Lent is a time when we look to be more like Christ, as we discover His ways for us in our Bibles and walk closer to them in our daily lives.


Some may call it 'taking up our cross', but Jesus does not speak of passive suffering, but of an active daily commitment to follow Him.

The Cross is an awesome symbol which is about giving everything up out of love. It means actively seeking to become the person God calls us to be; refusing to be caught up in the false promises and deceptive rewards of our culture, but patterning ourselves on Christ in order to be fully alive. The Christian cross is first and foremost a symbol of forgiveness and new life.

Our task this Lent, as every year, is to try to narrow the gap between the path that our lives are currently going, and the way Christ shows us to live; finding how we can best walk with Him and serve Him in the year ahead.

POLICE NOTICE

Recently whilst out on foot patrol I noticed some dog pooleft on the pathway. This is just the sort of low level antisocial behaviour that members of the public complain to the police about. Most dog owners are responsible and take great care of their dogs including clearing up after them. It is a minority however that give dog owners a bad name.

Just as bad are those individuals who go to the trouble of picking up the poo and putting it in a blue plastic bag but then toss the bag into an adjacent bush so that it hangs there like some sort of weird fruit with a half life of plutonium. This is unsightly, anti-social and, quite frankly, makes my blood boil!

So if you know of an irresponsible dog owner I would urge you to report them to Street Scene at South Hams District Council on 01803 861218. It is an offence under the Dog (Fouling of Land) Act (1996) punishable by a maximum fine of £1000 or a fixed penalty of £50.

THE GREEN CORNER

Funny stuff, water. H₂O - Two atoms of Hydrogen, 1 atom of oxygen, making up about 70% of an adult's body. Water dissolves more substances than any other liquid, so it is important to drink enough to keep nutrients flowing round the body, and tea and coffee contain caffeine which inhibits the flow. Fortunately, beer does not, and wine, which is of course made from fruit juice and can be one of your 5 a day, is mainly water anyway. No advice intended here, but what does this have to do with the Green Corner, you ask.

Walk along any of our lovely beaches or country lanes and you can pick up a fine collection of plastic water bottles. Last year 1.6 billion litres of bottled water were sold in the UK – about 33 litres per person. In the USA the figure is 67 litres per person.

According to a World Wildlife Fund report, 1.5 million tons of plastic are expended in the bottling of 89 billion litres of water each year, so no surprise that we see so many discarded bottles. Aside from all of this waste, a bottle that holds 1 litre of water requires 5 litres of water in its manufacturing process. Beyond being wasteful, this is simply not an efficient use of limited resources, so why do we buy water transported from France, Italy or the Scottish Highlands?



Bottled water is big business. Advertising suggests that bottled water is healthier than tap water, but often it is identical, and sometimes more contaminated – some claim to have organic water from land that hasn't had any chemicals on it for 20 years. They fail to mention the grazing sheep and ponies.

So is it worth 80p a litre, about 400 times the cost of tap water? In my humble opinion probably not, especially as I once read on a bottle: "This water has taken 50,000 years to filter through Alpine rocks. Best before June 2012."

The Legion gives advice on pensions, accommodation, employment and setting up business. It is essential this work continues, but since we are a membership charity it is necessary to keep the membership up. Anyone with the welfare of these people at heart should consider joining the organisation.



CHERNOBYL CHILDREN

Following the highly successful visit of 8 children from Ukraine last Easter, which marked the twenty fifth anniversary of the nuclear explosion at Chernobyl, the Totnes and South Hams link of national charity Chernobyl Children's Lifeline is hosting a group of 10 eight and nine year olds from a deprived and highly contaminated region of Belarus.

The children will be spending the month of April staying with families in the area. They all have weakened immune systems as the food they eat and the milk they drink is still contaminated by radiation and will be so for generations to come. Research has shown that four weeks of fresh air and healthy food adds as much as two years to their life expectancy.

'The children often arrive here with nothing' says link Chairman Sue Wyeth, 'sometimes not even a toothbrush or a change of underwear. The people of the South Hams have been incredibly generous during previous visits, providing clothes, fundraising and helping in countless ways to make the children's time with us an enjoyable one'.

MARS 50:50 SPORTS LOTTERY DRAW

MARS has been running a monthly Sports Lottery since 1990. The aim is to raise funds to directly finance sport and recreation facilities within our town, in the shape of the Recreation Field and its continued development.

Annual membership of the lottery costs £13 per person. £1 of which is a MARS membership fee and the remainder forms twelve monthly £1 subscriptions to the draw. Each month exactly 50% of the monthly subs go towards the provision of facilities on the Recreation Field, whilst the remaining 50% is split into 3 prizes. First prize receives exactly half of the pot, 2nd prize 30% and third prize 20%. The greater the lottery membership, the greater the monthly prizes and the greater the standard of the provision on the field.

Over the last 20 years the Sports Lottery has contributed towards the following:

- 2 football pitches (1 Adult and 1 Junior)
- 2 tennis courts
- Subsidised coaching courses for local people
- ➤ A new Multi-Use Games Area (MUGA)
- > Skate ramps and tarmac surface
- Portable floodlighting onto the junior pitch and MUGA
- Cricket practise nets

Fundraising is on track to realise a new pavilion on the field in the near future, there is an aspiration to add a fitness trim trail and picnic area and it is hoped that the new skate facilities cannot just be sustained but enhanced in the future. Not too far ahead, MARS is keen to acquire an additional field for the provision of a summer cricket pitch and winter time football/rugby pitch.

All of these future initiatives will require funding to achieve and thereafter to maintain and sustain otherwise all the hard work realising them will simply waste away as weather and usage takes its toll. Provided membership is high enough, the sports lottery offers a very simple and cost effective means of realising the funds to maintain the town's current sport and recreation facilities at a good level, whilst keeping the available funds total creeping up towards the next improvement and addition.
