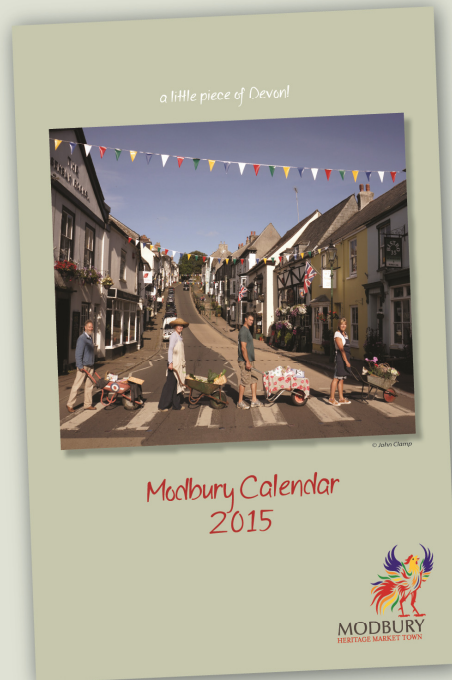

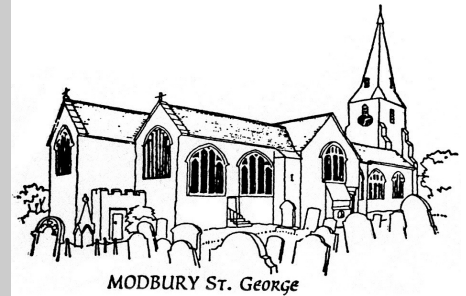

Harvest at St George's.

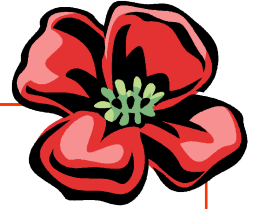

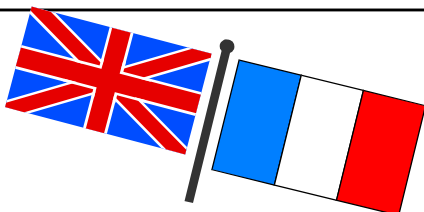

St. George's Church – Roofless in Modbury

For some 600 years, successive generations have lovingly repaired and maintained St. George's Church building – now it's our turn.

I wonder how many people reading this have at some point in their lives had an association with the church – maybe as regular churchgoers, or if not, perhaps they, or their children or even grand children have been baptized or married in it? Perhaps a loved-one lies in the Churchyard?



St. George's Church is a Grade 1 listed building, and that puts it firmly in the top 2% of all buildings in the UK; but how would you feel if the building was no more? What, if travelling back to Modbury the familiar and welcoming sight of the spire was no longer visible? It could happen!

Those looking after the fabric of the building have been aware for some time that there were problems relating to the roof; and following the recent quinquennial inspection; the church architect has now confirmed the extent of the problem – no longer can the patches be patched! Put quite simply – the roof needs replacing; along with the lead, and rainwater goods which are worn out and far too small for the amount of water that is falling onto the roof; and not forgetting to mention resolving a couple large cracks that have appeared and other essential work – all as a matter of urgency.

The costs for the work have been estimated at between £250,000 and £350,000, and the building has been placed on the English Heritage at Risk Register. The Parochial Church Council (PCC) will shortly be submitting to the Heritage Lottery Fund the first stage of a grant application towards the above costs.

But even if this is successful, the community will be expected to contribute towards the costs and as you may know, in anticipation of this, the PCC have been running fund raising events for some time. To date some £65,000 has been raised, but we now need to involve the whole community in a massive effort to push this forward so that this essential work can start as soon as possible.

St. George's church building is not just used on Sundays for a couple of hours of religious services. Did you know that in the past 12 months it has hosted evening classes and quizzes; provided countless cream teas to visitors, served suppers and dinners, been a location for young mums and children to meet, and with its brilliant acoustics and light, has held many concerts, exhibitions, workshops, and other community events?

It is an important community building, and as such, hopefully the community will pull together to repair and maintain it – this task cannot fall on just those who attend its services. So, if you have any ideas of events or for fund raising; or would like to get involved in saving the building then please do contact the Rector, myself or any member of the PCC. *Alex Hammerstein- PCC Treasurer*

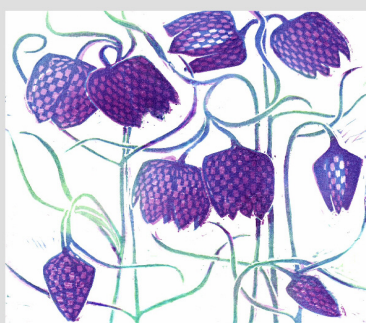

Palm Cross Green Development News

The website set up by Bloor homes can be accessed by going to www.palmcrossgreen.com/downloads, then below on Community Engagement Process Notes will be found all the most recent feedback in full detail with Event Material including photographs and drawings. The very extensive Full Report is there and for those without the stamina to read all 38 pages there is a Summary Report.

On Tuesday, 5th August the Parish Council met to discuss:

Future use of Parish Council land at Palm Cross Green.

