Parish Council Reports

Sustainability through Orchards, Play Spaces and Bus Stops

A chilly and wet February Council Meeting may seem an odd time and place to be contemplating apple blossom and fruit picking, but in a roundabout way the Parish Council did just that in response to a communication from the Community Orchard Initiative. In fact, Modbury already has three developing community orchards; on the Millennium Meadow, the QE2 Recreation Ground and most recently in the corner of the school playing field. The latter has been planted by Modbury School children using trees purchased from money raised by the community group GLUT through selling surpluses of their home-grown produce. Thank you all who were involved in this wonderful initiative. The possibility of a Modbury Apple Day has been floated, and the Neighbourhood Plan Environment and Sustainability Group and the Parish Council Sustainability Committee will be investigating this possibility. Contact danielturner@modburypc.co.uk if you are interested. I am already savouring thoughts of freshly squeezed apple juice and Apple Pie Bake-offs ...

Community open spaces make this sort of initiative possible. As you may be aware, the Palm Cross Green Car Park is to be landscaped to form a public play space with suitable play equipment. This will provide a muchneeded amenity for residents of the RA1 development and existing parishioners. The car parking spaces have been relocated just inside the development so this area can be traffic free. The Parish Council will be consulting the community about the play space design. If you would like to offer ideas please contact the Parish Clerk.

On the theme of sustainability the Parish Council are continuing to pursue the issue of the Palm Cross Bus Stop with our County Councillor Richard Hosking. It seems logical to us that, with the developing community at this end of town, a proper bus stop where people can safely wait and alight is a high priority. Currently we are being told that the nearest stop down in the town is sufficient being only 800m away, but in our view the steep hill and lack of pavements make this too far and unsafe for many users. A small group of Parish Councillors are working on this problem to see if solutions can be found.

Modbury Parish Budget

The Parish Council is pleased to report that it is keeping its precept, the amount that you pay towards our costs, at the same level as last year at a sum of £28,500. A Band D property will pay about £42 a year. The average of all Town and Parish councils in the South Hams is £45 a year.

About £20,000 of our costs are to run the parish council, the usual things like salary for the clerk, rent for the office, rates, phones, etc plus also insurance for all our assets and liabilities, the cost of being audited (an amazing £1,500 which we have no choice but to pay) and this year exceptionally nearly £1,000 for our share of the costs of the 2015 elections.

We spend about £1,500 a year getting the grass cut on our open spaces, including those that Devon CC is responsible for but who now only plan to cut twice a year. The large areas at Long Park, Cromwell Park and Church Lane would look very untidy very quickly if we did not provide the extra cuts and even then when the grass grows fast it is difficult to keep up!

We give grants to the Modbury Information Centre (£1,500), MARS (£1,500), the Memorial Hall (£500), Modbury Caring (£200) and the Citizen's Advice Bureau (£250) as these are all organisations that the community of Modbury uses.

The rates for the Palm Cross Green parking and garage exceed income by about £600. We have maintenance costs for the play area, the parish seats and Palm Cross Green car park for which we have budgeted £800. The Messenger now breaks even but we pay a small honorarium to the editor.

Finally this year we have agreed to pay for the refurbishment of the church clock face whilst the scaffolding is in place for the roof works.

RAISING THE ROOF UPDATE

By the time you read this update, the Project Team had hoped that

contracts for the roof work at St. George's would have been signed, sealed and delivered; and we would be announcing the date of the open meeting to explain in detail the work that is to be done to restore the building to what it should be – a Grade 1 listed building of which the town can proud.

BEST LAID PLANS

However, despite our best-laid plans to start the scaffold erection at the end of March, since December the timetable has slipped a little behind our ambitious schedule.

The tender returns need to be analyzed, and final discussions take place with the chosen contractor; and there are still some challenges regarding the scaffolding, which need to be resolved, and discussions are ongoing.

WHAT'S NEXT

We continue to push the project as fast as we are able, and hopefully we will be able to start the scaffolding about 4 weeks after contracts are signed.

District Councillor Report

The District Council Executive have agreed a new housing policy to encourage a greater percentage share of smaller properties in new developments. This would include one and two bedroomed properties and apartments. I am fully supportive of the policy and have been talking with officers about it for a while. Smaller properties allow couples and people living alone to have greater opportunity to downsize so freeing up family homes. Smaller properties tend to be more affordable and so would be more suitable for a younger market too. It should mean that the houses that do get built are more likely to meet local needs. I think this will help to bring a better balance to the housing mix in the future and may help us make use of more brownfield sites. The policy also encourages the consideration of dementia friendly communities when developing new housing.

