers this advice to reduce our impact on the environment:

- Never pour waste oil down the drain as this causes river pollution. Offenders can easily be traced and face heavy fines as well as the cost of the clean-up operation.
- If you employ someone to take waste away, check that they are registered to carry waste. Most fly tipping is committed by 'cowboy' operators who are unable to use licensed facilities because they are not registered.

Since 1st January 2006 householders are responsible for knowing how their waste is disposed of. If it is dumped illegally the householder can be fined as well as the person who dumped it.
