Valentine's day is on 14th February – don't forget the date!



### POTENTIAL HOUSING DEVELOPMENT AT PALM CROSS

### **Questionnaire Feedback**

A total of 89 questionnaires were returned which is 12% of those sent contained out. Many relevant comments both for and against development of this site. The purpose of the questionnaire was to raise awareness that a planning application will be made and to get your opinions on what the Parish Council should try and get included for the community's benefit. However, as the response was so low no firm conclusions can be drawn.

Of the items listed, all - apart from a site for a new Memorial Hall - had overwhelming support. The potential of a new site for the Memorial Hall was supported by a majority (40 for, 31 against) but given the low response this cannot be said to be conclusive.

The order of priority for the other items was:-

- Traffic Limitations by the School (NB the proposals will achieve this as traffic going in the Plymouth direction from Long Park, Champernowne, Cromwell Park, etc will be directed to go on the new road through the development to Coppers Corner, thus avoiding the school and Palm Cross junctions)
- > Space for Children's Play Area
- Improvements to Parking at Palm Cross
- > Bus Stop
- > Allotments

Six people say they have a housing need now, and 19 say they will have a need in the next 5 years. Given that only one in eight returned the questionnaire this matches with the information obtained by the Parish Plan survey.

This information has been given to the architects drawing up the plans. It is expected that a public meeting will be held before the plans are finalised to give everyone the chance to comment. When the planning application is eventually submitted to South Hams Council there is a formal consultation with the Parish Council and the opportunity for objections to be made.

*Gate Cottage, Old Traine* – Renewal of Planning Consent 35/1352/02/F for extension to form living room and bedroom.

**4 Brownston Street** – Single storey extension and conversion of Coach House to provide ancillary accommodation.

Modbury Parish Council recommended refusal for:

*Memorial Hall, Back Street* – An extension to provide enlarged facilities and new accesses.

# South Hams District Council made the following decisions:

*Sexton Farm, Ermington* – New access granted. (MPC recommended approval).

*Walters Cottage* – Permission to use forecourt for vehicle parking granted. (MPC recommended approval).



### **Peerless Pupils**

Here is a piece written by the Year 6 Peer Mentors.

At Modbury Primary the Peer Mentors (Billy Jones, Finlay Andrews, Joe Berry, Mary-Kate Dolley, Tess Hemsi and Hannah Brace) are a group of year 6's who help other children who have problems with their friends. We are not called upon often, but when we are, this is what we do.

When children approach us it is important that we make them feel listened to and that they are given the opportunity to sort things out, with our guidance, in a peer mentoring session.

The Golden Rules for children who have peer mentoring include: no interrupting, no name calling and NO lying. In order that children will trust us, we must not judge them – we listen and try to help them resolve any differences or misunderstandings. Should we need support or further advice on strategies to suggest, we speak to a peer mentoring expert in school (Mrs Murrell), who trained us all and supports us brilliantly.

Mrs Strachan said: "We feel that it is really important to make sure that all children feel valued and included at our school. Our Peer Mentors take their responsibilities very seriously and work conscientiously to help make all children feel happy. Well done Peer Mentors, for all your efforts and care. You make a difference!"

### ShelterBox – help for disaster victims worldwide

**The ShelterBox Trust** is a registered UK charity that provides emergency aid for victims of natural and other disasters anywhere in the world.

Since operations began in January 2001, they have helped over 700,000 people and worked in more than 50 countries – responding to earthquakes, floods, hurricanes, tsunamis, wars, volcanoes etc.

ShelterBox was set up by the Rotary Club of Helston-Lizard and all aid is distributed from the base in Cornwall. The charity is supported by international affiliates set up by Rotary clubs in various other countries, including Australia, USA, Canada, Denmark, Germany, New Zealand, France & Switzerland.

### Shelter Box's mission

"To provide humanitarian aid worldwide in the form of shelter, warmth and comfort to people displaced by natural and other disasters."

