RESULT OF BEST KEPT VILLAGE COMPETITION

We have just had the results back and we finished in the middle third, which is better than some years. The judges wrote:

“Modbury is a delightful small town..... It retains a market town atmosphere with shops selling local and home-made produce, but with an increasing number of art and design studios - possibly replacing earlier antique dealers. But for the through traffic, including many immense tractors, the main street would be a very congenial meeting place for residents.

There is clearly a very strong community spirit with an amazingly efficient Information Office staffed by volunteers, bustling Post Office/Shop displaying village notices in its window, and a beautifully maintained and active church. Both public and private buildings together with gardens and open spaces, as well as the public toilets, are very well maintained, with hardly any litter even around the recycling bins. It appears to be well planned in its more recent development with ample parking conveniently placed for the shops and for the health centre.

MODBURY MILLENNIUM MEADOW

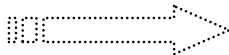

The Ministry Course at 7.30pm on Wednesdays in St. George's Church.

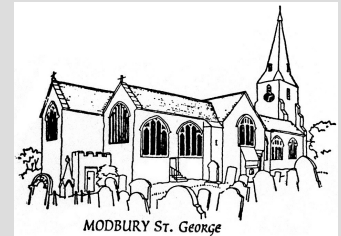

PLANNING

Modbury Parish Council recommended refusal and SHDC refused - Erection of a new dwelling at Champernowne Cottage Palm Cross Green.

SHDC advised that planning application re development west of Tuckers Brook by R Mitchell was withdrawn.

Modbury Parish Council recommended approval of installation of telecommunication equipment for Argiva Ltd at Site 13131 Davis Field, Scalders Lane.

MODBURY PARISH COUNCIL WEBSITE - EDITORS

The Parish Council are negotiating the setting up of a Parish Council Website. It is envisaged that the site will:

- Positively market the town and its facilities;
- Publish Council agendas, minutes and planning applications;
- Provide an on-line copy of the Messenger;
- Provide links to other relevant sites and local retailers;
- Summarise the town's history and have a photo gallery;
- Provide location maps, directions and local weather reports;
- Advertise and report on local activities.

site is up to date. You don't need to be an IT wizard, just have a basic familiarity with, and access to, a PC, including the use of Microsoft Word.

Full training will be given and the work should not involve more than an hour or so a week.

FOOTPATH AND FIELDS AT SWANBRIDGE MILL AND THE GAS HOUSE

The footpath through these fields is the only area where there is a legal right to walk. Dogs should **NOT** be allowed off leads and **MUST** be under control at all times.

The respective landowners have to date been very tolerant towards people and children walking dogs and playing in the meadows.

Unfortunately there have been recent incidents of dogs chasing livestock and killing poultry, abuse from children, and litter/bottles/cans left in the meadows. If this situation continues then all access to the meadows, other than on the legal footpath, will be stopped.

"The leaving of vehicles unattended, thus restricting the use of cul-de-sac turning circles, can lead to fatal consequences, and I have personally experienced this.

As part of normal planning applications, turning circles are introduced where a 'dead end' road exceeds certain lengths and are specifically required to allow Fire Brigade and Ambulances the facility to manoeuvre in an emergency.

Vehicles should therefore not be left unattended in these areas - it could be your friends and family that these emergency services are trying to assist!

".....Away from the town centre, the church has an excellent new parking area which appears to be available for general use on most days.

The church and its surrounds are meticulously maintained, and make ample provision for quiet meditation as well as providing for more physical needs with children's toys, umbrellas and wheelchairs. There is also a cleverly designed kitchen sink hidden beneath a Victorian-looking cover.

Notices of public events indicate a commendable concern with needs in developing countries, but little on more local problems. Although the alter cloth is of outstanding design, the inclusion of advertising for one specific art studio is puzzling.

Well placed at the other end of the town is the new Millennium Garden which, for a quiet rest, avoids the very steep climb to the church. Whilst still unmellowed this has been well designed alongside running water, and is close to the new development which includes affordable housing.

The outstanding Village Design Statement, beautifully presented, shows how carefully the future has been considered. Footpaths are well maintained and free of litter but the path from the top of Galpin Street leads you into an open field with no clear direction to continue, and the entrance to this path from Tucker's Brook is also unmarked. This is a matter for DCC.

