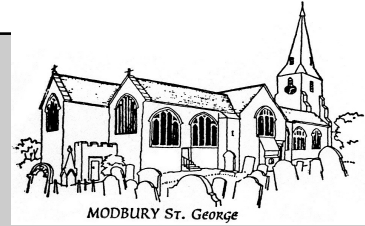

Message from Parish Clerk

- The Police have asked that parishioners be aware that people/vehicles are coming into the town asking for scrap metals etc. If you see anything suspicious or are concerned, please ring the police on 101 or 999 in an emergency.
- The Parish Council are self funding a Traffic Regulation Order (TRO). This will allow the Council to legally put down additional double yellow lines, improve safety around the school, improve the flow of traffic and assist parking etc. Before starting this expensive process, the Parish Council would like to give everyone the opportunity to look at the proposals and make comment. The provisional proposals will be available to view in the Parish Office on Mondays & Thursdays (9am to 5pm) and Saturday mornings (10am to 11am) beginning Saturday 1st September to Saturday 22nd.

South Hams Citizens Advice Bureau.

The real stories behind people on benefit.



Are you being re-assessed for Employment and Support Allowance (ESA) from incapacity benefit? Are you on time limited ESA? South Hams CAB would like to hear from you.

We can offer advice for people experiencing problems with ESA and would like to reach out to people who are accepting the decisions made on their benefits instead of seeking help.

Emma Handley, the manager at South Hams CAB, said "many seriously ill and disabled people are being wrongly denied benefits because of serious inaccuracies in an unacceptably high number of medical assessment reports used to decide who qualifies for ESA." A claim for ESA on mental health grounds, in particular is very hard for many of our clients: It can all be very confusing, especially when you are facing a tough time, it will involve making telephone calls or a claim on-line, it can be very frustrating and claimants can be given conflicting information over whether they are able to claim or appeal a decision".

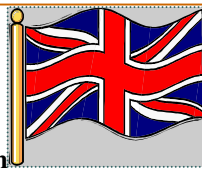
In a recent Judicial review the assessment system has been described as "pretty crude". Judgment has been reserved until a later date but it follows calls by the British Medical Association to have the 'Work Capability Assessment' scrapped on the grounds that it is causing distress to thousands of people with long-term health conditions who are being deemed fit for work.

The specialist team at South Hams CAB working under legal aid are dealing with many ESA issues.

If you are struggling because of changes to your benefit income, in particular problems with ESA, we urge you to seek help as soon as you can. VSO: I spent part of my “gap year” on the **Global Exchange VSO school leavers exchange program** working closely with local volunteers on projects in developing countries. VSO sent me to Rehoboth in Namibia with eight other English volunteers. Our work was implemented through Kayac, a Namibian organisation working towards youth empowerment, wealth creation and youth enterprise. Kayac was involved in recruiting the Namibian volunteers who we worked alongside. Rehoboth, which had once been a German colony in South West Africa, is about 5 times the size of Modbury, but located deep in the Namibian desert. I lived with two Namibian volunteers Simon and Paolo. We all lodged with Miss Sarah, who was recently widowed, and her daughter Glennis. They all opened their heart to me and we became one big family. Even though Miss Sarah and Glennis were struggling financially they opened their home to us. Like any family the three months did not pass without some bumps in the road but I can honestly say they showed me a type of generosity I had never seen before and I was heart broken to leave. In Namibia one of the problems the government is trying to address is the drop out age of school leavers and this is prevalent in Rehoboth due to large amounts of substance abuse and poverty. So as part of the programme every day, I walked with Paolo to one of the local primary schools “J.T.L.” and together we did our best to teach our allocated class. It became great fun but we had to learn very fast. At first we were told to teach “life skills”; a mixture Citizenship, R.E and Social Studies. But staff absence through sickness was common, and soon we didn't know what subjects we would be teaching from one day to the next. Maybe one day Math and the next Afrikaans (yes Afrikaans). It could be difficult trying to keep thirty 12 year old kids calm and quiet for 6 hours with no lesson plans. We didn't always succeed but I learned so much from the teachers and kids at the school, including the Namibian National Anthem which I can now recite by heart... the English National Anthem is still a work in progress. Three months is not long but in some ways it feels like a lifetime. I hope in the end I had some sort of positive impact on the school and the children. What is certain is that they had an enormous effect on me. The people we met both British and Namibian were wonderful, joyful, caring people and I could never thank them enough for looking after me so well and teaching me so much. We need more surplus to sell so please remember to bring us what you can..

