I don't know what the future holds, but as a Christian hymn puts it:


I know who holds the future And I know He holds

PLANNING

Modbury Parish Council recommended and SHDC granted permission for:

38 Galpin Street – Erection of conservatory.

Kingsland, *Brownston Street* – Conversion and extension of garage to create dwelling.

Undermeadows –Re-submission of amendments for new dwelling.

Priory Farm – Re-submission for erection of machinery store.

Sports Field – Erection of Tennis Club hut.

Modbury Parish Council made the following recommendations

Kingsway, 10 The Priory – First floor extension to garage to provide office/workshop. Recommended subject to workshop for domestic use only.

Ruffaton Barn – Erection of timber stable block. Recommended subject to restriction to prevent stabling being used for residential purposes.

FLY TIPPING FIXED PENALTY FINES

A recent incidence of household rubbish being abandoned in a remote spot in our Parish resulted in a very swift Fixed Penalty Notice for £75 being issued to the perpetrator. The Fixed Penalty ranges from £75 to £300.

We urge all residents to continue to keep an eye open for any fly tipping occurrences and if the culprits are identified please be assured that SHDC have the remit to take immediate action (report to the Parish Office or SHDC direct).

In addition to household rubbish there are an increasing number of plastic drink bottles being discarded by walkers, passing cars and joggers.

As an adjunct to this, the Police Community Support Officers will now be able to issue £50 Fixed Penalty Notices to those anti-social persons who fail to clear up their dog's mess so it is plain to see that SHDC are now taking the subject

of creating a cleaner environment for all very seriously.

For the majority who do fully recognise their responsibilities – thank you!

THE GREEN CORNER



Tackling climate change is one of the most important things this generation can do, and we all need to get involved in as many ways as possible. A lot has been written about the effectiveness of heat insulation, but did you know that producing, transporting and consuming food is responsible for nearly a third of our climate change effects? Some foods have a much bigger impact on the environment than others, so look for labels to help you choose food that has been produced with the aim of reducing the negative impact on wildlife and the environment. Buying food when locally in season is a positive move, and although we all like tropical fruits, we really ought to look forward to eating home produced beans and peas in the summer, rather than having them flown in from the other side of the world during the winter. I recently saw some carrots nicely packed in a plastic bag with a label showing they were grown in Kenya. I also saw some growing in a field near Ugborough.

A fact I find difficult to believe is that the average UK household spends £424 a year on food that goes in the binif this ends up in landfill it produces methane, a greenhouse gas judged to be more than 20 times as powerful as carbon dioxide. Wasting less food produces less methane and reduces other harmful environmental impacts from producing, packaging and transporting food.

A Happy and Green New Year to everyone, and try to keep your methane production under control!

SCHOOL REPORT

PRAISE INDEED

I reported last month that recent Statutory Assessment Test results confirmed that we are in the TOP 2% NATIONALLY for pupil progress. This has been followed up by reports in both the Western Morning News and the Times newspapers highlighting attainment in Primary schools throughout the country, featuring Modbury Primary School amongst the top schools in Devon.

According to the Times measurement on attainment, they placed Modbury School 9th in the country and 2nd in Devon. These results are a reflection of both the quality of teaching and the natural ability of each particular year 6 group. All the year groups differ in natural ability and whilst it is recognised that some years will come through stronger than others, our aim is always to make the very best of the abilities we have to work with.

SONGS OF LIFE

November 12th saw the culmination of weeks of singing practice for the year 5 Pupils including various members of staff, who took part in a concert at Ivybridge Community College. This was part of the Schools in Lifetime Project, which was produced and written by David Haines where the words and music told the story of evolution in animals, insects and plants. It was a fantastic evening of 'educational' music, which involved learning and performing 14, sometimes very complicated songs.

Our students performed alongside those from Yealmpton, Wembury, Brixton and Ugborough and once again did us proud. David is now producing a new musical and will work with South Brent School and us.

The following is an extract from one of his pieces entitled *Hedgehog*. This was put to a beautiful tune and provides a flavour of his work. As I read this I reframed the words in my mind to reflect the seasons of learning that our pupils travel through and the bright new dawn that their learning provides:

Carol singing took place in the Exeter Inn on Friday, 15th December. All those present enjoyed this event and we thank those who gave generously towards our school funds.

Our pupils provided entertainment for the retired of the community on Tuesday 18th, in the afternoon. This included songs and a nativity, performed in the school hall. Well done to all who took part and gave pleasure to our senior citizens.

The Carol Service, which is one of the highlights of the year, was held in a

packed St George's Church during the afternoon of Thursday 20th December.

The New Modbury Angel Restaurant opened in Modbury School in December when the Cookery Club held their Christmas meal. They prepared a three-course meal with dining by candlelight! Bookings being taken for 2008!
