I thought it might help if we all realise how we are marked. We will be judged in group 'b', which is for villages with population of 500 to 3000.

Judging Schedule:

- 1. Absence of litter and unsightly verges (10)
- 2. Condition of village greens, playing fields, school yards, public seats and noticeboards (10)
- 3. Condition of public and private buildings, gardens and allotments including hedges, walls, fences and outhouses (10)
- 4. Condition of churchyards, cemeteries and war memorials (10)
- 5. Condition of public halls, sports facilities and car parks (10)
- 6. Cleanliness of public toilets, bus shelters and telephone kiosks (10)
- 7. State of footpaths, stiles, field gates, signposting, ponds and streams (10)
- 8. Condition of commercial and business premises, including advertisements and other signs (10)

- 9. Clear evidence of local commitment and initiative in the care and maintenance of the village (10)
- 10. Evidence of community spirit (10)

Preliminary Judging: May & June. Final Judging: July

It used to be quite easy to tell who were the good guys and who were the bad guys in cowboy films. You could tell the heroes from the villains by what they wore – the bad guys seemed to choose black hats to identify them. In cartoons you could spot a villain because he was wearing

a horizontally striped shirt and sometimes carried a bag marked "swag".

In real life it is more of a problem. Newspapers and TV

will often point the finger at the "bad guys", making it seem very black and white, but we don't often see the whole story.

Christians have recently been celebrating Easter. Many people thought Jesus was a villain – why else would he have been crucified? He must have been one of the bad guys to end up there. But the day of Good Friday was

not the whole story, and millions of people since have come to see Jesus as a hero worth following.

As you look at yourself in the mirror what do you see? Hero or villain? Good guy or bad guy? The Christian faith invites us to see the bigger picture, the full story: with the honesty of admitting that we are sinners, with faith in the love of God and trust in Jesus Christ, we find forgiveness for our failures and the call to be saints.

You can't spot saints by their halos, they are simply people who are open


to God's Holy Spirit making them more holy. That's not a DIY job, nor does it happen instantly.

Modbury Parish Council recommended and SHDC granted permission for:

Treveor, Treveor Gardens – Erection of conservatory, study and cloakroom.

SHDC granted permission for:

Ruffaton Barn – Resubmission of application for timber framed stable block (previously refused).

Modbury PC made the following recommendations:

Coppers Corner – Retrospective application for hardcore access to be refused.

Deer House, 22 Church Street – Alterations to external steps to be approved.

Hillcrest House, 18 Brownston Street – Installation of handrail to front steps to be approved.

Greenovens field SW of Bastard Park Corner – Resubmission of erection of barn for feed store and equipment to be approved.

LOOKING FOR AN AFFORDABLE HOME?

Do you want to rent or part own a new affordable house in Modbury? The Parish Plan survey found that over 80 people wanted to do so in the next 5 years. **But who are you?**

We are looking with South Hams planners for a site to build affordable houses for local people. If we find a site the houses will be allocated to people who are on the South Hams housing list (for rented units) or the Home2Own list (for shared ownership). The houses will be allocated to Modbury people first.

It would help us if we knew about you as well. Please contact the Parish Clerk, David Hansford, in confidence (830222 Monday or Thursday) or speak to any Parish Councillor.

NB: If you are in urgent need of housing advice then you should speak to South Hams on the number given.

The type of site we are seeking is called an 'exception site' because it is outside the present planning boundary for Modbury and would not normally be given planning permission, except that it is all affordable housing (rented or shared ownership).

If you own land close to the town, are willing to see some of it developed in this way for the good of the community and with a return that is higher than agricultural values, then contact Mark Lawrence on 830423.

RUBBISH

South Hams have been looking at their collection rounds and a revised system is starting week of May 12th. Most people will have the same collection as before and every household will be getting an information pack.

If you are not currently on the two bin system but would like to be then you can ask SHDC and they will provide the bins, free of charge. This will help increase the already impressive recycling figures!

POST OFFICE CLOSURES

The Post Office is announcing on May 20th which POs in Devon are to be closed. There will be a 6 week 'consultation' period but if one PO is reprieved another will be added to the list!

LOCAL GOVERNMENT REORGANISATION

The Government has asked the Boundary Committee to look again at whether Devon can be organised as Unitary Authorities. These would replace the current 'two tier' system of Devon County Council and the 8 District Councils.

Various concepts have been submitted to the Boundary Committee and these fall into three basic patterns. One is for 3 UAs, namely Pymouth, Torbay and a large rural Devon; the second is for Plymouth, Torbay and rural Devon divided into three smaller UAs (South, North and East); the third is for Plymouth to expand to take in the western part of the South Hams, Torbay to expand to take the rest and some of Teignbridge, and the remainder of Devon to be a single UA.

The Boundary Committee will be announcing its preferred concept in early July for consultation. The Parish Council is opposed to being part of a greater Plymouth authority. What do you think?