Last year there were criticisms of the Chamber of Commerce notice board (still looking neglected with last year's Best Kept Village details fading slowly), the Armada seat at the Memorial Hall (20 years old this year) and the Sports Field. This last is clearly a problem, being so isolated, but there was well established litter in the gateway and as this is more for the younger generation it deserves more attention.

The Youth Centre, marked specifically on the map provided, has now gone (so I was informed at the school, which is clearly thriving) and perhaps this is another indication that the substantial effort to plan the future needs fully to consider the population to the future.

That said, I return to the introduction: ***Modbury is delightful, with a vibrant social atmosphere, active environmental concerns and an enviable future***".

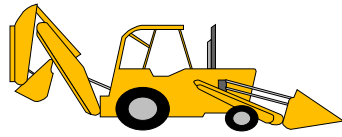

COULD MODBURY BE AN ECOTOWN?

This is the question I am exploring as a 3rd year project as part of my BSc in Environmental Hazards at Portsmouth University. I am looking at how far it is possible to turn an existing town into an eco-town and am using Modbury, my home town, as an example. An ecotown is defined as "a community offering the opportunity to achieve high standards of sustainable living, aiming at zero carbon developments and should be exemplary in one area of sustainability such as energy production".

I am studying how much energy is presently used by Modbury households, looking at ways to save energy and to produce energy locally and sustainably. To help to estimate present energy use and energy saving methods currently used in the home I have asked Modbury households to fill out a questionnaire. I would like to thank those many households who have completed the questionnaire, many of whom also added helpful comments.

If you still have a copy of the questionnaire it can still be filled in and returned to me at 37 Long Park, Modbury. I hope to be able to share the overall results of my study in a future edition of the Messenger as many Modbury residents have said they would be interested in the results of my project.

THE GREEN CORNER Green Driving



Car manufacturers have at last started to realise the importance of low fuel consumption and many modern cars now achieve around 70 mpg –

an important consideration if you live and work in a rural community like Modbury.

Whatever age the car, it's drivers who can make a real difference to motoring costs by changing their habits. I recently read an article about saving up to £1200 a year by adopting a few simple practises which you may find useful:

Moderate your driving style – accelerate gently and smoothly and anticipate braking. Pressing the accelerator pedal uses fuel, and braking wastes it.

Driving at 80 mph, (not that any of us would do such a thing) uses up to 25% more fuel than driving at 70. Use the cruise control if fitted and save 10%.

Air-cons, demisters and headlights all use power from the engine and deflated tyres cause extra drag and increase fuel consumption.

Empty the boot of unnecessary weight. Carrying around bags of cement or potting compost is not very sensible especially if you go up to Harraton Cross frequently. Coming down of course would increase the wear on the brake pads. Incidentally, a bag of golf clubs and trolley weigh a lot more than a bag of cement.

And the final tip, and one we can probably all identify with, is don't get lost! Making up lost time, driving more aggressively ("it wasn't my map-reading"), and travelling the extra miles will seriously damage your green driving experience.

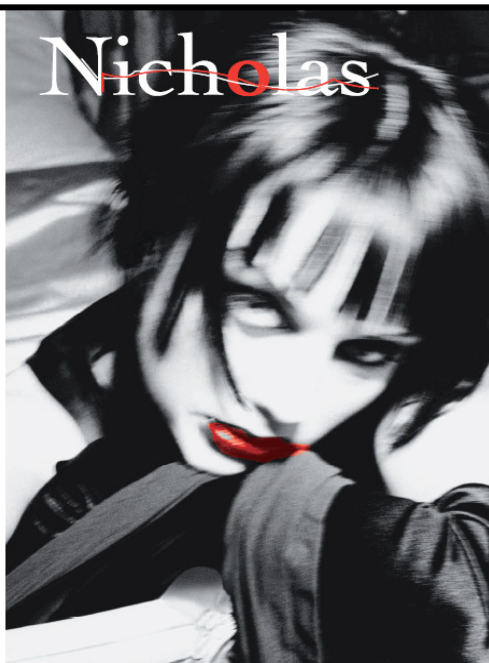

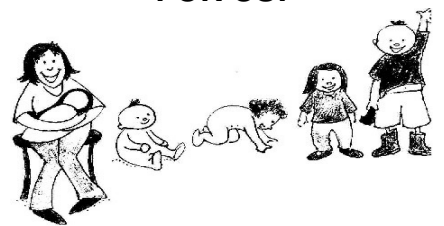
