





In the end I put down "faith" – let me know if you think I should have put down something else.



DISTRICT AND PARISH COUNCIL ELECTIONS – 5^{TH} MAY 2011

Please note that all nomination papers must be returned to Follaton House by NOON on MONDAY 4TH APRIL.

PLANNING

Modbury Parish Council recommended approval and SHDC granted permission for: New Changing Facilities and Community Hall at the Recreation Ground.

DESIGNATED PUBLIC PLACES ORDER (ALCOHOL FREE ZONES)

South Hams District Council has made an Order effective from 3 March 2011 identifying places as 'designated places'. The Order allows Police Officers, Police Community Support Officers and people accredited through the Safety Accreditation Scheme to control the consumption of alcohol within a designated place. They may prohibit anyone consuming or intending to consume alcohol or they can confiscate the alcohol.

Any person who fails without reasonable cause to comply with an Officer's request may be liable to prosecution, or given a Penalty Notice for Disorder. In Modbury the Order applies to the following areas:

Upper and Lower Poundwell Car Parks, Poundwell Street, The lower part of Galpin Street, Burns Lane, Fullers Ope, Millennium Meadow, Tuckers Brook open space, SHDC open space off Galpin Street, Broad Street, Church Street, A379 Church Road, Lower part of Brownston Street encompassing public conveniences, Palm Cross Green, Palm Cross Green Car Park, New Mills Industrial Estate, Modbury Memorial Hall and environs including play area, Champernowne Play Park and entrance lane, School Playing Fields, Barracks Road corner (Parish seat), Recreation Field including Parish seat at entrance, Church car park and seated area Church Lane.

MODBURY TWINNING ASSOCIATION

For the last three years our visits to Le Faou and theirs to Modbury have not taken place due to an unfortunate dwindling of interest in our twin town in Brittany. But all is not lost, and we can now announce that we are well on the way to having a new twinning partner – Lanvéoc only 20 km from Le Faou on the northern shore of the Crozon peninsula.

In the past twelve months they have formed an association and already have 32 members. They meet every week for English lessons and other English-based activities, and four of them will be 'inspecting' us in Modbury April 9th to 11th. We will send a similar group to Lanvéoc in June. The families in Le Faou who are still keen to keep contact will join in with Lanvéoc.

If you are not already a member why not consider joining us? We hold various social events throughout the year, and every time we have visited Le Faou or received their group in Modbury for the last twenty years we have all had a great time.

MODBURY ASSOCIATION FOR RECREATION AND SPORT (MARS) 50:50 SPORTS LOTTERY DRAW

- 1. Do you want to see the town's facilities for sport and recreation improved?
- 2. Would you like to see opportunities for the provision of new sports and clubs within our community?
- 3. What can you do to help?

If you answered 'yes' to either of the first two questions then the answer to question three is very simple.

MARS has been running a monthly Sports Lottery since 1990. The aim is to raise funds to directly finance sport and recreation facilities within our town, in the shape of the Recreation Field and its continued development.

Annual membership of the lottery costs £13 per person, £1 of which is a MARS lottery membership fee and the remainder forms 12 monthly £1 subscriptions to the draw. Each month exactly 50% of the monthly subs goes towards the provision of facilities on the Recreation Field whilst the remaining 50% is split into 3 prizes. First prize receives exactly half the pot, 2^{nd} prize 30% and third prize 20%. The greater the lottery membership the greater the monthly prizes and the greater the standard of the provision on the field.

Over the last 20 years the Sports Lottery has contributed towards the provision and maintenance of two football pitches (1 Adult and 1 Junior), the provision and maintenance of two tennis courts, subsidised sports coaching courses for local people and assisted in the provision of our brand new Multi-Use Games Area (MUGA). It has assisted in the funding of the newly installed skate ramps and the addition of portable floodlighting onto the junior pitch and the MUGA. Fundraising is on track to realise a new pavilion on the field in the near future, scoping work is on-going to provide cricket and golf practice nets, there is an aspiration to add a fitness trim trail and it is hoped that the new skate facilities cannot just be sustained but enhanced in the future. Not too far ahead, MARS is keen to acquire an additional field for the provision of a summer cricket pitch and winter time football/rugby pitch.

All of these future initiatives will require funding to achieve and thereafter to maintain and sustain, otherwise all the hard work realising them will simply waste away as weather and usage takes its toll. Provided membership is high enough, the sports lottery offers a very simple and cost-effective means of realising the funds to maintain the town's current sport and recreation facilities at a good level, whilst keeping the available funds total creeping up towards the next improvement and addition.

Current membership of the Sports Lottery numbers less than 10% of our community. In an effort to boost this, the MARS committee will shortly be calling at every doorstep in the Parish in an attempt to recruit new membership.



The coronation will take place on Monday, May 2nd because this regal extravaganza always has a bank holiday attached to it.


DEDICATED FOLLOWERS OF FASHION


Jeremy answered several questions and was warmly thanked by Professor Adrian Gale who said that Jeremy had been a colleague of his at the University



Whether you are interested in Devon's fascinating heritage, the county's wonderful archaeology or the history of your town, there is bound to be

something for you coming up soon at the Devon Rural Archive near Modbury. The Archive, which was established in 2006, is set to host a series of public events starting in April on a wide range of topics. Events include a series of late morning talks and evening lectures, a training day for local historians, and days where you can meet the experts to research the history of your house.

Abi Gray, DRA's Consultant Archaeologist, said: 'We have a really busy programme of events planned for spring. From the history of churches to the archaeology of Dartmoor, there's something for everyone in our lecture programme. And because the DRA are putting on talks both morning and evening, there's bound to be a time to suit most people. The first evening lecture is on Thursday April 7th with Martin Read describing the amazing story of the wreck of *The Dutton* in Plymouth Sound in 1796. Then the first late morning talk, on Tuesday 12th April, is by well-known local historian Todd Gray who will be looking at the 'Remarkable Lives of Women in Devon'. In May we are pleased to welcome Adam Hart-Davis, well-known historian, writer and broadcaster.

In addition, our resident experts will be on hand on Thursday 7^{th} April, Thursday 12^{th} May and again on Thursday 9^{th} June to help people research their house history. If you want to take advantage of the DRA archive and archaeologist on these days, then simply pop in between 11.30am and 3pm for a free consultation.

The DRA has a lovely lecture room, modern facilities, archive space and plenty of free parking. Although we are located in a wonderful rural location, we are only 10 minutes from the A38. All our events for the coming months are now on our website and we'd ask anyone interested to book a place now so they are not disappointed'.

The evening lectures are ± 5 per person and start at 7pm. The late morning talks are ± 4 per person and start at 11am.

House History Surgeries are free. 11.30am – 3pm.

The Devon Rural Archive (DRA) was established in February 2006 by The Fenwick Charitable Trust to provide a much needed resource for local historians, archaeologists, genealogists and the general public in Devon. Currently the work of the DRA is centred on the study of the development of the Devon manor house from AD1300 to the present day.


