


## MODBURY MAY FAIR

We are a weather weary bunch and it has been one of those winters – the gift that keeps on giving! But at last it's getting a little warmer and we might be able to turn the heating off and head out into the Modbury streets for the Modbury May Fair. Our busy Breakfast Club 'journalists' have found some inspiring, hardworking business men and women up at the Modbury Industrial Park this month. For good cheer we've included an entertaining interview with Lady Godiva otherwise known as Les Howard. Now if that doesn't get you in the mood for the Carnival procession, nothing will!



#### Where were you born?

I was born on the Flete estate when it was a maternity hospital! I grew up in Modbury where we lived at 66 Brownston Street.

#### What did you do as a career?

At 15 years old, I was lucky to start as an apprentice in the butcher's shop and stayed there until I retired at 65.

#### Did you always work for the same owners?

When I started, I worked for Percy Rogers (Helen Pickles's father). There were three butchers in Modbury back then! We had a little van to deliver to surrounding villages such as Bigbury and Holbeton.

#### Where did the meat come from?

There was a slaughterhouse in Back Street next door to the Blacksmith's. We used to go to Plympton market on a Monday, buy two bullocks, 20 sheep and four or five pigs, take them to Back Street (very noisy on Tuesdays), and then butcher and sell the meat for the rest of the week.

#### Do you still live in Brownston Street?

We moved to Champernowne when I got my van. Of the 36 houses which were there then, there were only 3 with cars. Now I live in Long Park with my wife, Angela.

#### How do you keep busy in your retirement?

I fill my spare time now with riding, painting watercolours and walking the dog. I have an exhibition coming up in The Lime Square Gallery in July; and another in Warwickshire! I'm so proud of my family; both my children are artists.

#### What are your best memories?

To celebrate my retirement there was a party in the White Hart. It was a great night! I also helped start the Modbury Panto with Nigel Guild and I was once suspended as Tinkerbell during a play. I took part in organising the May Fair for many years and once rode through Modbury dressed as Lady Godiva!

#### Are you well travelled?

Yes - I've been to Ugborough a couple of times but my favourite place is Wonwell.

James, are you a Modbury boy? Now I am! I live here with my wife and 2 boys - Albi who's 3yrs old and is at Modbury preschool and 1 yr. old Barnaby. I grew up and went to school in Plymouth. After school, I trained in hotel management and did a stint in the Premier Inn, Plymouth.

#### So why the change in career?

I took a course in plastering and having worked a while in the trade, decided to set up my own company. Mr Builder was 'born' 7 years ago! I wanted something different from the usual building business. I decided to go with a 'young, fresh' approach, and we developed the 'Lego Man' logo.

#### What makes you proud of your business?

I try to keep it a local business. I have 7 people working with me, from Plymouth and Yealmpton and one from Modbury. I try to use local people, like Ben Hale the carpenter, Jane Derbyshire for all my insurance and we work a lot with John Sullivan of Nest Design. We also like to support local Modbury businesses - breakfasts in the Lazy Cow and we particularly like to support the Exeter Inn every Friday after work!

## What's the best and worst thing about your job?

The best is working in the beautiful areas we work in and the worst is the weather - especially recently! It's bad enough working to a schedule with our summer weather, but with winters like we've just had....well, any local will know!

## What do you feel is different about your business?

All the staff wear a blue polo shirt with the company logo on it. If someone does an excellent job, he gets to wear a shirt with a huge gold star on it. As for anyone who makes a mistake, he has to wear the shirt of shame, a bright pink shirt with 'Bill the Butcher' written on it - all day!

#### What do you like to do in your spare time?

I play football for Staverton in the South Devon League and with the very little time left, my wife and I concentrate on our boys and doing up our own house!

### Andre Daniels -Devon Furniture Maker

#### What brought you to Modbury?

My family are from Plymouth where my great granddad was the Rag & Bone man in Hooe! When I needed to expand my business I thought the South Hams could be a good place to work and I discovered the industrial estate in Modbury which had everything I needed; space to work and lots of parking for customers.

#### What brought you into carpentry?

I grew up around boats and learned to sail as a child. I loved the old wooden boats which the North Shore old boys taught me about. When I left school I went to Falmouth and trained as a Classic Wooden Boat Builder.

#### Did you then go on to build boats?

For a short time, but by then I wanted to see the world so I went to work on super yachts. I was First Mate on the super yacht Hetairos for 6 years.

