If you have specific expertise to offer or an interest in contributing to any of these groups you would be very much welcomed.

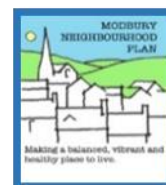

Palm Cross Green play area—Help needed for its design: The Parish Council agreed that a play area should be put onto the Green when it is landscaped by Bloor. Hopefully this will be paid for by Bloor as part of their obligations to provide a play area as part of the new development. We would like potential users (and their parents) to get involved in its design so if you, or your Mum or Dad, have any bright ideas please let us know.

This new play area will replace the one at the Memorial Hall which is now 50 years old.

Street names: More than a half of the responses for suggestions for the street names on the new development were to use the historic field names in some way. There were also a lot of requests to have one street named after our twin town of Lanveoc. As there were several field names we will pare them down to the three required and submit them to South Hams DC along with Lanveoc.

District Councillor Report

Festive Greetings - I hope that you have had a wonderful Christmas and may I wish you a happy and healthy 2016.

Play Park Project - Some really good news is that the Champernowne Play Park project has been successful in bidding for funds from the Big Green Space Challenge to assist the first phase of the project. Residents have worked together with South Hams District Council to achieve this. What we now have to do is develop a delivery plan for this first phase of this project which we aim to have implemented – all being well – by April 2016. Residents watch out for consultations on what to purchase! Thanks also to new residents who have come forward. It is great to see this project taking shape and thanks also to DCH Housing Association for their community investment time in this work

Affordable housing - I am pleased to say that today we adopted two new schemes for helping us to deliver affordable housing projects and develop our suite of delivery models to meet different needs. We have also changed an existing loan system in to a grant in order to facilitate the development of Community Land Trusts. For more information please ask.

Planning matters - I recently attended a conference on the Future of Planning and was pleased to pick up lots of new information on neighbourhood planning. I will be making the key findings and resources available to the Neighbourhood Plan group, Parish Council and residents (hopefully via the various websites or on request). We have also developed neighbourhood plan news to which you can subscribe if you let me know. Neighbouring Bigbury have been working with me to start their neighbourhood plan. Finally, I can confirm that we have agreed that to the principle of working on our Local Plan (the housing and planning element of Our Plan: South Hams) with some neighbouring authorities in South Devon - subject to satisfactory governance arrangements. I think this approach could allow us the opportunity to develop a really good strategic housing plan for the next 15 plus years and to help the spatial economy of the region whilst making the most of all our opportunities.

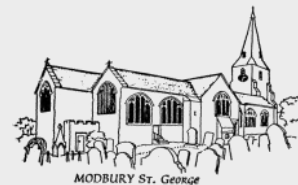

MODBURY FAIR 2015 — GREAT INVENTIONS AWARDS TO LOCAL ORGANISATIONS

A total of £1800 was awarded to 8 local organisations who submitted requests to the Modbury Fair committee.

- 1) **ST GEORGE'S CHURCH RAISING THE ROOF** – The Raise the Roof Appeal has a target of £57,000, to repair/restore the Church Roof & Clock and provide lighting. £12,500 has been raised so far, including £8000 raised through the Sponsor a Slate Appeal. £600 is required for LED flood lighting and this £600 was awarded from the Modbury Fair.
- 2) **MODBURY PRE SCHOOL** requested a contribution for software to allow teachers and parents to access children's work and monitor progress and outdoor learning trips. £120 was awarded from the Modbury Fair to purchase the software.
- 3) **MODBURY LUNCH CLUB** asked for a contribution towards kitchen equipment to help provide lunches for the elderly and £70 was awarded by the Modbury Fair Committee.
- 4) **MODBURY CHRISTMAS LIGHTS** cost approximately £1500 a year and the Modbury Fair Committee awarded £350 towards the cost of staging the lights.
- 5) **MODBURY TIDDLERS** were awarded £100 for a Christmas entertainer for the children.
- 6) **WILD FLOWER SOWING AROUND THE PARISH** - £60 was awarded towards the cost of this project.
- 7) **GARDEN OF REMEMBRANCE AT THE QUEEN ELIZABETH II RECREATION GROUND**, in conjunction with the Modbury Royal British Legion, was awarded £350 by the Modbury Fair Committee to create circular hedging and landscaping.
- 8) **MODBURY SCHOOL** was awarded £150 towards the cost of planting and equipment for an outdoor learning project.

Baobab Tree



Adansonia digitata, more commonly known as Baobab tree is an instantly recognisable figure of the African landscape. Standing proud, this species of tree is often referred to as the 'upside-down tree' because it looks as though it's been planted with its roots sticking up!

The Baobab tree is fondly referred to as 'the tree of life'

A few facts and figures...

- carbon dating indicates that the Baobab tree can live to be 3,000 years old
- the Baobab can reach the dizzy heights of 16 to 98 ft or 5 to 30 metres
- trunk diameter measures between 23 to 36 ft or 7 to 11 metres
- the vast trunk is capable of holding around 120,000 litres of water
- the trunk is smooth and shiny and pink/grey or copper coloured
- an ancient hollow Baobab tree in Zimbabwe is large enough to shelter 40 people inside the trunk
- Baobabs are deciduous, it's without leaf for much of the year
- out of the nine species of baobab tree, two are native to Africa's mainland and six are native to Madagasca (the remaining species can be found in the Arabian Peninsula and Australia)
- common names include 'boab', 'boaboa', 'bottle tree', 'the tree of life', 'upside-down tree', and 'monkey bread tree'.

