
MAJOR ROAD WORKS

Time for a new start?

After Christmas festivities and New Year's Eve parties, things can seem a bit of an anticlimax. This is the time when some people suffer from Seasonal Affective Disorder and long for the sunshine, remembering the warmth of last year's holidays.

In fact, January is an ideal time for a new start. People make New Year's resolutions (and break them almost immediately)! Churches start a new financial year and, in a sense, turn over a new page.

However, too often, people are trapped in the past. Those living alone may be surrounded by past memories or locked into grief. Others have a deep feeling of failure and inadequacy, because of what has happened in the past. It's not easy, but we need to be able to put things behind us, and move on.

Great leaders are not immune from making monumental mistakes, as history shows. St Paul looked back to his days as the great opponent of Christianity, hunting down, jailing and killing the followers of Jesus. He felt that he didn't deserve to be called an apostle and fellow-worker with people like St Peter. But God changed his life on the Damascus road, and gave him the ability to be the great missionary to the non-Jewish world.


Writing to his friends, St Paul makes clear his determination to forget past mistakes (which God had forgiven), and to strain towards what lay ahead. He had a positive attitude towards life, which enabled him to leave the past behind and to move on to whatever God had in store for him.

We need from time to time to consider our goals. What are we aiming for in life? What are we going to do to achieve them? This applies collectively as well as individually. Churches and other organisations need to take stock of what they are doing, and consider how they might achieve their objectives better. For Christians, that means asking: "Am I doing what God wants?"

It may mean a change of direction or emphasis. It may well affect our relationship with others. But a New Year is a good time to look at our lives, decide where we're going and then move ahead. And with that in mind, I say "Happy New Year"!

As we all chatted, chomped and cheered each other's vegetable victories our attention was called to order by Ed Toms who set about reminding us of just what had been achieved in our inaugural year.

Firstly, on behalf of the whole group, Ed thanked Sylvia Mears for her kind contribution of the land for the allotment site. Secondly, I'm sure we all appreciate that behind every horticultural success there are weeks of "ground work" that must be done. This part of the set-up was executed with enthusiasm and professionalism by Tim Smith, Brian Weeks and Jane Bullen who, along with Graham Bennett, make up the MAA committee. The group's appreciation was shown with the presentation of some Christmas gifts as a token of thanks.

Since March 2010 the site has been cleared, boundaries tidied, entrances made accessible and secure, water supplies, taps and troughs installed, logs cut, pathways maintained, opening ceremonies conducted and celebrated, ground blessed, sheds erected, visitors welcomed, birds fed, benches placed and, most importantly of all, fruit, flower and vegetable crops produced.

Sylvia added a few words of her own to the proceedings assuring all that the allotment site was being enjoyed by her as a peaceful place to appreciate the countryside, views, bird song and progress of the plots and that thanks were due to MAA for helping provide this pleasure.

So.....into the night we dispersed heading home knowing that the ground was too hard to work for a few days but that the seed catalogues were awaiting our attention as plans were put in place for a successful, happy & "fruitful" New Year..... and, we extend this wish to you all!


