
I Belong?

There were thousands of Jubilee beacons and street parties. hundreds of thousands lining the streets and hanging from every vantage point to see the Queen. and millions tuned in to watch the televised events. It was a fitting tribute to a remarkable monarch, whose sense of duty and service are acknowledged by all. Woven into it was a sense of belonging; people proud to be British, rather than slightly guilty about it. The community events brought together neighbours and strangers, united in celebrating the Diamond Jubilee.

A sense of belonging binds people together, as individuals feel that they are an integral part of society with a shared responsibility for the wellbeing of all. Celebrating what we have and enjoy should always be the spur to further improvement, both personally and collectively.

Interestingly, July marks two societies which lacked this sense of belonging. Americans celebrate their independence on 4th July and the French mark their revolution ten days later. In both, there was a gulf between the needs and aspirations of ordinary people, and the policies and actions of the governments of the day. Far from having a sense of belonging, people felt alienated and rejected a society which they felt did them no good. Not all leaders are as good as our present Queen!

People often bemoan the decline in church attendance (though many churches are actually stable or growing in numbers). Various plans are hatched to try to get people back to church; however, "church" is not about going to be entertained, but belonging to a fellowship of believers. In the Bible, the church is described as a body made up of various parts working together , with Jesus at the head. Every part is important. It's a lovely picture of belonging. The challenging question, if I have any sense of belonging, is this: what part should I be playing in the community? And if I call myself a Christian, what part should I be playing in the Church? This revised design of the crest, is based on the original Champernowne coat of Arms.

It has been designed by Nicky Burdett, to incorporate the change of the bird depicted in the crown. This is now an Ostrich, which, according to mythology, was capable of digesting iron and was often pictured with a horseshoe in its beak. This design resulted from original research by Dr Geoffrey Shears, of the Modbury History Society. The image is intended for use by any official body within the Parish, and has received Parish Council approval.

Summer has come at last and the vegetable garden is beginning to look productive – especially the rice paddy area. Each year, as every gardener knows, with success also comes failure. Every one of my tomato seeds germinated, as did about 1000 lettuce seeds and 200 curly kale. However three out of the four very expensive cucumber seeds rotted and the last one emerged to be eaten by a very hungry caterpillar. I am looking forward to a bumper crop of French Beans, however if you live the wrong side of Brownston Street there may be gardeners with a hundred cucumbers but who are completely beanless.

So what can you do with any surplus? Well, you may have noticed the GLUT stall, every other Saturday morning from 10 till midday, in the archway next to Bistro 35. The stall sells vegetables, fruit, preserves, plants etc, which are surplus to the needs of the person producing them. Anyone can supply produce and everyone selling anything is asked to donate 50p towards a community or charity project yet to be decided. You are asked to bring your produce, bagged and priced, between 9 and 10 o'clock, and you are of course welcome to donate all of the sale

The people of Great Torrington were just as enthusiastic as Modbury and with tears in my eyes I watched my son come around the corner carrying the Olympic flame. Alex passed his Dad, Paul Woodcock and his Grandma and then quickly stopped to give me a kiss it also gave the school children near us the opportunity to see the torch up close and their cheers still ring in my ears.

Alexander was selected to run with the torch after he was nominated for the care and support he has given to many people, including his younger brother, Josh, who has Autism. Along with Alex's friends, Josh has accessed activities that he would have struggled with and by encouraging him in his love of football his language difficulties have been overcome and many other social difficulties have been faced and conquered.

So a big thank you to all who wished Alex well and although it would have been lovely to have run in the town he was born in and schooled in, it was still a momentous day.



Alex continues to look after both myself, as I am very visually impaired now, and his brother. He is back at I.C.C, where he works as a teaching assistant caring for those students who have difficulties.





Modbury Heritage Project.


It is now ten years since the project was funded by the National Heritage scheme. The partners were: The Modbury History Society, St Georges Church, The Modbury Society and the Parish Council.

The main outcomes were: 1. A collection of ten display panels recording aspects of Modbury's Heritage. 2. Identifying ten Heritage sites within the Town with plagues. 3. The creation of a highly successful web site "The Unique Heritage of Modbury," This was designed and is managed by Vicky Hammerstein. This site has been accessed by people with Modbury connections from all over the world. We have a constant stream of requests for family history information which are responded to by the History Society who maintain an extensive archive of records. Recently we have had to replace the main plaque on the Bell Inn building, the site of the annual "Glove Ceremony", and we are very grateful to the Modbury Society for funding a replacement, and to Rodger Pickles, who owns the building, for mounting the plaque.