PARKING

South Hams are taking over the traffic warden duties from the Police from May. This should increase the number of visits as they will be doing their normal car park duties at the same time. **Be warned!**

Spring seems to have arrived earlier than last year with sightings of Swallows and House Martins in Modbury. This probably has nothing to do with climate change, but probably because of a few days of warm southerly winds. Has anyone else noticed that there have been very few fieldfares, redwings and lapwings in the fields these last few months? These birds migrate southwards ahead of cold weather and used to be a regular feature in the Devon countryside. A preliminary study by Devon Wildlife Trust has identified several species of birds, animals and plants that may change the look of Devon as the result of climate change. We may expect to see fewer skylarks, dunlin, curlews and avocets but a greater number of buzzards, stonechats, merlin and Dartford Warblers. Water voles, brown hares and the dormouse will decline, but we may see more bats and bottle-nosed dolphins. A warmer climate will also make life easier for the large blue butterfly and the great green bush cricket. For wildlife then climate change won't be all bad and Mother Nature will accommodate up to a point. www.devonwildlifetrust.org for more information.

There's an old story about why harvests were (allegedly) much larger in communities that had a larger than average number of widows in the population. One theory was that old ladies kept more cats, which caught more mice, which left more mouse holes to be inhabited by more bumble-bees, which pollinated more corn, which increased the harvest. No, I don't really believe it either, but there just might be something to learn about the ripple effect in nature of seemingly unrelated events.

And on a completely different tack – if you've felt guilty about taking something to the dump or recycling facility that you're sure might still be useful for someone else, there's an internet based organisation called Freecycle which enables you to offer or request items for free. No money changes hands, just a slightly warm glow perhaps. The nearest organisation is in South Brent and covers the northern half of the South Hams. You have to join the Yahoo group <u>http://groups.yahoo.com/</u> and look for "Southbrentfreecycle" which is easy to do, and you can then offer and receive e-mails of other offerings ranging from building blocks to prams to computers. SCHOOL REPORT



OUTSTANDING

Inspectors from Ofsted have rated Modbury School outstanding. As reported by the Western Morning News:

Modbury School was given a rare accolade by Ofsted following a recent inspection (18 March).

It won praise in all five categories – overall effectiveness, achievements and standards, personal development and well being, quality of provision, and leadership and management.

The inspectors said "pupils' personal well-being, including their spiritual, moral, social and cultural development was *simply outstanding*. They have very positive attitudes to learning and high quality work is to be celebrated. Pupils enjoy school and their behaviour is exemplary".

For the last two years the school has been in the top 5% nationally for Value added, which measures the progress children make in their learning from Years Three to Six.



Congratulations must go to all the teaching and support staff at Modbury School and in particular to the Head Teacher, Bridie Thong for her outstanding leadership of the school. We have often sung the praises of the school in this column and those of us close to the school know first hand how totally committed all the team is to giving 100% to our children. To quote Bridie, **"It is a school where every child genuinely matters, feeling included and enjoying school".**

I think that the word "genuinely" in the last quote is what makes the difference; Bridie and her staff do what they do **unconditionally for the children**, not the school!

A nice touch from the Ofsted Inspectors is that they addressed a letter to the pupils of the school informing them about the visit, their sharing thoughts and assessment of their school and them as pupils. Rightly so, as it is also the pupils themselves who have played their part in bringing about such a glowing report. So well done kids for providing the teachers with such stunning material to work with!

As Teachers and Governors we are aware that this is a snap-shot of time and that we have to move on from here. We have been awarded this wonderful accolade; we can savour the moment but have a strategy in place to continue to improve our best practice and standards!

At the time of writing, the Spring break is drawing to a close and hopefully staff and pupils have been able to enjoy a well-earned rest and the sunshine that we have been blessed with. This coming term as ever will be action packed with School Trips, after school clubs, Sports Day and the Swimming Gala and lots of hard work.

The June edition will return to the normal pattern of news and reviews of past and future events. I would like to thank Ellen James, one of our school mums who will be taking over the editing of this column and you will be able to read her take on School Life from June onwards. I would also like to take this opportunity to thank all of you who have supported the School Report and the kind comments you have made along the way.

A new home for Modbury Tennis Club?!

In 2007 Modbury Tennis Club was able to completely resurface both courts at the Recreation Field, mainly out of the Club's savings during the 15 years since the courts were first laid. We also had some assistance from local grants and kind donations from generous club members.

And in 2008 we have further exciting plans for improving the club and its facilities! Our ambition for some years has been to have a club house where players, parents and spectators can socialise and enjoy the tennis together. Earlier this spring we were delighted to be granted planning permission to erect a small timber building overlooking the courts.

Since then MTC has been busy obtaining quotes for the levelling & preparation of the site and for extending the perimeter fence to enclose the timber building. We've raised funds towards this sum of £4500 and very soon we hope that the groundwork will begin – if you see earthworks going on next to the left-hand court, you'll know the reason why.

MTC Committee has several new fund-raising initiatives planned, including a **Safari Supper** scheduled for the Longest Day, 21 June (please note for your diaries!). But for the building itself we need to find at least another $\pounds 2,000$ which is a daunting sum to raise. Would anyone in the community consider giving MTC a donation towards the club house project? Any sum, however large or small, would be so much appreciated.


