"How much do you love me?"



POLICE SURGERY

This is held on the first Monday in the month at the Parish Office, 6 Modbury Court, Church Street between 5.00 pm and 7.00 pm. If you would like to discuss any relevant issues please call in and see PCSO Stacy Thorn.

DO YOU KNOW......

... how much electricity you are using? How much it costs to run your fridge and freezer or leave your TV or PC on standby? Well, now you can find out!

We have been given a simple device that monitors your energy consumption and it is available for you to borrow.

You clip the monitor around the mains electric cable near the meter and it measures the power going through the cable. It sends this information via a wireless signal to a small handheld display. You then walk around the house switching plugs and lights on and off to see the difference.

This tells you where all your money is going i.e. freezer, fridge, TV on standby, PC and peripherals, hall lights etc. (NB: There is no need for an electrician – you are not making any electrical connections to the mains cable – although if in doubt you should always call in an expert).

The monitoring unit is kept in the Parish Office. If you would like to borrow it for a week please contact David Hansford (830222 or <u>modburypc@tiscali.co.uk</u>). He is usually in the office on Mondays and Thursdays or you could come to the Saturday surgery between 10.00 am and 11.00 am. We'd love to see you!

THE GREEN CORNER – A PERSONAL VIEW

Although you'll still find a few people who are in denial of climate change, it's good to see that the Government is taking it seriously and is committed to reducing carbon emissions by 40% by 2020. But then 2020 is a long way away, and surely there'll be a magical solution by then, so global warming, oil running out and rising sea levels are not really our problems are they? Especially because tackling the problems is going to be a bit inconvenient - it could mean a change in the way we travel, heat our homes and an increase in fuel costs and taxes, and until China and India stop building power stations there is little point is there?

An alternative view is that we are on the edge of irreversible changes to the very fragile structure of life on Planet Earth. We all need clean reliable power supplies and energy to sustain our way of life and that of our children and grandchildren – and China needs power to make most of the goods in British shops! It's a world problem and every country needs to be involved in finding a solution. I just wonder whether the huge new power station at Langage, running, I believe on gas imported from Russia is very sensible.

In Britain there's always controversy about wind turbines – whether to site them on land or at sea and how cost efficient they are. Personally I regard them not as blots on the landscape but a sign of a community's responsible attitude to energy production. SHROVE TUESDAY

Traditionally Shrove Tuesday marks the beginning of Lent, when hundreds of people throughout the country make pancakes, before they begin a 40 day fast (optional). When you are distracted by the haunting image of a delicious, warm pancake sprinkled with lemon juice and sugar, fire safety may not be at the forefront of your mind! Fat and chip pan fires are the second biggest cause of fires in people's homes.

Repeatedly attending fires and seeing people making the same mistakes, place a responsibility on us to communicate the risk of injury and death.

When using a frying pan or cooking with hot oil, remember:

- Never leave the pan unattended when the heat is switched on
- Do NOT move the pan if it is on fire!
- Never put the food in the pan if the oil begins to give off smoke

If the pan does catch fire:

- Turn off the heat if it is safe to do so
- Run a cloth under a tap and wring it out
- Cover the pan and leave it to cool completely, for at least 30 minutes

If you are in any doubt leave the room, closing the door behind you:

- Get Out
- Get the Fire Brigade **Out**
- Stay **Out**

A <u>working</u> smoke alarm will greatly increase your chances of escaping unharmed. Have a plan and follow it - know exactly which way you will leave the house, and know where you will go.

Stay alive, stay safe, make sure the alarm works properly;

- Test the battery every week
- Change the battery every year (unless it's a 10 year alarm)
- Clean it out properly at least twice every year, by vacuuming the inside.

1ST MODBURY SEA SCOUTS

Looking back, we had a packed fun and adventure year in 2007, the Centenary of Scouting. Following our last bulletin we had a very enjoyable visit from Gary Streeter MP, with a question and answer slot, after he had given us an insight into how the Government is run. This was both informative and entertaining.

We also had a visit from South Hams District Councillor, Geoffrey Fielden. He told us about how the Council is run and the services covered by the different departments. This produced a lively debate on several local issues that concern the Scouts, including bus routes.

At Teignbridge Scout and Guide HQ in Newton Abbot, there is an Amateur Radio Club. Once a year they invite Scouts and Guides around the world. We took nine Scouts who each had a turn to speak to Scouts from 19 other countries, and the Scouts received a JOTA (Jamboree On The Air) badge. We travelled by train (which, from lvybridge was only £2 each for the Scouts and £4 per adult). The Scouts took part in a quiz around Newton Abbot which was challenging. The whole day meant they passed sections in their Community and Global Challenges.

In November we raised money for Shelterbox by sleeping in a cardboard box outside! The Scouts thought this was one of the year's highlights and it was very amusing to see them in their boxes with hats, gloves and blankets as well as survival and sleeping bags. This also made the Scouts aware of the plight of the Bangladeshi people who do not have a home and the homeless here in our country and local areas.

In December, two leaders and a Scout went back to Newton Abbot to take part in their Peacelight Service. Within the Scouting and Guiding umbrella, a light, from the light that burns perpetually in Bethlehem, is carried over to Dover and is distributed to other parts of the UK. Teignbridge District receive the light before Christmas and people take their lanterns to take a light to their local church or their home. The Peacelight goes on to Plymouth and Cornwall and it goes all over the world. We are hoping to have our own Peacelight service here this year, for the first time.

Now, in 2008, we are already into our Spring programme. We are grateful to Modbury Fire Brigade for giving us their time on three evenings to cover the Fire Safety Badge in January and February. We are hoping to do lots of fundraising this year as we have the chance of a week of activities – mostly on the water – in the Isle of Man. The trip won't be until the summer holidays but everyone is getting excited already. Lots of other exciting challenges coming up too.

We were very sad to say 'goodbye' to Sam Clark, who came to Scouts while in England on an exchange visit with his family. He went back to Australia at the end of December. However, we still have 17 Scouts here and there is room for more if you would like to join - and helpers are very welcome too.




