6.45 for 7.00 pm Farewell to Canon Bob and Lorna at St George's January is usually the coldest month and even here in the South Hams you are unlikely to be out in the garden for much of the time. Gales can be a problem so check the ties holding climbing plants.

Beds and Borders

When planning next year's borders remember to visit local nurseries. We have some excellent small nurseries in this area. The staff are usually very helpful and knowledgeable and will be able to advise you which plants will suit your situation. The plants at these nurseries are usually well grown and slightly cheaper than at garden centres, and at this time of year you should be able to buy them with bare roots for immediate planting. Although pot-grown plants are very useful, bare-root plants planted in the winter in well prepared soil will generally establish quicker and do better in the long term.

Always keep off the soil as much as possible when it is wet or frosty. If planting try to work from an old plank or board to spread your weight on the soil.

Snowdrops and other early bulbs will flower now. Make a note of any clumps that need dividing.

Ponds and Pools

Usually fish in ponds are fairly dormant at this season but if you have a pond heater they will be more active and may require feeding. However the importance of avoiding pollution of the water cannot be overstated, so only feed as much food as the fish will eat within a few minutes.

Keep the pond free of fallen leaves at all times.

Paths and Patios

Keep paved areas free of ice, especially areas you need to access on a regular basis. Decking can become very slippery so take care. You may find that a light sprinkling with sand helps to give a safer surface.

Houseplants

If the weather turns very cold, move houseplants off windowsills when you draw the curtains at night, otherwise you will trap them in a pocket of cold air.

Remember to feed houseplants like African Violets or Cyclamen when they are flowering.

Vegetables and Fruit

Continue pruning apple trees. Put greasebands round the trunks.

Spread compost over areas of the vegetable garden as they are cleared of crops and plan next season's vegetables, remembering to rotate crops to cut down on disease and pests.

Spread clear plastic sheet over beds to be used for early sowing. Weight them down with soil at the edges to prevent them blowing away. The soil will start to dry out and will be ready for use much earlier than unprotected soil.

Plant of the Month

For a sheltered wall Magnolia Grandiflora is superb, with large creamy flowers and glossy green leaves. Strongly scented, it can be seen in flower this month at several famous local gardens including Cotehele and Lanhydrock.

During the evening the conversations included many terms and expressions that were peculiar to the period for example: 1250s (Identity Card), 36 or 48 passes, Square Bashing, Jankers, CBs, Sprog, Erks, Billet, Bull, Brasses, Bumpers, Best Blues, MO, Sick Bay, AP Boots, SPs Red Caps, Demob, and many more.

Details of this unique event were submitted to Forces United as an example of comradeship. Forces United run a web site and database for contacting and uniting ex servicemen. It is remarkable that in such a small community there are sixteen resident ex National Servicemen within the Parish. It was salutary to note that 24 Modbury Men were lost during the First World War.

The management committee met to consider the next stage in the development of the Sports Pavilion, and to receive reports from the Treasurer and Membership secretary. The SHDC have approved the outline plans and have indicated some specific conditions that are being addressed.

The Chair Peter Watts, and the Secretary Grace Webb, were able to provide a full update for the members. It can be anticipated that in the near future, tenders will be sought from local builders for the construction. Fund raising will be a high priority, and the Fun Day in August raised £315.00 towards the project.

MARS intend to seek funding from a range of sources and events. Should anyone wish to offer financial support or to leave a bequest then we would be extremely grateful.

The Football and Tennis Clubs continue to fully utilise the facilities, and it's still the intention of MARS to provide a hard surface all-weather sports area and practice wall. Modbury Scouts hope they will be able to use the pavilion as a base for their activities.

COUNCIL NEWS

Hedgerow Maintenance

At recent Parish Council meetings concern has been expressed that some householders, landowners and farmers have not yet trimmed the excess growth on hedges bordering roads, pavements and public rights of way. It is a legal requirement that it should be done and there are not many weeks left in the recommended time for doing this work. Devon County Council has recently published a leaflet "Roadside Hedge and Tree Management which gives helpful advice on maintenance of hedges and trees, safety issues, and other useful relevant material including the legal requirements. Fly Tipping and Dog Fouling

Sadly we have had reports of both these unpleasant activities. We are very disappointed that someone has dumped garden rubbish in the Millennium Garden. In future we hope that the person concerned will compost their green garden rubbish or if that is not possible, then take it to the recycling centre at Bridge Court, Ivybridge (opp the Tennis Centre). It is a free service.

Someone has dumped building rubble in a hedgebank beside the road from Little Sheepham to Marycross. The offender must have used a vehicle so why did they not drive to a recognised site for proper disposal? *Fly tipping is illegal*, with considerable fines for offenders. You may have seen posters urging the public to report anyone seen fly tipping. It is not only unsightly but can cause all sorts of environmental problems.