It is budget setting time at the council but we have not had the budget setting Full Council meeting at the time of the Messenger deadline and there have been some last minute changes to proposals since the Chancellor issued a late statement — you will be able to view the budget proposals on the SHDC website (and changes) and the outcomes of the meeting. Further comment next month.

SWANBRIDGE MILL POND

The P3 Community Work Party on Sunday 24th January was a great success and we would like to thank the dozen or so people who turned up, in very reasonable weather for this winter, worked their socks off, and were rewarded with hot drinks and pasties round the bonfire.

Public Footpath

For several years there has been a problem with brambles growing from the banks of the mill pond across the narrow footpath by the mill. The problem was compounded by

the remains of an old wire fence buried in the vegetation which wrecked strimmer cords. The aim of the Work Party was to expose and remove the old wire and clear as much of the bramble as possible. This was achieved by 'pasty time', with the dramatic results shown in the photograph. (It looks even more dramatic if you walk down the path and look!). All the bramble and rubbish was burned up, on site, plus the disposal of the dead fig tree, which is sorely missed by many.

Swanbridge has a very long history and was Modbury's town mill for hundreds of years. It got its water supply from two sources. The diversion of Tucker's Brook/Cockery Cole Brook from the middle of the field beyond the car park to the present leat by the side of the footpath and also from a second leat that used to run by the side of the A379 supplied by the Ayleston Brook up by the Toll House. There is still a hole under the wall by the old slate stile and the little stone bridge that spanned the leat to take a path up to New Road. The site of the Pond is now very visible just above the mill house. The outflow, under the footpath, is still present with a trickle of water running into the old wheel pit. There is no trace left of the undershot wheel but the channel of the 'tail race' is still present by the side of Footpath 14 as it runs into the Ayleston Brook again, at the bridges by the Gas House.

The mill pond is now more visible than it has been for many years. It is an important part of Modbury's history and could be enhanced further and whilst this is beyond the remit of P3 we would nevertheless be pleased to hear from anyone who has ideas of improvement.







Do you have high fuel bills? Could changing my supplier save me money? Which renewable energy system would work best for me? If you are asking any of these questions, join PL:21 Transition Initiative on Saturday 19th March at the Watermark in Ivybridge from 10am – 1pm at the 2016 Sustainable Energy Fair.

Little ones can burn off some energy at our small soft play area, teenagers can whizz up a drink on the Smoothie Bike, and the adults can find out how to reduce their bills, and which renewable energy would work best for their property. With talks from Citizens Advice, international climate campaigners and qualified Energy Advisors there is something for everyone at the Sustainable Energy Fair.

We will also be telling people about a 4.3 MW Portworthy Solar Array near Lee Moor which is now entirely community owned and will generate enough energy for 1,300 typical homes! In January, PL:21 worked with community energy company Bath & West Community Energy to successfully raise £1.68 million, with a bond offer, to purchase the array.

The Portworthy Array project should provide an annual Community Fund in excess of £20,000 to fund projects and initiatives in the parishes closest to the array. The first payment will be received in Autumn this year, and we would love to know how you think the money should be spent.

The Sustainable Energy Fair is supported by a grant from the RegenSW Community Energy Accelerator Devon County Council Fund.

We have welcomed several new people to the NPG but more are always welcome.

Several members of the environment and sustainability group attended an event run by Regen SW which focussed on sustainable energy and provided some really inspiring examples of communities which were developing their own sustainable energy and gaining financial benefits from this. These are not just projects for large communities but can work for smaller communities like Modbury as well. There was also a great talk from the lead of Frome Town Council which talked about the many innovative projects they have started in the town and the benefits for residents and businesses. The information from the day will be posted on the website. Do have a look at it and let us know what you think.

The community services and facilities group held their first meeting at the Memorial Hall which was well attended by representatives from a range of groups. It was useful for the groups to share information and common themes quickly started to emerge. The general picture is of organisations and activities which are thriving but over time are likely to outgrow the available facilities. There were ideas about how to use what we have most efficiently and to start looking at longer term needs.