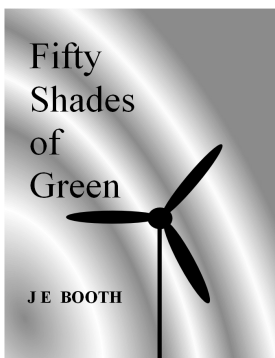

Fifty Shades of Green

'Anastasia could feel Christian close behind her as he whispered softly in her ear "Baby, you're so hot tonight". He gently turned her round and she smiled as he slowly, very slowly removed his tie. "You're pretty hot yourself" she responded. The anticipation of what was to come was electric. But then Christian's face darkened as he leant past her to read the thermostat on the wall. "Anastasia! It's set to 24 degrees! No wonder we're feeling like this. You must change your ways – I can't live with you like this.'



"Fifty Shades of Green" is a romantic love story set in the idyllic countryside around Modbury and tells how Anastasia becomes greener and greener under the masterful eye of Christian Green. Anastasia thought she was green enough because her landing light was one of those dim low energy ones, and she always used a "Bag for Life" when shopping locally for the things she'd forgotten to buy at Tesco's. Together they face the challenges of living a sustainable and satisfying life. They insulate the roof and walls with help from British Gas and South Hams District Council. Christian pays for double-glazing and draught proof doors to be fitted. He moves in and their relationship flourishes as the house becomes warmer, cosier, and more sound-proof. Later, that first winter, with the curtains drawn, low energy light bulbs in every lamp, and the wood burning stove making the gas central heating almost redundant they start to explore the more intimate, deeper and darker shades of green living.

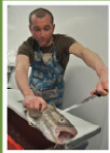

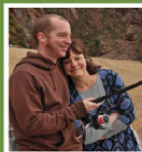

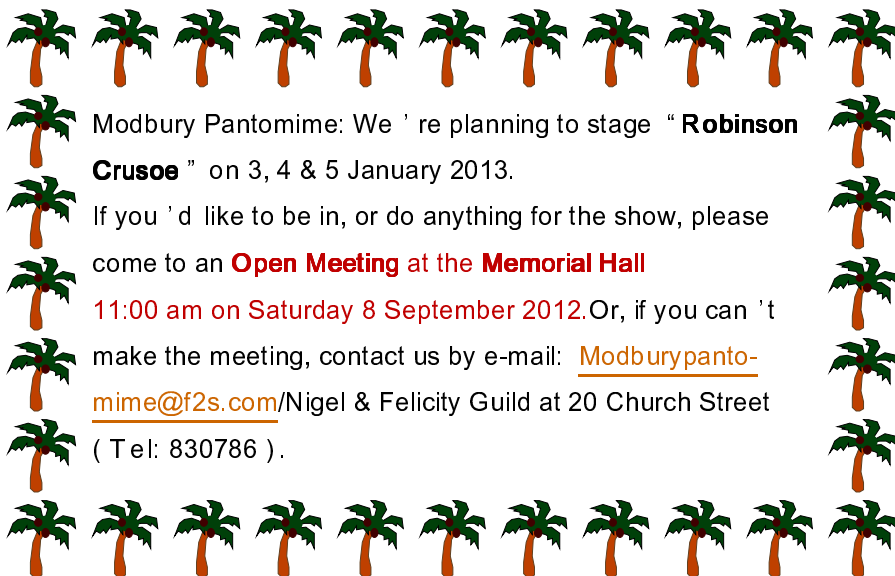
