Parish Council Report

The council meeting started with a minute's silence in memory of David Rickman, a Parish Councillor for over 20 years and former Chairman, who died last month.

Lindsay Ward, our District Councillor reported that a project has been initiated to tidy up the signs around the New Mills Industrial Estate. The South Hams, West Devon and Plymouth Joint Local Plan will now be presented to the District Council towards the end of January 2017 and a six week formal consultation will then follow. Our local Neighbourhood Plan questionnaire could feed into this plan.

The Neighbourhood Plan questionnaire is close to being finalised with the aim of distribution by the middle of November to every household in Modbury Parish. Everybody is encouraged to complete it as this is your chance to express your views on the future of Modbury.

Members of the Parish Council and the Neighbourhood Plan Group had a meeting with a specialist planning solicitor in Plymouth to discuss the Joint Local Plan. The main points coming from this meeting were:

- Get an expert to help write the Neighbourhod Plan
- Consult with all stakeholders,
- Accelerate the production of the Neighbourhood Plan as much as possible,
- Do not miss any opportunity to express the Modbury view point.

The police report that there were two crimes in Modbury since the last meeting, one public order offence and a theft. The matter of parking on the zig zag lines outside the Chinese takeaway was brought up during the police report. PC Ryan Hayhurst reminded people that parking on zig zags there is not just a parking offence, but an actual driving offence that can potentially attract points on a person's licence. Secondly as a polite request that they refrain from parking there as they are causing an obstruction to visibility for people crossing the road. Parking on double yellow lines is against the law under the Road Traffic Act.

The legislation quoted by PC Hayhurst states "Drove a motor vehicle, and failed to comply with the indication given by a traffic sign specified as subject to obligatory endorsement in Schedule 2 to the Road Traffic Offenders Act 1988, namely zigzag lines at a Zebra crossing lawfully placed on or near a road, Contrary to section 36(1) of the Road Traffic Act 1988, the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016 and Schedule 2 to the Road Traffic Offenders Act 1988." Failing to comply with this **could** result in a fine, points on the driver's licence and/or an awareness course which is paid for by the driver.

District Council Report

The Draft Joint Local Plan will now be presented to councillors and the public on Thursday 26th January, 2017 at Full Council. Please continue to contact me with any views on this matter via Cllr.LWard@southhams.gov.uk OR 831078. The regulation statutory 6 week consultation on the Joint Local Plan proposals will follow beginning on 6th February. This consultation will provide the public with the opportunity to comment on the housing and employment land proposals across the district and in Modbury. While the inspector of the JLP will have access to earlier consultation comments this will be the consultation that he or she will focus on.

Further to the report for the last Messenger, the meeting I had arranged with representatives from the parish council and its Neighbourhood Plan Group and South Hams District Council lead strategic planner has now taken place. Notes from this meeting are available from the parish council. Much work has continued since this meeting and you can follow this via the parish council and neighbourhood plan minutes. The intention is for the NP process to suggest alternative sites reflecting the views of the community thus far.

Three planning applications were considered and all passed.

It was suggested that there should be a Modbury cleaning day to help tidy up the town which will be considered at the next Council meeting.

There is a Community Reinvestment Projects fund available from SHDC and the council is investigating the money available and projects that it may be used on. One suggestion being the bus stop at the top of Modbury by the RA1 development. Another the improvement of play areas in the town.





David Rickman (1963-2016)

Thanks from Modbury

On 15th September David Rickman, one of our Modbury Parish Councillors, died at the age of 52 after a year long illness. David had been a Parish Councillor since 1998 and was voted into the Chair of the Council in 2002, serving two terms as Chair until 2010, remaining an active member of the Council up until the final few weeks of his life. David was the council's sage, bringing wisdom and knowledge to the newer members of the Council.

David was very good at letting people have their say, or to let off steam in some instances, before quietly but with authority, summarising and dealing with the issue at hand before succinctly suggesting a solution. David would give of his time and support councillors, both established and new, and would often keep the duty councillor company of a Saturday morning in the Parish Office, quite often being their only visitor.


David brought his wicked sense of humour to public events such as the May Fair Glove Ceremony when, as Chair of the Parish Council he was expected to climb the ladder to place the ceremonial glove in place in Broad Street. He always dressed for the occasion, one year dressed as a leotarded Fred Flintstone, one year as Paula Radcliffe in lycra running shorts, complete with toilet paper hanging from the shorts after her famous "toilet stop" marathon.

David was born in Brownston Street, to a farming family, and was often seen tramping up Back Street to Modbury Primary School in his wellies to which he was very attached. Many Modbury people have fond memories of David even playing football in his wellies. After leaving Modbury School David attended lvybridge Community College before becoming apprenticed as a carpenter and joiner to local builder Richard Mitchell. Later David started his own business and many properties in Modbury and the surrounding villages have examples of David's wonderful craftsmanship. If you ever sit on one of the benches around Modbury parish, there is a strong likelihood that it is one that David's skill had helped restore.

David was a great sportsman, playing football at Modbury Rovers and badminton at Modbury Badminton Club where he met his future wife, Jane. He played golf at Bigbury Golf Club where many golf trophies bear his name, both as an individual and in partnership with Jane.

