RAISING THE ROOF UPDATE - YES, IT'S HAPPENING!

As many of you will have known from the last update, June 2nd was decision day in respect of our Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF) grant application for help with repairs to the church roof.

After an anxious wait, I am very pleased to be able to announce that on 3rd June, we received the news we had not dared hope for - our application was successful and that our prayers were well and truly answered. Our project has been

awarded a maximum first-round pass of £250,000 by the HLF under its Grants for Places of Worship scheme. This grant includes £23,300 Development funding to help progress the project though to the delivery stage.

As a result, we have secured an amazing total of £482,000 of the funding needed and we just need £4,000 more to be fully funded.

Two things now happen, and both have already been put in motion. Firstly, by the time you read this, we will have started planning the work on the roof, developing our proposal into a ready-to-go project, getting all the tenders, permissions and logistics etc sorted. This process will take about 6 months and we hope to submit our final delivery plan to HLF in December or January. At this point, providing our final specifications and costs are in line with our original proposals, HLF will approve and give us permission to start the work, so hopefully scaffolding will start to be erected in March or April of next year and the work will be completed by the end of the summer.

At the same time, we are applying to other grant providers to try and secure the £47,000 of funding needed to undertake the repairs to the tower. If we can secure this in time, we should be able to undertake both at the same time – wouldn't that be fantastic!

Thanks to the amazing folk of Modbury, who have supported, organized, fundraised, donated and helped in so many ways – the roof **IS** being raised. Please continue to support the project - we just need one final push and we can be proud that we will have secured our heritage for future generations.



Getting to know Jane Currall - Editor of The Post

Jane was born and raised in Cambridge and her husband Duncan is from the Midlands.

How did you meet Duncan?

After school I trained as a Nurse at Addenbrookes Hospital and shared a house with friends. Duncan was working for the Cambridge Evening News and looking for somewhere to live. His mother saw an ad in The Lady for part of a house to rent, told Duncan and he moved in. It was half of my mother's house which she was renting out. He was living there for several months before I met him in my mother's front room and as they say the rest is history!

Did you move to Modbury once you were married?

No, we moved around a fair bit due to Duncan's work - Hull, then Nottingham, Essex, Swansea, Cardiff and finally Modbury in 2002. We moved so much that when we

moved here one of my sons was asked by his teacher where he lived and he replied that he didn't know!

Is it true that you studied for a University Degree since coming here.

Yes, that's true. Duncan was working at The Western Morning News and I was taking care of our three sons so I needed some stimulation. I did an Access Course even though I wasn't sure if I could do it or not. I picked Psychology as that was my main interest and English. The woman who taught English was passionate about her subject.

She totally won me over from Psychology! After the Access Course I went on to do a degree in English at Plymouth University which I loved and then a Masters in English Culture and Modernity.

Wow, what an achievement, I can now see why The Post would interest you!

Duncan and I run The Post together with Duncan doing the selling and I sit in the back room and put it together! The Post needed some new blood when we took it on as it was just 32

pages and not very exciting. When we started it was a baptism of fire!! I had no idea about layout, copy, editing, it was literally learn as you go! When I look at some of the earlier editions, I cringe because they are so dreadful! We are much more organised now. We increased to 48 pages and are now up to 64, it really steamed ahead last year.

What was your aim for The Post when you took it over?

The thing I wanted to do with it was to create a bespoke editorial/advertorial magazine with Editorial that is pertinent to the South Hams. All the editorials are free and people either write their own or I go and see them, write it and take photos. We include a lot of art and fashion and the What's On is always popular. Community events are free, people just phone in what they want included. Our monthly distributers go door to door in

Salcombe, Kingsbridge and Chillington, and boxes

go to Kingston, Aveton Gifford and Loddiswell. The rest are dropped in TICs, shops and cafes.

What are you most proud of?

I'm very proud of my children. I'm also proud of my degree, and the fact that it opened the world of English writing to me.

Do you have a favourite place that you like to go to?

Hahei Beach New Zealand. It is the most beautiful 1k long white sandy beach surrounded with amazing foliage, trees and surf. In the evenings you can see dolphins swim into the bay. It's also a boating paradise and the boats are

launched on ancient tractors as they have to get past the surf, a fantastic sight to see!

Do you have any secret talents?

When I was Nursing, working in Recovery, I did a Reflexology Course as I thought it would be beneficial to patients as a form of pain relief. I also took my Motor Bike Test at 19!

Tor was born in Bantham, went to school in Kingsbridge and her son Ben goes there now! She left in 1996 to do a Graphic Design degree in Bath.

So what brought you back?

I knew the South Hams would be a great place to bring Ben up

What did you do after you left University?

I did lots of jobs! I was a Chalet girl in

Switzerland which was great fun. Then I did a TEFL Course and went to Paris to work as a translator. Amazingly, in the centre of Paris I bumped into an old school friend from Kingsbridge and we ended up sharing a flat!

Why Paris?

My mother was born there - her father was a jockey, but once the war started they had to leave, in fact they were on the last boat across the channel before War was declared. They arrived in Wiltshire with six children all speaking French and school was hard as they spoke English mixed with French! My Dad also travelled as he lived in India working on a Tea Plantation and when they were first married they lived in Nigeria.

What did you do after Paris?

I moved to London and got a job with a watercolour artist in Sussex who ran residential courses in a fantastic Edwardian house overlooking the sea - great job and great fun. Then I worked with a Jewellery maker in Lewes, got married and moved to Scotland.

What did you do in Scotland?

Well I had my son Ben! I also joined The Society of Women Artists in Glasgow, which is an old established society of painters. It was a bit of an ordeal to join as you have to leave your portfolio for them to look at and discuss, and they don't take many people. It was great being part of the Society exhibitions several times a year in the Kelly Gallery at The Royal Glasgow Institute where if your work was good enough, you could exhibit. They were a greatly talented group of women of all ages who would host talks and serve clotted cream and stem ginger sandwiches which were fantastic!

So where next?

We moved to Devon. Ben was a toddler which made it difficult to find time to paint so I started making and selling jewellery.

Did I hear that you went back to college?

Yes, in 2010 I did an MA and then I taught in Adult Education for PCALS (Plymouth Community and Adult Learning Service) in the Swarthmore Centre. I'm also on the Committee of SHAF (South Hams Art Forum) and I teach Mixed Media in the White Hart alternate Friday mornings.

Are you still painting and making jewellery?

I'm still painting and I also have a range of 12 cards with The Almanac Gallery, London who have also commissioned some Christmas cards which is very exciting. I've designed tea towels that depict The South Hams with cliffs, sea and a boat. The boat is called Amos which was the name of my Dad's boat and it's him fishing!

If you won the lottery what would you do?

I'd buy a house by the sea in Bantham with a big studio at the top of the house and a fantastic view. As I've got extended family who live in Australia, New Zealand and America, I'd love to visit them. On the commercial side I'd like to build on what I've now started and maybe do some more painting.

Our thanks to Mrs Coulthard, Head Teacher, for her support with this project.




Modbury's Defibrillators FREE TRAINING






