You might have thought I had got the story by now after reading it many times and hearing it read every Sunday in church, but I keep finding the story of the people of faith in the Bible inspires and guides and challenges my ongoing faith story; and the voice of God speaks out from this book in a unique way. So I keep reading and listening.

Have you read the good book recently, or heard it read in a church near you? Get yourself engrossed in God's story and let it become part of your story.

Hands-only CPR

I am aware of a degree of confusion regarding CPR (Cardiopulmonary resuscitation), following the British Heart Foundation (BHF) media campaign introducing hands-only CPR. Individuals have indicated that they are under the impression that administering rescue breaths (kiss of life) is wrong and that it has been removed from the resuscitation cycle as it is no longer necessary.

Clarification:

It is important to understand that chest compressions with rescue breaths will continue to be part of **gold standard CPR** and will be taught during formal training, including on BHF Heartstart courses .

However, a BHF poll identified that nearly half of people are put off helping because of a **lack of knowledge about CPR**. Therefore, hands-only CPR has been introduced to encourage untrained or reticent members of the public *to do something* rather than stand back.

There are limitations to Hands-Only CPR, the main one being that hands-only CPR is effective for a limited period only (probably less than 5 min) and is not recommended as the standard management of out-of-hospital cardiac arrest (Resuscitation Council UK).

Anyone who is **trained and confident** in performing CPR should continue to follow the guidance of giving chest compressions AND rescue breaths at a ratio of 30:2.

If you're untrained, unconfident or unwilling to give rescue breaths then give, hands-only CPR a go instead - it could help save someone's life.

I intend to offer a series of short CPR courses (including training on the community public access defibrillator) to as many Modbury residents as I can.





Join Plymouth Memory Walk 2013

On Sunday 8th September 2013, hundreds will gather on Plymouth Hoe to walk for people affected by dementia.

Local residents have joined Plymouth Memory Walk and raised money for Alzheimer's Society's for a number of years. This year is expected to be the biggest year yet and we invite people from across Devon to come along.


The money raised will help Alzheimer's Society fund vital services for people with dementia and their carers, such as Singing for the Brain groups and Memory Cafés.

There are two walk routes, both start on the historic Plymouth Hoe with stunning views of Smeaton's Tower. Registration is at 10am and both walks start at 11am. There is a 2km route which will take in views of Plymouth Sound and Mount Batten. This is a gentle route, accessible for all including people with wheelchairs and pushchairs. The 10km walk is slightly more challenging. Walkers will venture out to Royal William Yard, before heading to Plymouth's beautiful Barbican.

Please note that the long walk is not accessible for wheelchairs or pushchairs. After the walks, we will come together at the Hoe for an afternoon of entertainment for all the family to enjoy.

The district council's new website has many useful pages but my favourite is called Where you live.

To find this page go to the box in the bottom right hand corner of the home page and type in your post code. A page will appear with a map of your area, your council tax banding and lots of other useful links to your address. You can order recycling sacks, report problems such as your bin collection being missed or graffiti. The page is still in development and more useful options are being looked at.

The new website allows you to transact with the council at any time of day. It is structured to allow for easy navigation and is in development all the time. Any feedback is welcome.

- 2. I want to say thank you to the businesses of Modbury who sponsored a recent competition at the council. The competition invited school children to research the work of the council and then design a collage in traditional media to show what the district council does. The purpose of the competition was to encourage young people to engage with the council, learn about council careers and to get the youngsters engaging with our website too. We are hoping to use several of the entries in our publications. The competition idea came from our youth forum a very informal group which meets two to three times a year. The generosity of Modbury business sponsorship from enabled us to buy some prizes for the winning entries. It was good fun for us all!
- 3. Analysis of our recent census shows some interesting trends. Out of an electorate of over 4000 people Erme Valley ward has 867 people living with a life limiting illness of those 360 have their daily activities limited a lot. There is an upward trend in the need for care and our ageing trends are above the national average. Similarly, there are many people living alone across the age groups. Given the population structure it is likely that these trends will continue. This data gives us all some food for thought......

Green Corner & Local Information

The Green Corner in the Garden

Although South Hams District Council collect "green" waste in the brown bins every two weeks, if you're a gardener it is like throwing away fertiliser which could be recycled and used to make your garden more colourful or productive. Home composting is a very effective way of reducing the greenhouse gas methane. You will reduce air pollution by not having bonfires and save water by reducing need to water the garden in dry spells. Plant growth increases and by replacing polluting and toxic chemical fertilisers and pesticides you will save money.



At this time of year grass cutting can be a weekly chore but if you have a compost heap or bin it can be very satisfying to know that, once composted down, you can produce a valuable product for the flower or vegetable beds. Special "Dalek" type bins made from recycled plastic can be collected from the Council's Follaton House for £12, or £14.50 delivered. Alternatively, if you can find some discarded pallets you can make your own bins – making two next to each other will allow you to fill one and then let it rot down while you are filling the next one.

Anything that has recently lived can be put in, although I personally avoid meat and fish remains but general kitchen waste, grass cuttings, wood chippings, paper, cardboard and garden waste material is suitable and should be mixed or layered if possible.

A few houses in Modbury still have a loo at the bottom of the garden - in earlier years a fine source of organic material but in these sensitive times a few chunks of stable manure or soil will start or speed up the whole natural process. If you have made a wooden pallet version it is a good idea to cover it with a piece of carpet to retain the heat and keep our Devon rain off. Wilton is best but Axminster or underlay is also perfectly acceptable! There's a link to lots of information from the South Hams website and some informative videos to watch on a dull TV evening.

We have just started pulling carrots, picking peas and eating new potatoes that owe all their wonderful flavour to last year's grass cutting compost.