Jane and David were married in St George's Church Modbury in 1987 and their daughters, Sarah and Lynda were born in the following years. David was very proud of his family and was delighted to see his daughter Sarah married last year to Alastair Winstanley, a Modbury lad. His younger daughter, Lynda, gave him great pleasure when she started working as a teacher at Modbury Primary School, which David, Sarah and Lynda had all attended as children.

David was born, lived and died in Modbury, surrounded by his family at all times. He was Modbury through and through. The outpouring of love and affection from the community both in his last few months and in



the short time since his passing has been amazing and will, no doubt, continue into the future. At his funeral at St George's, the church was filled to overflowing by the number of people touched by David's life and who had come out to honour and remember him.

The extraordinary amount of love, warmth and commitment David shared with his family, friends and community ... that is the true measure of a man. David's presence is much missed on the Parish Council, by his family, friends and the community. He was taken by illness much too young but his legacy to Modbury will continue for a long time.

Neighbourhood Plan

In early November a questionnaire will be dropped through your letterbox by one of our volunteers. Please take time to read the instructions and answer the questions as best you can. Our volunteer will call to collect the questionnaire about a week after it was delivered, unless you received it in the post in which case send it back in the envelope provided.

Your views are very important to us so that we can shape the Neighbourhood Plan to the community's wishes. A good response is important for two reasons. Firstly so that South Hams planners know what Modbury wants as it refines its Joint Local Plan (JLP) and secondly so that the Inspector who will ultimately judge our Neighbourhood Plan knows it is based on solid community evidence.

We have learnt that South Hams have slipped their formal consultation on the JLP by three months to late January which gives us time to analyse some key questions and hopefully have some influence on their consultation document.

After we have analysed and considered all your responses we have to draft the Neighbourhood Plan in a form that is acceptable to SHDC and government regulations. We have been advised very strongly that we need to have this overseen by a planning professional. We will be applying for a grant to cover these costs from funds that have been made available by central government.

When we have a draft Neighbourhood Plan we have to hold a six week consultation with the community prior to submitting it to SHDC. They will then submit it for independent examination and a further round of public consultation. *Mark Lawrence*

CAN YOU MAKE A DIFFERENCE TO A CHERNOBYL CHILD?

This year we had the pleasure of hosting eight Chernobyl children from Belarus and Kamarin and, as always, we had a lot of fun. But despite appearances, their visit is not just about having fun. It is about giving them a respite from the appalling conditions they still have to contend with. Many of the children who come to Britain appear healthy but this is deceptive as the radiation will affect where they live for hundreds of years and they are subjected daily to the long-term effects of incessant radiation. Their plight is worsened by a difficult economic situation, a shortage of medical facilities and medicine, poor living conditions, poor nutrition, contaminated food, unemployment, challenging family circumstances, social hardship as well as long harsh winters, and, as a result, generally poor health. The respite we offer the children means that when they come to the UK they can eat fresh food, breathe clean air and go home with their immune systems recharged.

We very much hope that the children's experiences with us in the South Hams will give them the boost they so desperately need so they return home with renewed enthusiasm and confidence and with a better outlook for the future.

The Totnes and South Hams Link of Chernobyl Children Lifeline will be inviting up to ten children to visit us in June/July next year. We urgently need more host families who would be prepared to look after two children (boys or girls) for two weeks for either the last two weeks of June or the first two weeks of July. Could you help make a difference to these children and host with us? The children are accompanied by a leader from their area and there is a programme of activities arranged for them. You will also have support through their visit.

If you do not think this is for you then we are also looking for supporters to help us in many and varied ways - whatever your talent we are sure to have a place for you. We need to recruit host families for this summer now to give us time for the various clearances in UK and Belarus to happen. Unfortunately there is a lot of red tape involved. MEMORIAL HALL PROJECT UPDATE

A Community Hall Fit for All'

By the time you read this building work should be well advanced to construct an extension to the Memorial Hall. This will not only give a great deal of much needed storage but will allow the Players & Pantomime access to the rear of the stage.

For site safety reasons, while work is taking place access to the playground will only be via the gate off the car park and the back door to the kitchen will not be in use.

Also scheduled for late October is the work to remodel the lighting loft access. For too many years the volunteers who do such a wonderful job lighting the Hall productions have had to pass through the gents toilets to get to the loft. Modbury's young women should not have to suffer in this way! To solve the problem there will be a new door into the toilets and the existing door will now just go to the loft.

The refurbishment of all the toilets will start just before Christmas and will finish after the Pantomime in January. As part of this work the disabled toilet will have baby change facilities for the first time.

A new kitchen is being installed in the week commencing 7th November. This will provide better cupboard space, new sinks and power points as well as enabling us to retile and decorate the whole room.

Every effort will be made to limit inconvenience to Hall users during this work but we do ask for your patience and understanding.

As part of the project we have purchased a projector and large screen, which are now available for events in both the Main Hall and Meeting Room. WiFi facilities will follow; hopefully during November. In addition, once building work is finished there will be a Hall noticeboard on the Back Street side of the building where notices of coming events can be displayed.

It is an exciting time and the Trustees are very grateful to the Big Lottery Fund, the Garfield Weston Foundation and the small number of local people who have contributed so much to this project. 