As reported in the last Messenger the PC held a consultation event during the recent drop-in sessions run by Bloor Homes. Over 200 people attended the event and over 70 responded to the Parish Council questions.

The overwhelming majority, 68 to 5, supported the change of use of the part of the Green, currently used as a car park, to become a play area and an open space. The Parish Council have now formally recommended this; subject to at least 30 new car parking spaces being provided immediately adjacent.

On the question as to whether the Parish Council should take the ownership of the 'new' car park, again a majority favoured this, 62 to 9. The Parish Council has recommended this in principle, but subject to further negotiations as to provision of funds for future maintenance.

The minute of this meeting was agreed at the full Parish Council meeting on August 11th, 2014

Agreeing to this use of the land does not prevent the Parish Council objecting to any future planning application.

It is expected that the full planning application will be presented to SHDC during the autumn.

Parish News Continued.

Engineering works.

At the time of going to press we don't know when South West Water are planning to start their major works in the bottom half of the lower Poundwell car park. Neither do we know exactly when, or even if, Devon County Council are going to replace the pavements in Church Street and Broad Street. Both are due to start sometime in September and the SWW works will go on until next spring. As the pavement works will involve traffic lights on Church Street and removal of the free parking the Parish Council has asked SHDC to remove parking charges in the car parks during this time.

Citizen's Advice Bureau (CAB) coming to Modbury.

The CAB are starting an outreach service to Modbury for a trial period up to the end of the year. If you need to get help and advice from them they will be running a drop-in service in the parish office on Wednesday afternoons from 2-3pm. There is a poster on the notice board that explains what they can do and how to contact them. The CAB also has drop-ins in Ivybridge (Monday 10 – 12), Kingsbridge (Wed 10 – 11), Holbeton (Thursday 10 – 11) and Yealmp-ton (Thursday 1 – 2).

Their adviser writes "When you visit the drop-in our trained assessor will chat to you briefly to find out what is going on for you and decide what level of service you need. Sometimes the information you are looking for is at our finger tips and we can tell you what you need to know immediately with no further ado. Other times situations can be complex or require specialist training to advise correctly in which case we will book an appropriate follow up for you to speak to an adviser at a time and place that works for you."

Future development plans, post 2026.

As part of their "Our Plan" project South Hams have published a map showing sites around Modbury that have been suggested by their owners for development after 2026. They also have statements about their suitability or not. The Parish Council has been asked to comment by 12th September on their assessment of these sites. You can see the maps and assessments on the SHDC website at <http://www.southhams.gov.uk/siteassessment> and you can also send in your own comments via the website.

Neighbourhood Plan.

In response to the request in the last Messenger for people to help prepare a neighbourhood plan there has been some response and a meeting is being planned by our District Councillor Lindsay Ward to explain exactly what is involved. Contact her or the clerk to find out more details of the meeting

THE WAY YOU REGISTER TO VOTE HAS CHANGED

- The registration system changed on 10 June 2014. The new system is called 'Individual Electoral Registration'. Under the old system the 'head of every household' could register everyone who lived at their address. Under the new system everyone is responsible for registering themselves.
- Electors in the South Hams District Council area will be written to on 28th July 2014 telling them whether they are on the new register or whether they need to take action. Most people who are already registered to vote will be registered automatically under the new system. **They do not need to do anything.** However, some people will need to take action to join the new register which will be published on 1st December 2014.

How do I register under the new system if necessary?

1. Go to www.gov.uk/register-to-vote
2. Fill in your name, address, date of birth and a few other details. You'll also need your national insurance number, which can be found on your national insurance card, or in official paperwork such as payslips, or letters about benefits or tax credits.
3. Alternatively if you cannot go online you can ring the electoral services helpline 01803 861434 and ask for a form.
4. Look out for a confirmation to say you're registered.

Preserving the Summer

– how to freeze your garden gluts

Why not fill your freezer with home-grown produce, or stock up at the supermarket while it's plentiful and cheap! Just remember to label everything with the weight and date to save guesswork when you are ready to cook it.

Open freeze

(Blackberries, Gooseberries, Raspberries, Red & Blackcurrants)

To stop berries sticking together and freezing as a clump that is hard to defrost, it's best to open-freeze. Spread your fruit in a single layer over a tray and freeze until solid, then transfer berries to sealed food bags or containers.



Stew then freeze

(Apricots, Blueberries, Bramley Apples, Nectarines, Pears, Plums, Rhubarb)

Some fruits just can't be frozen raw and need to be cooked first. Soften chopped fruit with a splash of water. Once defrosted, use in crumbles, cakes, pies and fools.

Blanch then freeze

(Podded Broad Beans, Podded Peas, Sliced Runner Beans)

Some vegetables get watery if frozen whole and raw but blanching smaller chunks means they will freeze successfully. Just boil until almost tender, then drain, cool quickly and freeze.

Cook then freeze

(Aubergines, Cabbages, Carrots, Courgettes, Leeks, Peppers, Potatoes, Squash, Tomatoes)

Some vegetables are best frozen after they have been used in a recipe. Soups, stews, sauces, curries and pasta bakes usually freeze well.