Some person(s) has allowed their dog to foul the pavement in Brownston Street repeatedly. This is thoughtless and inconsiderate and of course illegal. One resident of Brownston Street has had to clean up the mess left outside her front door twice within a few days.

DEVON TO APPEAL

Devon County Council is to formally appeal against the Government's proposed grant increase for public services in 2004/5. The Government has given Devon the lowest grant rise of any county in the country and is banking on Council Tax revenue rising by at least 7% nationally in 2004 to help pay for local services.

After Government ring-fencing for spending on schools, Devon's total grant for all other services, including social services, roads, street lighting and libraries, has crept up by just £824,000.

Devon's District Councils, who have received even lower grant increases, are being invited to join the County Council in presenting a appeal. Although Government has indicated it will not grant hearings with Ministers as it did last year, the County Council proposing а video conference with the Office of the Deputy Prime Minister as a cost effective way for Devon to explain its case.

* A deposit of £25.00 for these functions (payable at the time of booking) is required. The booking will not be regarded as confirmed until this deposit is received. In the event of a cancellation, the deposit is forfeited.

Cancellation charge – in the event of a cancellation of ANY booking, a minimum charge of £10.00 will be made unless 14 days clear notice of cancellation is given. This will also apply to regular users who 'block book' and do not give prior notice of cancellation.

Hirers are asked to note that the deposit requirement and cancellation charge will be strictly applied.

To comply with Health and Safety Regulations and the Conditions imposed by the Hall's Insurance company, celebratory fireworks must not be used in the Memorial Hall or its environs. The Hall Trustees cannot be held responsible for any personal injury or damage if Hirers fail to comply with these Regulations and Conditions

One topic this month – Runaway Lane

The mud bath is no more!

Our contractor, James Baron, has achieved so much in improving the underfoot conditions in the lane. On the initial downhill section from Church Lane some 200 tons of large granite stones have been rolled in position (2 feet thick in some places) allowing the spring water to percolate through and channelled into a freshly made gully near the stream. The top has been dressed with road planings and the whole should now provide a very durable, stabilised surface.

Further on, the sleeper bridge has been reinstated and it will be enhanced later in the year. Along the middle section some recontouring has been carried out and approximately 300 tons of crushed limestone applied to provide a firmer base with some drainage features added. Near the pollarded ash tree the various courses of run off water have been channelled to make their passage and that of walkers a little easier with a top dressing of limestone. More crushed limestone has been put on the next uphill section to improve the drainage and surface.

All this work has been carried out with considerable care to protect the existing surroundings as far as possible and we have endeavoured to retain the original character of the lane with minimal disturbance to the vegetation. We would like to thank the following for their assistance with this project:

• Keith Rennells & Tim Pollard of the Coast & Countryside Service at South Hams District Council for facilitating our access to the "Life into the Landscape" initiative (Heritage Lottery and European Union Funds – NOT Council Tax money we hasten to add!)

- Local landowners for allowing the work to proceed.
- The contractor, James Baron of Greenswood Farm, Blackawton.
- Devon County Council as the highway authority responsible for the lane.
- Modbury Parish Council and all of those members of the public who have voiced their support.

Do go along and see the changes that have been made to one of Modbury's notable green lanes.

Opening Ceremonies (Runaway Lane)

The Coast & Countryside Service are hoping to hold an "opening event" on Monday 26th January. The planning is not yet finalised but it will be advertised nearer the time.

We in Modbury are planning an event to involve the whole community on Sunday 1st February. We aim to have a brief opening ceremony followed by a circular walk commencing down Runaway Lane of about 2 ½ miles (or a 5 mile walk for the more energetic which includes Little Modbury). Soup and rolls will be provided free of charge in the Memorial Hall where we will be having a mini exhibition. You do not have to complete any walk to join with us in the Hall. Full details will be posted locally later.

Volunteer Work party Sunday 4th January 2004 from 10 am.



How about brushing aside some of those winter blues and working off some of the Christmas excess?

There is still some hedge cutting needed in Runaway Lane, this time at the far end (western end, beyond Priory Farm). About 300 yards of both sides of the lane need

attention. The work will be less onerous than last year and the conditions underfoot much better. It will involve cutting smaller branches and scrub using saws, billhooks, loppers, etc. and we would like to burn up all on site – Pyromaniacs welcome.

Come along when you wish and stay for as long or short a time as you can manage. Wear suitable clothes/gloves and bring suitable tools if you have them (we can provide some). We plan to have a largish tent available for shelter where hot pasties with hot or cold drinks will be provided for lunch. There is some parking on the adjacent grass verge or you can walk from Church Lane and see the improvements made. We had 31 people working in appalling conditions last year. Will we be so fortunate this year? As always, we really appreciate participation and help.
