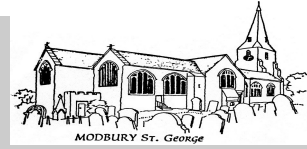
Dear Friends and Neighbours,

You will get this letter for April, this year, when the festival of Easter has passed by. The story of Easter begins with the unexpected appearance of Jesus after his death on the cross to groups of his disciples and followers, conveying the message that his death had not ended his life as his opponents had hoped. In fact that death had no more dominion over him. Here he was living in the dimension of eternal life, the life of Heaven. The life of the disciples, men and women, were completely changed by these events. Instead of a fearful frightened group of people, they became one which went out into the world to proclaim a message of love and peace, joy and goodness. So this period is called ' the great fifty days' in which the disciples were given a new insight to their calling by the risen Lord .So for us the next seven weeks are times of renewal and fresh understanding in the Church leading to Pentecost, a Hebrew festival of the first fruits of harvest. It is a preparation for the beginning of this new adventure or enterprise of bringing in the Kingdom of Heaven. In the Lord's Prayer Jesus taught his followers to say 'Thy will be done as it is in heaven'. At the end of this time Jesus no longer appeared to them. In fact they witnessed his return to heaven. But on returning to Jerusalem they discovered at the feast of Pentecost that they themselves were empowered by the Holy Spirit to carry on his work of loving God and loving their neighbours. For instance Peter and Andrew who were just fishermen became leaders of the Church, the called people who felt impelled to give their lives in service of God and others. So Christians have tried to follow this discovery of the Spirit filled life, full of hope and the power of God's love, ever since.

It has been a chequered adventure with many failures but with many successes too. Many times over the ages the risen Lord through the Holy Spirit has transformed the lives of individuals and communities.

We live in confusing times and long to find a way through the difficulties with which life presents us; for our children, ourselves, our communities and nation. We long for peace and understanding. It is my belief that the life the disciples discovered is available to each one of us and our world today. Why not lay aside your feelings of doubt and with those who do already, place your trust in the power of the God the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit and join us in our enterprise? We badly need help to bring love, joy, peace and goodness. May His joy be yours.

News from Parish Council

Flooding.

A packed meeting in February heard the Environment Agency, Devon CC and South Hams DC respond to the parish council's concerns. Unfortunately South West Water again failed to attend. Consultants have been appointed by Devon CC (the lead authority for flooding issues) to investigate what can be done and they visited Modbury and spoke with several residents and distributed questionnaires in the areas affected. Their preliminary report is expected very soon and hopefully will be available locally. Meanwhile the SHDC engineer is designing a second grille to catch debris upstream of the culvert in Burns Lane.

Palm Cross Green development.

Progress has been delayed while the land agent for the principal landowner holds discussions with several housebuilding companies. Until one is chosen there is little point in holding further public meetings as part of the Masterplanning process. However the steering group is meeting with the land agent to ensure that he and the chosen developer are aware of all the consultations done to date and the wishes of the community for this very important site.

Plastic bags.

Six years ago Modbury was a trail blazer in getting rid of plastic bags. The PC heard that there is pressure on the government to follow the Welsh example and make supermarkets charge 5p for every bag used. In Wales usage dropped by 90%. We heard that Modbury School Year 5 were writing to the Chancellor to support the charge. Well Done Year 5! **Mark Lawrence**

In Memory of Bridie Thong

Bridie Thong, the much loved retired Head teacher of Modbury Primary School, died in February after a long and painful battle with cancer. From her arrival at the school in 1998, to her retirement due to ill health in 2011, Bridie became a central part of Modbury life. She guided our children through the early stages of their lives, not only leading their academic learning, but also encouraging them to learn life skills and develop their many and various gifts and talents.

Bridie was an inspirational teacher, and in a beautiful 'Memories of Mrs Thong' assembly on 1st March, staff and children at the school reminisced on Bridie's sense of fun and her ability to include everyone - there were a few tears, but far more laughter! The 'Memories of Mrs Thong' notes written by children, staff and parents are being collected into a book which will be presented to Bridie's family. If there are any past pupils, parents or members of the wider community who would like to contribute a memory for the book these would be very welcome.

In memory of her time at Modbury, the school are holding a special art event, where children will create work that will be a permanent reminder of Bridie's love of art. This is a project instigated by Bridie herself, who did not want a retirement gift, but suggested this venture instead. Many members of the wider community have also expressed a wish to mark Mrs Thong's time at Modbury. A collection is being made with the aim of buying a flowering tree for the front playground and if possible a small group of trees to create a shaded area in the back playground. If you would like to make a contribution to this fund please hand a cheque made payable to Modbury School PTA, in an envelope marked 'Mrs Thong Fund' to the school office or Pickles. (The money will be entirely separate from PTA funds, but they are acting as bankers for the fund). The final date for handing in memories for the book or contributions is 26th April. After that a plan will be made for the tree planting to which all will be invited. **Sue Mercer.**

