soul? You'll find a welcome among the "saints and sinners" in any of our local churches. We are sinners who ask for God the Holy Spirit to help us.




In the centre of the month is Remembrance — when we remember those whose time was cut short so that we might have time to spend. We face the challenge of how we use that time in body mind and spirit.

TOWN SQUARE PRESENTATION AND OPEN FORUM

Wednesday 9 November 7.30pm Modbury Memorial Hall

The Parish Council invites you to discuss the concept of the creation of a new Town Square for Modbury and the Feasibility Study completed by the Halcrow Group earlier this year.

The meeting, which will be facilitated by an independent Chairperson, will include a summary of the proposals for a Town Square, the Design Scheme and presentations from interested parties. An Open Forum will follow to give everyone an opportunity to enter into a discussion and share their thoughts.

Copies of the Halcrow report are still available at the Parish Office and if you would like to see one prior to the meeting, call into the office or telephone 01548 830222. It is also on the Parish Council website: www.modburypc.co.uk.

DEFIBRILLATOR

The Parish Council has recently ordered a defibrillator which will be placed outside the Information Centre in Modbury Court. Several surrounding parishes have defibrillators and the Council would like to extend this community cover by purchasing this machine for the benefit of the town.

South West Ambulance Service has offered to train volunteers free of charge. If you would like to be trained for this important and worthwhile role, please contact the Parish Clerk in order that training classes can be arranged. Classes will be of short duration and are more of a familiarisation class than a structured course.

CONTACTING THE POLICE NON-EMERGENCY

From 5 September this year, communities across the South Hams will be able to dial 101, a new national police non-emergency telephone number; the current non emergency number 08452 777444 will be phased out.

People who are deaf, hard of hearing or speech impaired will be able to textphone 18001 101.

While 999 is a well recognised number to report emergencies, the 2010 British Crime Survey found that only 54% of the public knew which telephone number to call if they wanted to speak to their local police about policing, non urgent crime and anti-social behaviour issues. The introduction of the 101 number will help communities to keep their neighbourhoods safe by giving them one easy way

to speak directly with their local police to report and discuss all non urgent police related issues. This new number will not change the way we respond to non-urgent calls or connect people to a large national call centre. Calls will still be received by call handlers in our control rooms.

Calls to 101 will cost 15p per call, irrespective of how long that call may last. This cost applies to landlines and mobile phones. This will be the first time that everyone calling the non-emergency number will know exactly how much the call will cost and will be assured of equal access whether calling from a mobile or landline.

In an <u>emergency</u> the public will still be able to continue to call 999, such as when a crime is in progress, when there is danger to life or when violence is being used or threatened.

DISTRICT COUNCILLOR'S REPORT

Walk and Talk - Do you fancy meeting new people? Are you someone who doesn't walk or take much exercise? Or who may be convalescing and need some gentle exercise to get you back to health? Well if you answered "yes" to any of these questions then Walk and Talk may be for you. Walk and Talk is a schedule of guided gentle walks across the South Hams. Leaflets can be picked up from TICs and SHDC at Follaton House. We are testing the feasibility of setting this up in Modbury. It would be ideal for bringing people together and supporting physical and emotional well being. It could even bring in more business to the town. To establish it here in Modbury we need to get a core of local people who would be interested in attending walks. Others may fancy trying out the walks in other parts of the South Hams. Initiatives like this can only be good for the town and district so I would really appreciate your support.

It seeks to support rural communities in our county, providing information, training and support on all manner of events to aid the development of community life. This was an amazing achievement for the recently formed project against 40 entries and a long established winner. Well done to Ermington!

A pre-application meeting is where officers and the developer/agent seek to discuss a proposal prior to any formal planning application being submitted, to hopefully iron out any problems and to agree what information will be needed to form part of the formal application itself. THE GREEN CORNER

Best Kept Village Competition 2011 Not our best results!

Modbury has been entering the Best Kept Village Competition for many years and because of our population we fall into the Large Villages category. This year we have fallen from the middle band of marks to the lowest band. This band is for those with marks between 70 and 80 and we received just 71 marks. The judges, as is the way these days, so as not to dishearten anybody say some good things, but were still only able to find 71 marks for us.

What the Best Kept Village Competition does for the town is as if a 'secret shopper' was visiting the town for the first time and is giving their impressions of what they find here. They highlight what they find good and are fairly blunt about what they find not so good. If we take on board the good points and build on these and accept and work on the weaknesses it has to be to the advantage of the town as a whole. We need now more than ever to attract visitors who like us so much as a town that they return and use and enjoy what we can offer. But it is not only visitors who will benefit from keeping the town looking good, it is we the people who are lucky enough to live here who will also benefit from keeping our town at its hest.

Here is the report from the judges:

"Modbury has an abundance of beautiful, largely Georgian shops and houses on either side of Church Street. This first impression is attractive and cheerful and even more so sporting the colourful bunting which greeted us on the day of our visit. The shops in general were well-presented and there were many pots, planters and gardens in the town centre. Although many were well tended, there is potential for more care to show them at their best. The village allotments were well-cultivated and productive.

General litter levels were low except with the play area near the Memorial Hall and there was quite a lot of old litter around the car parks. There was no evidence of dog fouling. The recycling area was pleasingly tidy.

There did not seem to be many notice boards and notices advertising forthcoming events, societies, school activities, etc. although the Tourist Information Office must be a great asset.

The public toilets would benefit from further attention and care. Paper was strewn on the floor of the ladies and there was quite unpleasant graffiti in the gents.

The grass verges were well cut and care had been taken not to mow over the flowers. The Millennium Meadow was a very pleasant area and showed great initiative as did the sports field and multi games area. Clearly there is work in progress so that access may be improved and some attention given to the signs on the gates especially the lower small gate.

The church was well cared-for and the churchyard was well mown. Seats around the town could be more appealing and useful with some clearing of areas underneath and general cleaning.

The small industrial area was well-presented and there were some gardens. A little more weeding could have made them more attractive. We enjoyed our lunchtime visit to the public house and thought that it was adequate in every way. We applaud the initiative to make Modbury free of plastic carrier bags.

We were pleased to see one notice encouraging visitors to participate in the Best Kept Village.

Thank you for an interesting day spent in your lovely town."

We do now have our new notice board which arrived after the judges' visit. Let's see how much we can increase our marks next year and by doing so all help Modbury to thrive.


