
Father Christmas will be available to take children's letters and requests at his temporary home for the evening, which this year is the Exeter Inn.

heart"





THE DARISH DAGE

SOUTH DEVON COASTAL LOCAL ACTION GROUP (SDCLAG)

Grants from SDCLAG are available for community groups and organisations and in certain circumstances for individual businesses. SDCLAG is a community led organisation that successfully bid for £1.8 million from the Rural Development Programme for England to invest in projects that benefit the communities, economy and environment of the South Devon Coastal area (which includes Modbury).

There are four funding streams and the contacts for further information are given below.

The **main fund** is for large projects and will pay up to half the project costs, to a maximum of £100,000. Contact Cathy Heath on 01548 858805 or cathy@ruraldevon.org

An **enablement fund** will give up to £10,000 towards feasibility studies on projects that could apply to the main fund. Contact Matt Parkins on 01837 658643 or ef@ruraldevon.org

A Community Facilities Fund will grant up to £15,000 for community projects that meet the aims of SDCLAG. Again, up to half the costs can be grant aided. Contact Sophie Price on 01837 658643 or cff@ruraldevon.org

A Business Growth and Development Fund will grant up to £10,000 for businesses seeking to expand or new business start ups. Up to a third of the costs will be met. Contact Cathy Heath on 01548 858805 or cathy@ruraldevon.org

The Parish Council have asked the SHDC Civil Enforcement Officers (Traffic Wardens) to vary their hours each week and also check parking on the double yellow lines outside the Co-op and at the bottom of Brownston Street, particularly in the early evenings. So you have been warned!

HEALTH HAZARD OR NEW RESOURCE FOR THE SOUTH HAMS

Viridor, one of the UK's leading resource and waste management companies, is planning to convert the defunct New England Quarry near Westlake into a major landfill site (a tip), and a huge incinerator. It will cover about 50 acres so this is a major undertaking in our area. The site, which directly borders the River Yealm, is about 1.5 miles from Westlake along the road westward that links Westlake with the Smithaleigh to Yealmpton road. A new access road to it is proposed from the A38 at Smithaleigh and the land for this, and the site itself has already been purchased by Viridor

In Viridor's brochure it is billed as "A new Resource Recovery Centre capable of treating and turning 275,000 tonnes of residual waste a year into energy, and also producing 62,500 tonnes of recycled aggregates". In addition, the quarry itself, currently full of water, will be used as a non-hazardous landfill site for waste that is unsuitable for recycling. A visitor and education centre is also proposed on the site. Viridor is keen to hear views on this proposal.

We have an opportunity to be heard. Please let your thoughts be known.

Pat Ringrose retires just after Christmas after working at the Health Centre for more than a quarter of a century.





St George's Church, Modbury has produced a glossy, colour recipe book that captures some of the beauty and magic of Devon by feeding the senses with tantalising recipes and photographs of the South Hams and Dartmoor. Also included are lesser known facts and snippets about the local area. With an introduction by Rebecca Hosking on the 'Reasons for Seasons' and chapter headings of 'Heaven in Devon', 'Truly Scrumptious' and others like 'Simply Sublime', it highlights the splendour of Devon with its patchwork of lush green pastures, hedge banks, river valleys and stunning coastline. It also provides 'Food for Thought' that our unique climate helps to provide an abundance of food from land and sea and, as a result, there is a plethora of restaurants, pubs, shops and farmers' markets selling an amazingly wide range of



high quality, local food and produce. The recipes emphasise the incredible choice from rich cream and cheeses, prime Red Devon beef and hearty pasties through to fresh seafood and succulent fruit and vegetables. The book has over a 100 recipes from simple nibbles and appetizers like 'Goats Cheese and Honey' through to sophisticated main courses of 'Chicken Breast filled with Lobster and Crab' and scrumptious puddings such as 'Chocolate Pear Temptation' or a summer pudding topped with Dittisham plum liqueur and clotted cream. There are also some old local favourites


of 'Devonshire Squab Pie' and 'Pork Pasty with Chibbles'.

I'm dreaming of a Green Christmas Unlike the ones I used to know

This year aim to have a low carbon, eco-friendly money saving Christmas. The Modbury Community Christmas Card is a brilliant idea, and of course we'll all only be sending Christmas cards made from recycled material. Here are a few ideas for gifts that won't cost the earth, but may make the planet last a little longer.

There are lots of toys now that run off rechargeable batteries, but you can also buy a "Battery Wizard" that will re-charge ordinary throwaway batteries up to ten times, saving money, reducing waste and helping the environment. Wind-up torches with LED bulbs are an excellent alternative way of making sure you never have a flat battery as they don't have one.

Recycled glass is being used extensively now for all kinds of glassware, and I get a nice warm glow inside knowing that when I put the empty wine bottles into the bottle bank I may be drinking from them again one

How about buying seeds, pots, compost or gardening tools to encourage someone to grow their own vegetables next season? Or maybe a fruit tree in a patio tub.

If you want to be a really ethical eco person, you can make a gift of a solar panel, a goat or a chicken through various organisations including www.Oxfam.org.uk and Help the Aged's www.CowsNThings.org.uk



Once you've bought all the presents, they'll need to be wrapped in recycled paper and put under the real Christmas tree (more eco friendly than plastic), which will be decorated with eco-friendly decorations and LED lights.

And lastly - After last month's Green Corner about waste food, some of the 39.1 bananas thrown away in Modbury each day have been located, and South Hams now has one of the top recycling rates in the country -57.9%. Without the bananas Modbury could beat that!

DEVON RURAL ARCHIVE SHILSTON BARTON - OPEN EVENING

On November 19th the Devon Rural Archive held an Open Evening to promote this unique resource. Members of the History Societies in Devon had been invited to attend, in order to appreciate and experience the range of facilities and historic resources available to the public, through the Fenwick Charitable Trust, whose Patron is Lucinda Lambton. The DRA is situated in a new "Green Building" at Shilstone Barton and Sebastian Fenwick has appointed highly qualified archaeologists to undertake the research and manage the centre. There are lecture rooms, galleries and the specialist library. The Modbury History Society Heritage Panels were on display and received a great deal of attention. The Dartmoor Archive had an excellent exhibition of photographs, which are part of their collection of 7500 historic images. The event was very well attended and was one of a number of events to promote Devon's Rural History.




