The wondrous and exciting season of Christmas is soon to be with us, those of you with young children, or grandchildren, will be busy planning a lovely happy time. Here are a few suggestions of things to do which will enhance the 'spirit' of this time of year.

Babbacombe Model Village is having a Winter Wonderland Snow Spectacular from December 4th until January 3rd. Visit during the day to appreciate the full effect of the snowfall and return after dusk to see thousands of lights sparkling in the snow (admission allows re-entry). Have a look in Santa's Lapland cabin, listen to classic winter tales on the lantern lit tour, search for well-known characters in the snow scenes and of course enjoy a warming cuppa in Gulliver's café.

Dartmouth Castle has a Family Fun Trail on Saturday 4th & Sunday 5th December. Follow the clues around the castle and claim your festive treat!

South Devon AONB has something for everyone during December including Deck the Halls on 5^{th} December - where you can learn how to make natural foliage decorations. Check out the night sky in Yealmpton on the 10^{th} with an astronomer, or for the more energetic how about a walk around West Charleton or the Gara Valley on the 19^{th} .

Dartmoor National Park still has plenty to offer in its **Autumn/Winter publication** with safe, guided walks of varying lengths. Saturday 19th sees Father Christmas arrive in his pony and trap at Widecombe-in-the-Moor. On Tuesday 21st see the rare Christmas Fairies & Woodland Boggarts in the East Dartmoor National Nature Reserve.

On Saturday $11^{\text{th,}}$ Kingsbridge Celebrates Christmas with festive goings on all over the town.

THE GREEN CORNER December 2010



The new Modbury lights look fantastic this year and, despite some of them appearing to be red, blue, white and amber, they are all in fact green lights.

So green that they're saving nearly 5 kilowatts of power per hour and a ton of carbon over the season. The new LED bulbs inside them use far less electricity and turn nearly all of the power into light. The old tungsten light bulbs were very efficient at producing heat, with the light almost being a by-product.

The CFL (compact fluorescent light) bulbs that most of us have in our homes now are a huge improvement energy wise, but the future is LED and even greener. So if you think Modbury is having one of its coldest winters ever, you're right – the lights this year are producing light and not heat!




The Society made a grant to the Modbury Allotment Association for the further development of their new site.

NEW MOBILE LIBRARY SERVICE FROM JANUARY 2011



New mobile library routes and timetables will be introduced in January 2011.

The new service, which includes a Saturday morning stop in Modbury and longer stops in central locations, will enable greater access to the service for families and young children as well as allowing longer time to browse for current customers.

Services on offer will include new and regularly changed books for all ages, DVDs for hire, improved publicity and opportunities for other public services to share the mobile visits.

It does mean that some of the smaller stops are being amalgamated but anyone with a mobility problem has been offered the Home Library Service run from our branch libraries by the WRVS.

To enable the required changes to stock and vehicles to take place, the current mobile service will cease on Friday 26th November and customers will be given new timetables for the New Year as well as the opportunity to borrow plenty of books to last them through the Christmas period.

Steve Palmer, a very good, experienced Mobile Librarian will be providing the new South Hams Mobile Library Service as I shall now be retiring. I shall miss the job desperately, especially the wonderful customers, many of whom have become friends.

I have been particularly blessed by a very competent, friendly and tolerant back-up service from Kingsbridge Library. I shall miss discussing books, but I will be keeping my hand in by helping the WRVS. I will have more time to spend with my (soon to be 4) grandchildren and my dog, Hardy, apart from my other interests.



LUPRIDGE SINGERS CHRISTMAS CONCERT



It must be some 28 years ago now since Modbury hatched Lupridge Singers first joined in a celebration of Christmas music at St George's Church, Modbury, produced then by the Modbury Society, in a programme with the virtuosic recorder player Piers Adams and the Bristol University Madrigal Society; and almost every year since then Lupridge Singers have been part of, or given in their own right, a Christmas Concert in the church.

This year is no exception and on Saturday 11th December at 7.30pm they will sing again

Conductor Trefor Farrow has cleverly devised a programme that ranges from familiar carols arranged by John Rutter and David Willcocks to Mozart's wonderful Vespers written in 1780, and to an extraordinarily rhythmic Navidad Nuestra (Our Nativity) by Ariel Ramirez, written 1964, a folk drama of the Nativity based on rhythms and traditions of Hispanic America with percussion, guitar and harpsichord accompaniment. The accompanists' challenges for Ramirez' Hispanic rhythms and Mozart's orchestral intricacies transposed to piano will be more than ably met by Irina Kosogova.

MOREwoods South Hams & Plymouth



Free tree offer!

A fully-funded tree planting programme has been launched across parts of South Hams and Plymouth, offering schools, parishes and communities, as well as farmers and owners of larger areas of land, the chance to plant native trees or create broadleaf woodland.

Last winter's successful partnership campaign by the Woodland Trust and funders South Hams District Council resulted in 27 hectares (68 acres) of new native woodland planted across 18 sites in the project area.

Your community lies within the MOREwoods South Hams & Plymouth project area, therefore if you, or anyone you know, might be interested in taking part in the scheme, please get in touch. There are 3 elements to this tree planting campaign;

- Community tree packs –groups can apply for either 420 saplings for smaller areas of tree planting or 105 trees for a copse or hedgerow in local community open spaces, for example, in a playground or on unused patches of land. These packs can be separated and planted in small copses.
- Schools tree packs schools can apply for a hedge or copse pack of 30 trees for next spring, and can also get a year's free membership of the Woodland Trust's Nature Detectives award-winning Nature Club. These activities can help to qualify schools for the Trust's Green Tree Award.
- Woodland planting this scheme is aimed at landowners who wish to plant at least 1 hectare of new woodland, particularly within the vicinity of the new Langage energy centre. Schemes which deliver community benefits or link existing habitats will be a priority.

We have already had a good level of interest in the range of planting options

now available from the Woodland Trust and will help in every way we can with your planting proposals.




