### **District Council Report**

### Champernowne Play Park Update

As of today the Phase Two of the play park projects begins to take shape. The plants and first piece of furniture have arrived and DCH Housing Association are working with a volunteer resident of Champernowne to begin the ground work. This will take place over the next month or so. The aim is to create an attractive place where residents of all ages from across Modbury can sit and meet while children play in the park.

The funding thus far has come from \$106 money from the Langage Energy Centre as part of the Big Green Space Challenge. It was bid for by two of the residents on the six strong group. As part of this project residents have received project training from the Community Volunteer Service funded by DCH. SHDC officers have provided additional support and advice with plantings and landscaping but the main planting plan and landscaping is down to the hard work of a volunteer with support from the group.

Look out next month when details of the launch event will be provided. This will also be a consultation phase for the final stage of the project – new play equipment – but this will be a big challenge!

Unfortunately due to circumstances completely beyond our control St George's Church Family Fun Day on Saturday July 2<sup>nd</sup> has been cancelled.


There will be a Fete on Saturday August 6<sup>th</sup> in the Vicarage Gardens, or in St George's Church if wet.

### Palm Cross Green or Palmers Cross Green???

Our new housing development has been given the descriptor title Palm Cross Green; however we know that Palm Cross Green is a small island of land adjacent to the A379, and opposite the school. There appears to be some concern as to its correct description. This is an extract from an article in the London Gazette of 1803 that was brought to my attention by Brian Weeks.

Sunday 3rd

Whitehall January 8th 1803: "Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King, that about Seven O'clock of the evening of the 11th Ultimo, Daniel Barlett, supervisor of Excise, at Dartmouth, in the County of Devon, in the execution of his duty, was met by certain persons unknown driving Two Horses laden with Smuggled Goods at or near a place called *Palmers Green* in the Parish of Modbury, and that one of them dressed in a White Dress, called a Smock Frock, with a long Bludgeon or pole, knocked him off his horse and cruelly beat and wounded him, of which wounds he is since dead."

Seeking further evidence of the crime a reward of £500 was offered. This was considered a very serious event as £500 represented a huge sum back then. There is mention of **Palmers Cross Green** in the Tithe Schedules of 1841 and it is also mentioned in Henry Legassick's will of 1734, as Palmers Cross Green or **Pampers Green**. (Pompier is French for Fire Brigade so could be a link to the original fire station which used to operate from the site.)

Palm Cross Green as described in the **The Unique Heritage of Modbury** web site, was the meeting place of the **Court Leet** for a view of the Fankpledge. It being necessary for members of the Leet (Parish Council), to view, or see the Township they represented. The **Court Leet** was made up of a jury of no less than twelve persons who held a freehold within the Borough. It consisted of 2 Ale Tasters, 2 Pig Drovers, 2 Treasurers, 2 Constables, 1 Scavenger, 1 Town Crier, 1 Bailiff, The Portreeve and Deputy, plus a Toll Taker for the May Fair. The Leet was responsible for dealing with crime and misdemeanour, ranging from murder to using false weights; they met three times a year.

We are so fortunate to live in a town that has such a rich and colourful history. The local Modbury History Society has over many years recorded and researched Modbury's history, and created the web site the **Unique Heritage of Modbury** that generates many queries from around the world. **Roy Sims**

### **Community Defibrillator/First Aid Training**

A **Free** Community Public Access Defibrillator (CPAD) update and familiarisation session (including CPR) is run by South Western Ambulance Service NHS Foundation Trust (SWASFT) annually for interested people. Although the defibrillator is intended to be used without training, experience shows that people are **more confident and more effective** if they have received instruction.

This year I would like to extend the sessions to include other conditions that bystander intervention can make a significant difference to e.g. heart attack, stroke, choking etc.

The training is being sponsored by the Parish Council who have kindly agreed to meet the cost of hiring a venue. The aim of the session/s is to encourage everyone to take basic correct and vital action in the event of an emergency.

Those of us in the emergency services are often hampered by the time it takes to get to the patient and we are regularly fighting the clock, **so bystander action can make a big difference** to our chance of achieving a successful outcome.

### TEA TIME IN MAYFAIR

On 4<sup>th</sup> May, Modbury WI was pleased to host a Mayfair Afternoon Tea for Modbury Senior Residents. This was carried out by our newly - formed catering team which was complimented on the quality and presentation of the refreshments. During the afternoon the wonderful Modbury School Choir entertained us. Later there were one or two surprises when our guests were invited to spot some members in photographs of the original Modbury WI. which were shown on the overhead screen.



It is almost a year now since I began setting up our new Modbury WI. As previously noted, we finally became a fully registered WI in January 2016. We formed a Committee, and as happens in most clubs and groups it is not always an easy task, but eventually with thanks to members we were able to declare ourselves part of a very successful, and highly respected National and Regional Federation of WIs which has now entered its second century of existence. Of course, we are all very busy people, but that's the nature of it; if you want something doing, you ask a busy person!

Belonging to a WI committee is productive, rewarding and satisfying. We meet once a month and think of ways we can make WI activities enjoyable, educational and interesting for fellow members. We don't discuss war, or how to bring down the government, it's more like "how many tea bags make a nice cup of tea?"

The WI is not a political or religious organisation, but achievements by the thousands of WI members collectively in lobbying various governments over the century, on for example social matters, are very impressive. The WI aim is to improve the lives of women of every age, and naturally their families, and not to dwell on the big issues of the day, but for example, currently, choosing to lobby on issues of Appropriate Care In Hospitals for People With Dementia, Avoiding Food Waste, and Address Food Poverty. In the past, topics included 'Keep Britain Tidy', training more midwives, banishing turnstiles in toilets! These caused a great deal of distress for mothers with prams, or for wheelchair users, or children; until common sense prevailed, thanks to the pressure from our members. Once a year we hold an AGM to enable every WI to have its say. It feels good to know that we can make a difference, and at the same time, have fun, friendship and food. We are planning various outings during the summer months, as well as visiting other WI's in our region.

As I have written earlier, "You are never alone in the WI".