### A unique solution

The solution to disasters is the ShelterBox – a tough, green plastic box containing a **10-person tent** and ancillary equipment designed to enable a family of up to 10 people survive for at least six months.

Made to a unique design using high quality materials, the tents are suitable for a wide range of conditions. Other items may include insulated groundsheets, thermal blankets, a multi-fuel stove, cooking equipment, tools, mosquito nets, water containers etc.

The ShelterBox volunteer teams, known as SRTs (ShelterBox Response Teams) often oversee the distribution of boxes to individual recipients – making sure aid gets direct to those people who **need it most**. SRTs consist of people from all walks of life.


ShelterBox works directly with local organisations in countries where disasters have occurred, in partnership with other aid agencies and through the international Rotary and Scouting network.

As I write this the temperature outside if 5 degrees below freezing and the forecast is not optimistic about it rising. No doubt, as you read this a few days later, it will be glorious sunshine, daffodils will be out, the first cuckoo will have been heard and people will be swimming at Wonwell.

But if you have suffered from the cold this winter now is the time to make sure you are warmer next winter, and it may not cost you anything!

A Government-funded initiative "Warm Front" is designed to make homes warmer, healthier and more energy-efficient and provides a package of insulation and heating improvements up to the value of £2,700 (or £4,000 if oil central heating is recommended). You may qualify for loft insulation, draught-proofing, cavity-wall insulation, a new hot-water-tank jacket, even a complete new heating system, new boiler or repairs. Details of those eligible are, of course, too lengthy for the Green Corner, but if you're receiving benefits such as Income Support, Council Tax Credit, Pension Credit, Job Seekers Allowance and many others, and especially if you're over 60 or have children under 16 it's worth calling the Warm Front advisers on 0800 316 2805. They are very friendly and helpful, and you can apply on the phone or visit the web-site www.warmfront.co.uk.

They also offer you a full benefit assessment to establish if you are or should be receiving any benefits that would qualify you for the Warm Front Grant. The Benefit Entitlement Check team is on freephone 0800 072 9006. So, to avoid having another Cold Front, contact Warm Front.

South Hams Mobile Library made a step into the  $21^{st}$  Century in 2008 by adopting a computer issue system. Now we can track all the books, which is a big improvement to the service. Our customers need to remember to bring their tickets each time they use the mobile library and most of them do – thank you.

We continue to offer a personal touch and can perform most of the services of a branch library because we are part of the county-wide service offered by Devon Libraries. We can't yet offer computer access on the mobile, but you can visit your local library to get a free half hour per day online.

We can get any book in print or in audio format, DVD or CD that you want and bring it to your neighbourhood for you. Popular books recently have included "The Return" by Victoria Hislop and "Friday Nights" by Joanna Trollope as well as the latest thrillers - all available on the Mobile Library. Other items may have to be ordered, like a recent request for the words and music of a Victoria Wood song for a harvest Festival presentation. Our large size picture and local history books are often borrowed by friends and partners for the housebound to reminisce.

The highlight of 2008, for me, was my nomination (by a customer's family) for the Local Government Worker of the year. This is a nationwide competition, now in its third year. It includes all Local Government employees in Great Britain, from social workers to firemen, carers to highway maintainers and, of course, librarians. A short video of the six finalists in each of the six categories was put online in May and voting continued until the awards ceremony in July. The winner in my category - Care and Commitment - was a Community Worker from Doncaster, nominated for his work in helping the flood victims in Toll Bar.

The Awards dinner at Bournemouth International Centre was amazing, involving 55 finalists and supporters and was hosted by Jeremy Vine. The highlight of my evening (and my claim to fame) was being interviewed on camera by Jeremy. I must acknowledge the help given by Kingsbridge Library staff and the Library Manager Wendy Bloomer. Their support was brilliant and over the top at times! I hope the award goes from strength to strength, as local government employees are not often recognised for doing their job. So thank you to Devon County Council and to everyone who voted


