#### MAY FAIR NEWS— 30th April—May 8, 2016

From the King of Rock to the Queen of Hearts, Modbury will be graced with a flush of royalty at this year's annual May Fair celebrations. In honour of HRH Elizabeth II 90<sup>th</sup> birthday, the theme of Kings and Queens has been selected for the town's festivities.

A grand Casino Royale Evening on Friday, 30<sup>th</sup> April, with sketches from the Modbury Players and the chance to roll the dice at the Fun Casino, launches a packed week of events.

Will fortune seekers find a princely sum of golden coins the Treasure Hunt? Will a Cavalier King Charles win the Pet Show? Who will take the crown in the Modbury Mile? Who will be the King or Queen of Pop at Modbury Goes Pop? Liz Edwards, chair of the Carnival Committee said: "We're so lucky that we still have a May Fair as so many towns and villages have stopped them. "It takes a huge amount of work behind the scenes but we have such a great community in Modbury that many people willingly give up their free time. People have come up with some really wonderful ideas this year. It's going to be really good fun" she added.

The crowning of the May Fair King and Queen will take place on Monday, 2<sup>nd</sup> May, complete with historic glove ceremony and Maypole Dancing and performances by Modbury School choir and ukulele band and a selection of hot snacks from the creperie and barbecue. It will be followed by the Modbury Mile, which this year, in keeping with the royal theme, will have a prize for the best-dressed runner.

Events throughout the week include cream teas, a pool tournament, musical jam session, a performance by Modbury Gospel Singers, a beetle drive and bingo. This year's May Fair Market promises to be even bigger and better and will be held on Saturday, 7<sup>th</sup> May. There will be stalls and barrows full of local produce and gifts, pavement art, balloon artist, Shop Window Competition, Duck Race, and a chance too see the work of the town's finest cooks in the Great Modbury Bake Off.

The carnival procession will be held in the afternoon and in the evening there's a chance to let your hair down at Modbury Goes Pop! - a fun-filled family event with quizzes, games, musical surprises and the chance to dance the night away with live music from soul/funk/ska band Dr Oz.



The Fair week closes on Sunday 8<sup>th</sup> May with the chance to take a selection of walks, guided or free range, around the town's beautiful countryside.

#### **Parish Council Report**

#### Reasons to be cheerful

At the beginning of April I went to a stimulating talk in Kingsbridge hosted by the South Hams Society and SATKA (Save the Kings Arms). The main speaker was Peter Macfadyen, who as a town councillor and ex-mayor has been closely involved with the on-going regeneration of Frome.

It was very refreshing to hear his bottom-up approach to community action. He strongly believes in demystifying local government by changing the language, dissolving committees and breaking down artificial rules that create a 'them and us' barrier. He also supports positive risk taking for community benefit. In Frome they borrowed 1.5 million to redevelop a dilapidated community hall (the increased letting fees pay the mortgage).

Peter believes that participatory democracy doesn't have to be solemn to be serious. He suggests local councils should promote and support fun in the community, taking the view that unless participation is fun, why would anyone want to do it?

Modbury is lucky enough to have a small army of fun-promoters in the shape of the May Fair committee, organisers and helpers, all of who are about to indulge us with a succession of reasons to be cheerful. And thanks to community-minded participators it doesn't stop there, with the QE2 playing field and pavilion, tennis courts, drama group, Christmas lights, barrow markets, orchards, there are endless ways to have fun in Modbury! The Neighbourhood Plan Group will be having a stall at the May Fair Saturday Market so please touch base with them on thoughts you have on the future shape of Modbury, and perhaps some new ideas for having fun?

The Parish Council is working on a plan to celebrate the Queens' 90th birthday in June - more of that in next month's Messenger. In the meantime I wish you a fun-filled May Fair Week, may you discover your inner King or Queen!






#### **Modbury Neighbourhood Plan**

The NP group is continuing to arrange meetings for information and discussion as part of the ongoing consultation process. Because housing is a significant issue for many people, we arranged a meeting in the Memorial Hall to get ideas about the kind of information you wanted. This was advertised in last month's Messenger, on the website and Facebook page. Sadly, only one person turned up. Is this because there is a lack of interest in the future provision of housing now that RA1 is going ahead? Help us out here.

- We want to know what you think/what ideas you have/how you want to get information.

Although we don't yet know what SHDC are thinking about in terms of future numbers of houses, there will be more. We need to be discussing with them what kind of housing people want and where it might be. To make discussions effective, they must represent Modbury as a whole not just a small number of residents.

