The articles were written by Thierry Morvan, a food and wine journalist, whose family connections with our twinned town Lanvéoc brought him to Modbury for a week in April. Bloor Homes Palm Cross Green Development

We have been reliably informed that work on the site will begin in early July with earth moving and demolition of the bungalow. All this will be done within the site so there should be little disruption to road users.

From the end of August South West Water will be sorting out the water and drains for the site which will involve some traffic lights on Church Lane.

In September work will begin on the main access road into the site and the realignment of the A379. There will always be at least one lane open at all times, however there is bound to be a problem at times.

The first houses will be completed in the Spring. The new car park and footway across the Green will also be done early in the development.

Separately Devon Highways have told us that their proposed traffic management scheme outside the school has failed a "safety audit" and so cannot be implemented (this was a pavement and single lane "give way" system). We are discussing other options with DCC.



Parish Council Report

The parish church clock refurbishment was one of the main agenda items at the Parish Council meeting on Monday 13th June. The PCC had received 3 tenders for the refurbishment of the clock of which Smiths of Derby was the best quote at $\pounds 2738$. The Parish Council agreed to fund the project in the form of a two part grant, one of $\pounds 1100$ which had been agreed at a previous meeting and a second grant of $\pounds 1638$ to cover the full cost of the refurbishment.

On Sunday 12th June we had a cream tea at the MARS Pavilion to celebrate the Queen's 90th birthday; I hope all of you who attended enjoyed your afternoon and thank you for your support. Over 100 cream teas were sold. Councillor Lucy Brown, Vice Chair, headed a team of willing volunteers, the cream teas were sourced by Councillor Bill Cole and his wife Barbara who both worked very hard fetching and carrying all day. Bill and Barbara were representing Modbury Caring who on the day made £407 for the charity. Councillor David Rickman compiled the Queen's Quiz. Many thanks to everyone who helped in any way, not of course forgetting the cake makers and Aine Dolley who sold draw tickets and made sure everyone parted with their odd change. The winner of the Queen's Quiz was Margaret Barnet with 23 out of 30 questions correct. She has won a bottle of wine.



I would like finally to mention Councillor George Rosevear who is Vice Chairman of Bigbury Parish Council as well as being a Modbury Councillor who turned up and supported our celebration and had a cream tea knowing full well he had to do the same at Bigbury the same afternoon, the only down side was when he had to let his belt out one notch—well done George!



District Council Report

Economy Special

The district councillors have agreed that Economy must be one of top priorities for making a difference. I am working with other councillors to see how best we can deliver that given the limitations we face. As a starting point I have reviewed some data (which I hope to have refreshed and updated) and include a summary here to give you a flavour of the key points of the South Hams economy. There is much good happening in the surrounding economies and as I have said before I believe we can harness that as making the best of well as our own opportunities..... read on....

In South Hams there are....high levels of employment (second highest in Devon) BUT the majority of economically active residents are commuters to surrounding economies and local wages are the lowest in Devon. There is a strong skills base amongst those employed and there are high levels of self-employment with people working from home.

There is a low level of start ups by comparison with elsewhere but businesses survive well over the first three years – the second highest rate in Devon! And much higher than the UK average suggesting a strong and tenacious entrepreneurial culture - **we have a low UK competitiveness Index** but it is improving and there are interesting sector predictions which bode well for the future providing our digital infrastructure is secured......

The top employment sectors are currently retailing, public sector, tourism, construction and manufacturing. Note that tourism growth remains static BUT there are an increasing number of overseas visitors who tend to spend more. Globally food tourism is on the increase and nationally wellness tourism is on the increase - food is one of our key sectors and there are many microbusiness which are specialising in wellness in the mid part of the South Hams. The top employment growth South Hams are sectors for construction, information and communications, accommodation and food services, transport and storage, business and finance and other services.

Meanwhile, the top productivity growth sectors are construction, information and communications, business and finance (all higher value), accommodation and food services and distribution.

It is an interesting time with challenges but plenty of opportunity! Lindsay Ward







Rubbish Collections



SHDC have changed the system for collecting recycling and household waste from properties that do not have full size grey and brown bins. This has caused some confusion and special visits have had to be arranged to collect bags left out on the wrong dates.

The new kerbside caddy (a small brown bin) for food waste will be collected weekly. However black bags with general rubbish will be collected fortnightly on the same day as the normal grey bin collection. This is "Calendar A" on the SHDC website. July dates are the 1st, 15th, and 29th.

HELP DEVELOP SPORT & RECREATION IN MODBURY



May I take this opportunity to ask all cup holders to please return all cups to me by Sunday 24^{th} July one week before the show.





MARK LOCKHEART (SAXOPHONES/BASS CLARINET)

Saxophonist and composer Mark Lockheart first came to prominence in the mid 1980s with the influential big band *Loose Tubes*.

In 2003 Mark joined Seb Rochford's *Polar Bear*, which has recorded six groundbreaking albums. Two of the group's albums were nominated for Mercury Awards.

In 2009 Mark released his influential "In Deep" album (Edition Records). The Manchester Evening News gave it five stars and commented that it was "the key record of the second golden age of British jazz.".

In 2013 Mark's "Ellington in Anticipation" was released to critical acclaim with MOJO listing is as the best jazz album of 2013. In 2016 Mark was awarded JazzFM's Instrumentalist of the Year.

JOHN ASHTON THOMAS (KEYBOARDS)

John works as a composer, arranger, orchestrator, conductor, pianist/keyboard player and teacher in the UK and the USA.

Since 2001 he has worked in various roles on a wide range of film scores, from Robert Zemeckis's "A Christmas Carol" and "Ice Age" 2, 3 and 4 to four of the "Bourne" series, "Avengers Assemble" and the final instalment of the "Twilight" series.

He has worked as an arranger or conductor for a number of well established singers, and has composed dozens of pieces of production film, TV and concert music.

Recently John has composed pieces for the choir of Temple Church, Eclectic Voices with the Martin Speake trio, and has written arrangements for Lang Lang and Nicola Benedetti.