#### What was life on a Super Yacht like?

Amazing! We sailed the world from the Mediterranean to the Baltic, then across the Atlantic, then the Pacific to so many places known and unknown. We also competed in the main Super Yacht races which was fantastic. It was an unbelievable few years.

#### Do you miss that time?

Sometimes, but the time was right to come home. Although when I left the sunny Caribbean and arrived in a wet, cold Glasgow I wondered if I'd made the right decision!

#### What did you do in Glasgow?

I started my furniture business but after a few years decided that if I was going to make a future with furniture making I would rather do it in Devon, so packed my bags and came home.

## On your website you say that you use only British wood, is that difficult to source?

There are only a few timber yards which deal with British wood. The problem is that some woods are not managed correctly. In the old days they were properly coppiced so there was a steady supply of wood. Now people think you should leave the trees alone but that's not so. The old saying that a tree has 200 years to live and 200 years to die is true.

#### Any other interests?

I have a falcon who is too young to be taught yet but in a few weeks we will start.

#### Favourite place in the world?

New Zealand. It has everything going for it, lots of space and open to new ideas!

## Sarah Danning - Owner/Trainer at Physically Fabulous!

#### Are you a local girl?

I was born in Noss Mayo, lived for many years in Okehampton and now live in Brixton with my husband and two children.

#### How did you get into your business?

Since my school days my passion has always been music and fitness. I played the piano, was a hurdles and athletics champion and trained as a ballet dancer from the age of 6 to 18. I was a piano teacher until 2011 when I decided to change track and trained as a personal trainer. Together with my dance experience, I now teach my Dance Fit class in Modbury on Tuesdays at 6.50pm.

#### How would you describe Dance Fit?

It's a modern day fitness class to a mixture of modern music. The great thing about it is that there is no need to be co-ordinated or good at dancing, you have to just have to keep moving and more importantly enjoy it and keep smiling!

#### What's the best thing about living here?

We're a very active/outdoor family. My husband loves to windsurf, my son cycles and my daughter is a keen unicyclist and runner. What better place offers all this on the doorstep?



#### What do you do in your spare time?

Well it may seem a bit like a busman's holiday, but I have completed three Iron Man Triathlons in South Africa, Switzerland and Wales – 2.5 mile swim, 112 mile bike ride, 26.2 mile run - all to be completed in 18 hours.

#### 50 Shades of Green Housing

Sunday morning and Anastasia and Christian were in bed, engrossed in reading the newspapers – Anastasia the property section and Christian the main news part.

"You're looking particularly radiant today" said Christian "in spite of all this bad news from the UN about global warming and carbon emissions, fuel prices rising and Russia threatening to cut off the gas to Europe. Any reason? – and why are you suddenly interested in reading the property section?"

#### Parish News & Contacts

#### Floods and sewers.

Devon CC and South West Water gave presentations on the design work they have been doing over the past year. Unfortunately DCC's bid for money from Government funds was not successful this year and they are bidding again for next year. They have developed a very complex computer model of all the water flows in and through Modbury following detailed surveys of the town. Later in the summer they are holding a drop-in session where people can verify what the model predicts in particular trouble spots.

South West Water have to upgrade the quality of the water entering the Erme estuary to comply with the EU bathing water directives by mid 2015. They have studied various options. Re-sewering the town to separate foul and surface water was not cost effective, neither was relocating the "screen" and overflow from Poundwell meadow to below Swanbridge. They are solving the problem by putting a huge holding tank under the lower car park, increasing the quality of the "screen" and upgrading the treatment works. This will cost £2.5 million and will be constructed from September to late January 2015. The effect will be to reduce the number of significant overflow events into the stream from 29 to an average of 3 in the bathing season (May till November) and 10 in an average year.

#### West of Palm Cross development site.

There is a separate item elsewhere about the recent drop-in session consultations. The parish council is very concerned that the complete site is not being developed comprehensively and that opportunities to improve highway safety may be missed.

#### Devon CC consultation on the future of the Library service.

Due to cutbacks DCC are proposing to make 28 of its 50 libraries "community" libraries, ie run by local volunteers with some help from DCC. They are also consulting on the future of the Mobile Library vans, possibly reducing the number of stops, possibly changing the organisation to "drop off" books at a particular location for collection later. The parish council is recommending things stay as they are. The consultation goes on until 10<sup>th</sup> July and details can be found on the DCC website.
