Every year his wife Hilda would help him to bring the exhibits to the hall and sort the flowers for him, it was always teamwork. Each year he would show up to 40 exhibits and win many cups, one of which he won thirty eight times and it was down to Hilda to keep them all clean.

He would always support all the local shows in the area and sometimes far afield, doing as many as sixteen shows a year, his enthusiasm rubbed off on many people, young and old alike. Many people will remember seeing John travelling with his wheelbarrow full of water going to his garden by the Green, where he grew his vegetables and all was kept immaculate. He also had a garden full of beautiful flowers at home; this was also kept in tip top condition with roses, dahlias, gladioli and sweet peas.

The family have decided to donate a cup in memory of John, so there will be a special class every year for the John Ellis Memorial Cup. This year the class will consist of

five Potatoes three Onions and six Runner Beans. Many people grow these types of vegetables so we hope to see plenty of entries.

There will also be another new cup this year; the family of Derrick West wish to donate a cup for Modbury Allotment holders only. The class will consist of 'My two best vegetables' (two different varieties).

There will be a Coffee Evening in aid of show funds on Wednesday 13th July 7-9pm at 18 Silverwell Park - please do come along.

TIME TO SERVE

The Government wants us to express our views on the A.V. Time was when these letters referred to the Authorised Version of the Bible, which celebrates its 400th anniversary this year, and stands unique in English literature. For many, the A.V. is still the authentic language of Christianity; for others, it is the first in a long line of translations seeking to present God's message in everyday language.

But the Government has something rather different in mind. How will we elect our politicians in future – FPTP (first past the post) or AV (alternative vote)? The referendum is on 5 May, and it certainly is not my place to comment on which way to vote!

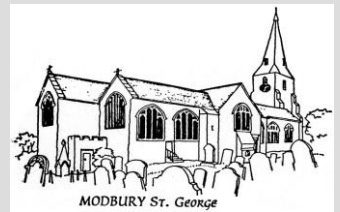
The crucial thing about any election, whether Parliament or PCC, is that those who are elected represent the whole electorate, not just those who voted for them. That means acting in the interests of all, and championing the needs of the minority. It is when people feel that their elected leaders don't care about them that trouble starts. Power has to be exercised for the common good – and certainly not for personal gain.

We elect people to serve in various capacities. Indeed, the word "minister" means "servant", and clergy are servants of Jesus Christ called to specific (and onerous!) work. Ministers of the Crown are servants of the people. ("Prime Minister" actually means "Chief Servant", although I suspect that David Cameron would rather not change the title!)

The idea of service runs right through our society from top to bottom; we rely on each other for the goods and services which we need. We may not think of it in such terms, but serving each other is fundamental to our enjoyment. For Christians, this finds its ultimate in the way we serve God, for the other side of that coin is the way God blesses us.

So whichever way we vote on 5 May, let's make sure our own lives reflect a loving concern for others, and a new willingness to serve God and our fellow men and women.

MODBURY MUSIC FESTIVAL THE 'M' FEST SUNDAY 29th MAY 2011



2011 will be the fourth consecutive year for the Modbury Music Festival and the second year that the event has been organised and hosted by the town's association for recreation and sport, otherwise known as MARS. The 2011 Festival is going to be our biggest yet, with no fewer than 17 bands performing in 11-hours of continuous great music.

This year we have some well known and established bands such as George and The Islanders, Bounce and The Penguins, some superb individual talents such as Tom Baker (back again after going down a storm in 2010) and

new to The M Fest, the wonderful Mimi McCarthy. We've got some real Modbury festival favourites, The Two Johns and Hot Diggety, some exciting new bands debuting such as 'The Escape Committee', evolving directly out of the hugely popular 'Diamond Geezers' and it is always an enormous pleasure to showcase some of our superb young local talent, with 'Obsession' back again, Tavistock's very exciting 'Ten Zero One' and Modbury's own prize winning 'Singing Sensations'.

Beyond providing an opportunity to showcase some amazing bands, both established and new, this year's festival aims to raise funds towards the town's new Sports Pavilion. This exciting project will see a new Pavilion emerge on the Festival site, that will not only support the development of sport within Modbury but also provide a much needed and long sought after facility for a community recreational facility.

For those who don't visit the Rec that often, you will see that new this year is our hugely popular Multi Use Games Area (MUGA), a not for the faint hearted skate park has been installed and emerging in a corner is a new cricket practise area, built to support our newly formed cricket club. Planning permission for the Pavilion was approved earlier this year and with fundraising approaching the last few hurdles, this all heralds an exciting couple of years for Modbury Sport and Recreation.

New this year is the exciting MFEST website. If you want to know what is happening on the day and how plans are progressing towards what promises to be a superb day out, then why not check out www.mfest.org.uk for the very latest.

Also new this year will be an opportunity to try out a few, new to Modbury, sports over the course of the day. In conjunction with Devon Active Villages, taster sessions will be running in Volleyball, Basketball and hopefully Ultimate Frisbee. If we can generate sufficient interest the plan will be to stage dedicated coaching sessions in these sports for a number of weeks following the music festival, hopefully leading to the formation of some new sports clubs within the town. These sessions will be open to all ages but what we need to get them running is some enthusiastic participation on music festival day itself.

On the subject of enthusiastic participation, we still need plenty of volunteers to help us stage the event, be this marshalling, working in the bar area or helping out with refreshments. If you are prepared to spare us 2 or 3 hours within an 11-hour musical bonanza your assistance will be enormously appreciated and is absolutely vital to a successful event.

Finally, one very simple way to make a very direct contribution to the sports pavilion is to donate a cake for us to sell on the day. THE GREEN CORNER

I read a frightening article in a magazine recently about an experimental food production unit in Holland called Plant Lab where food crops are grown in a computer-controlled environment sealed off from natural sunlight and atmosphere.

The plants "enjoy" their ideal requirements of water, light, CO₂, nutrients and temperature. There is no waste, no need for pesticides and they grow 24 hours a day, independent of the rhythm of day and night, seasons and the weather under LED and Infra-red lights, producing identical and perfectly shaped produce.

It all sounds a great way of solving the world's food supply needs, until the fuse blows or the electricity gets cut off.



Here in Devon we "enjoy" more than enough natural rainfall and sunlight to produce nice tasty, organic, naturally grown fruit and vegetables whether it is on the allotment or in a tub in the garden or on a windowsill.

Personally I get a great sense of satisfaction from harvesting the first new potatoes, picking runner beans or pulling a lettuce. And if they're not perfect in shape and have the odd slug hiding amongst the lettuce leaves, it reassures me that nature is at work.

So, now's the time to sow those beans and lettuce seeds, plant up the tomatoes and make the gardens and patios of Modbury our very own Plant Lab.

These are organised and supported events that are the life blood of the SDAONB, and are available to the community to raise the awareness of the aim to enhance the conservation the South Devon countryside.

It is rewarding to note that within the government's latest policy there is continuing support for the work of AONBs.

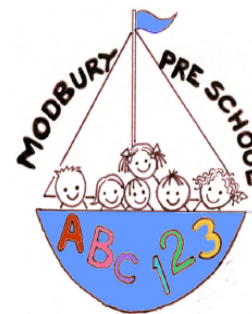