Neighbourhood planning involves thinking about how we would like Modbury to develop, as a town and as a community, over the next 15 years. What are the key things which make it a good place to live? What do we want to keep as it is and what would we like to change or improve? It may be difficult to visualise what Modbury might look like in a few years' time. Here are some of the ideas of children from Modbury School:



We will have a stand at the Fair Market on May 7th. We will have information on a whole range of issues and questions we would like to get your opinion on. We will also have information packs for you to take and study at your leisure. We will also be setting up a display in one of the town centre premises so you can drop in at other times. We will advertise this when details have been finalised.

We will look forward to seeing you on May 7<sup>th</sup>.

#### **Orchards in Modbury**

Modbury has three community orchards - the Millennium Meadow, established about 15 years ago and two more recently planted orchards at the School and the QE2 site. Traditional orchards were often the centre of village life and community orchards are excellent places for people to come together to plant and cultivate local and unusual varieties of fruit trees and to use as the focal point for community activities such as Apple Days or as a green haven in which to relax and wind-down.

Orchard Link

Charles Staniland from Orchard Link recently visited us to give support and advice on their cultivation and maintenance. Below are excerpts from his report on the Millennium Meadow:

"The trees are adequately protected and staked. . . . The trees are growing well, with areas managed for wildflowers. . . . An attractive variety of habitats for insects, birds and flora."

"More attention might be made to the formative pruning. The more vigorous trees will be better pruned in the late summer. The tussocky grass growth around the smaller tree bases needs to be removed to prevent vole damage and allow firming of roots."

"The orchard is mature enough for an apple pressing and wassail which would raise its profile and encourage volunteers and local involvement."

Summary "This is a well managed and attractive site with a very committed core of organisers."

## **MODBURY FAIR WALKS Sunday 8th May 2016**

Fair Walks time has come round again - dust off the walking boots and explore parts of Modbury you haven't seen before. There are some minor changes to what is on offer this year but the start and finish are, as usual, from the Pavilion in the Q.E.II Sports Ground.

The long walk, for serious walkers, is from Modbury to the sea beyond Kingston and back (a circular route). There are shortened versions of this walk also available or just do it one way.

Two Guided Walks are offered. Firstly 'Walk and Talk' which proved popular last year. (You don't have to be a regular 'Walker and Talker'). Come and try it! Secondly, an easy 6 mile guided walk on paths, tracks and lanes to the north of Modbury.

For the young, and young at heart, we have a treasure hunt type walk with objects to spot along the way and certificates to prove that everything was found. The walk is a little longer this year but can be easily tackled by scooters, bikes, buggies and even Mums and Dads!!

Other walks are available, all self guided, but with maps and directions provided. For full details see the Fair Programme or talk to Mike or Brian (830550 or 830007).

#### RAISING THE ROOF UPDATE

We are very pleased to say that the final parts of the jigsaw are falling into place and expect that by the time you read this update, we will have received the final go-ahead from Historic & Natural England, and HLF; scaffolders will be on site and the work on restoration of the church roof will have, at long last, started. Thank you everyone for all of your support and encouragement.

The anticipated costs of the roof and tower works, including VAT are £499,549. Currently we have £486,018, so we are £13,500 short to complete all of the proposed works. We are hopeful for a further grant of £5,000 in May, which reduces the shortfall to just £8,500 and we are confident that this shortfall can be achieved during the summer.

#### **SPONSOR A SLATE**

Many of you have already sponsored a slate, and thank you for that, but if we could get a further 1,000 slates sponsored, we would achieve our goal. Every house in the town should have received a sponsorship form; more are available from the Post Office, Pickles, the TIC, Hulu and of course the church. So come on Modbury, let's see if we can get 1000 slates sponsored by the end of the summer! Slates can also be sponsored at the May Fair market, or you candonate online via www.modburyteam.org/rtr.

Every slate sponsored will be recorded in the book of dedication that will become part of the Modbury's own heritage.

#### **PRACTICALITIES**


During the work, estimated to last 22 weeks, there will necessarily be some safety restrictions around the church. The public footpath around the northern side of the church will be closed off, but the south pathway will remain open; but please take great care and stick to the designated access, there will be scaffolding in place around the whole of the building. The church will remain open as usual, and access to the new Churchyard will be available from the west end.

The contractors will be using part of the Church car park, so available space will be reduced. If you use the car park, please try to leave the spaces nearest to the pedestrian gate free for our less mobile parishioners, especially on Sundays.

Church Lane will be closed, except for access, during periods when the scaffold contractors are unloading and erecting the scaffold. Road Closed signs will be clearly displayed during these periods.