Baobabs have been made good use of... as a shop, house, storage barn, bus shelter and even a prison!

The baobab has successfully created its very own ecosystem... supporting many creatures from the tiny insects which scurry around in the crevices, the birds which nest in its branches, baboons which feed on the fruit, fruit bats and bush babies take the nectar and pollinate the flowers to the larger mammals... elephants have been known to consume a whole tree!

Baobabs are very resilient... even if affected by fire and have their bark stripped off, new bark will form and the tree will continue to grow. When they die they tend to rot from inside and just collapse – all that's left are the fibres.... some people believe that they have just disappeared!

The baby Baobab tree... has a very different appearance to a mature baobab – it's the belief of the Bushmen that the tree doesn't follow the same growth pattern as other trees but instead crashes to the ground when fully grown and disappears. Perhaps that's why they're considered to be magic trees.

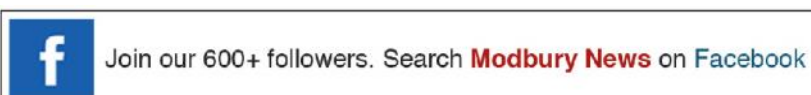
Fruit and flowers... the large whitish flowers of the baobab tree open at night. The Baobab's fruit can be roasted and ground up to make a coffee-like beverage, the fruit measures up to 12 inches or 30 cms in length.

The bark of the baobab... is used to make rope, strings for musical instruments, baskets, cloth and paper and the leaves are edible and like spinach once boiled, they are also used for medicinal purposes to treat asthma, insect bites and bladder and kidney conditions. Glue is even made from the pollen.

Did you know... in Modjadjiskloof, Limpopo in South Africa stands the Sunland 'Big Baobab' famous because it's the widest baobab tree in the world – this Big Baobab is carbon dated to be over 1 700 years old!

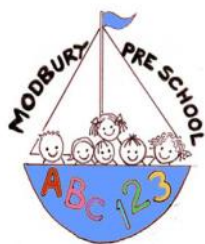

Plastics and What They are Doing to the World

The Newton & Noss Environment Group recently showed a film called **TRASHED** - a disturbing documentary about the terrible effects of waste plastic on the world. They have offered to lend the DVD to other interested individuals or groups, so as many people can see it as possible. It can be projected via a laptop onto any size screen.

We live in a hygiene-conscious, safety-obsessed, throw-away society and we use astounding amounts of plastic. Most foods are now encased in it, every screw or pencil has its little see-through box and most 'disposable' medical items are made of plastic The result is a huge tide of indestructible garbage which threatens to engulf us all – not just those faraway places in India or China where whole landscapes are transformed into plastic wastelands, picked over by scavenging livestock and people trying to scratch a living.

Metals, timber, fabrics, flesh – all eventually go back to the earth. Plastic is apparently the only substance which cannot eventually be broken down by natural processes. Burying or burning it releases dioxins and other tiny toxic particles. These persist in the air we breathe, absorbed by grazing animals and birds. Even so-called bio-degradable bags only disintegrate into smaller and smaller fragments, often ending up in the sea, ingested by everything from krill to killer whales.

At first I felt almost angry to be so starkly confronted by something which seemed too big to solve. But the film shows there are ways to deal with it. I was particularly struck by those engineers and scientists who are trying to find even better solutions. I wanted everyone, especially teenagers, to see this film, in case they too may be sparked into trying to find answers, both for the present and the future.

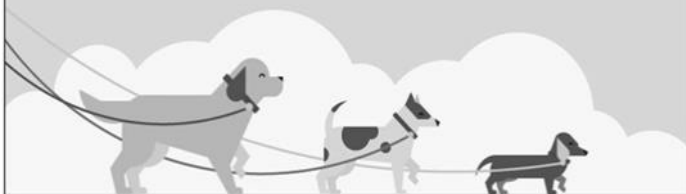

New Book for South Hams Novelist Simon Kettlewell

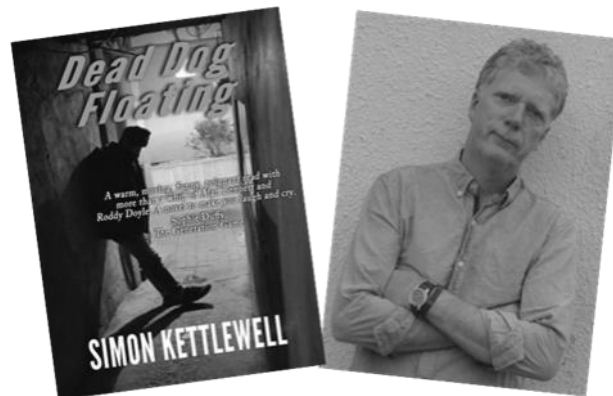
Simon Kettlewell lives near Holbeton and had his first novel, 'Bread for the Bourgeoisie' published in 2014.