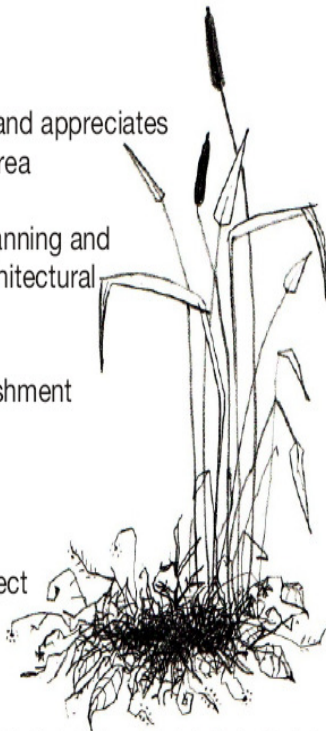

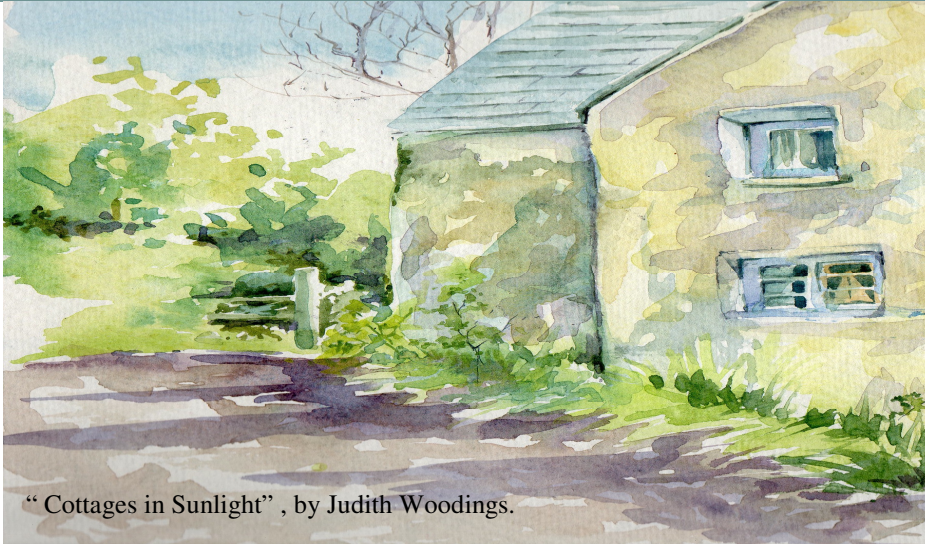

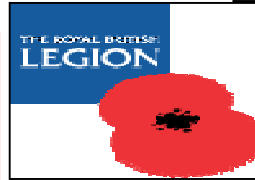
MODBURY LOCAL HISTORY SOCIETY

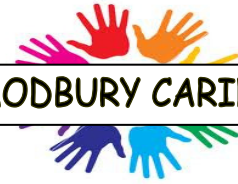

ALLOTMENTS

The Modbury Allotment Association continues to seek the provision of an additional site within our community and there is a focus to have a suitable area of land allocated for this purpose within the Palm Cross (RA1) development area in the absence of any other offers of land for the purpose. This need and aspiration has been long established with the current steering group, the acting architects, South Hams District Council, Modbury Parish Council as well as other interested bodies. 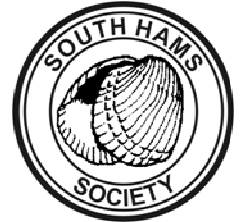

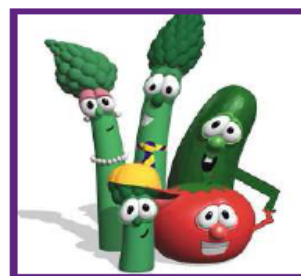

Green Corner

So - March was a lot colder than expected, but at least the ground dried up enough to be able to start preparing beds for sowing. Gardening wouldn't be the same without complaining about the weather! Later on this month we can plant bulbs of gladioli and allium and sow hardy annuals in the flower garden and borders. Camellias and magnolias may take several years to get established and bloom prolifically but it's well worth the wait and they seem to like it here in the South Hams.



In the vegetable garden, depending on the weather again, we can start sowing beetroot, carrots, spinach, onion sets, peas, and beans. French and runner beans germinate much better at warmer temperatures so starting them off in pots in a greenhouse can gain a few days start in harvesting. You can buy special long pots for starting runner beans or you can make your own tubes, about the size of a toilet roll tube by rolling up pages of the Guardian, squashing the bottoms, securing the side with a small piece of tape and filling them with a compost. One seed per tube, and when a few inches high transplant the whole tube into the ground.

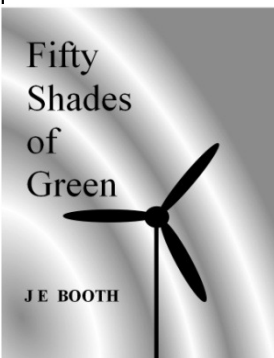
The roots can grow through the Guardian but have a problem with the Sunday Times colour supplement.
